Pastoral Scene

The Magi's Visit to Jesus

If I could make one comment about Christmas of 2020 based on the placement of the feasts, the childhood of Jesus was compressed into less than two weeks for: his birth, circumcision, the visits of the angels, shepherds, Magi, escaping into Egypt, and being both lost and found in Jerusalem at the age of 12. Consequently, when I was asked how old Jesus was when Herod ordered all male children in Bethlehem and its vicinity murdered, I went to the Scriptures and other historical documents to come up with a reliable response.

Matthew is the only evangelist who speaks about the Magi -- Persian astronomers / astrologers who studied the stars and often used what they found to determine the birth of royalty. Matthew says they **saw a star** that started them out on their journey but did not lead them (2:1). The time of the star's appearance is not noted and nowhere in Matthew does it state that the Magi followed the star. However, the trek from Persia would normally have taken close to two years because the Magi would have travelled with a retinue of soldiers and servants, especially since they brought with them a valuable cargo of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. The caravan may also have travelled slowly because the Persians and the Romans were highly suspicious of each other and a retinue of this size could cause concern.

The Magi **came to Jerusalem, asked the whereabouts of the newborn king, learned it was Bethlehem where the star reappeared over a house.** The Magi entered, **saw the young child with Mary his mother, worshiped him, presented their gifts, and left for home by a different route.** Matthew's Gospel does not refer to Jesus as a 'babe' and identifies his dwelling as a 'house' not stable. This information gave me cause to dig further to discover the rest of the story. For that, I needed history.

Normally, the trek from Persia would have taken close to two years because the magi would have travelled with a retinue of soldiers and servants, especially since they brought with them a valuable cargo of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. Given what we know of history at that time, and from general data about the census ordered by Augustus Caesar, the date of Jesus' birth (which coincides with the star's appearance) was approximately 6 B.C. to 5 B.C. Since Herod died between 3 and 2 B.C., he "ordered the massacre of all male children in Bethlehem and its vicinity, from two years old and under, in accordance with the time he had ascertained from the magi" (2:16).

What finally clinched my research on the age of Jesus at the time of the Magi's visit is the following. In Priscilla's Catacomb in Rome is a plaster sarcophagus slab from the 200's A.D. that covers the tomb of a woman named "Severa". It depicts Mary sitting in a chair the toddler Jesus on her lap. Three men with arms and hands outstretched run toward the toddler to present their gifts to the young Jesus whose arms are reaching out to them. Although crudely drawn, the sculptor has caught the eagerness of the Magi to deliver the gifts and the excitement of the little two-year old boy, Jesus.

If you wish to know more about the star itself, and the Old Testament Scriptural references to both the Star and the Messiah's kingship, please let me know. It would make a great pastoral scene.

Moral Guidelines Regarding Vaccines and Covid – 19

With the prospect of the FDA approving one (or more) vaccines within the next few weeks, many questions have been raised regarding the ethical status of these vaccines, particularly questioning whether embryonic stem cells or tissue from aborted fetuses were used in their creation, and whether Catholics can morally receive such vaccines. The Diocese has released a document prepared by Fr. Koopman, a Moral Theologian from St. May Seminary. It is rather lengthy, and talks about the morality of vaccines in general, so we will print the final conclusion.




“In conclusion, at this point there appears to be no moral issues to prohibit a Catholic from receiving vaccines produced by Pfizer or Moderna. If other vaccines are released which do have recourse to material of illicit origin, Catholic moral teaching would direct Catholics to utilize the option that is least morally problematic (i.e., the vaccines that were not created via such immoral means). Provisionally, these two listed vaccines satisfy that criteria.”

St. Monica Church – Annual Report – 2020

Dear Parishioners,

We have just finished a remarkable year, unlike any other in the history of our parish. Many of us have been touched in ways we have never experienced before. I wanted to write to you and try to summarize some of the undertakings that have affected St. Monica Church during this time period.

The month of January began with our Annual Winterfest. This event was well attended, and many persons in our community enjoyed some commoradory after the Christmas Holidays, and also won some wonderful baskets as prizes. The month of February saw some of our second graders receiving the Sacrament of Penance for the first time with their parents. The month of March began with our Lenten Fish Fry. All was prepared, and we had just finished our first week when “the pandemic” struck.

On March 10th, the Governor shut down many of the institutions of the State of Ohio. The Bishops of Ohio met with the Governor, and in the interest of safety decided that the Churches would be closed until further notice. They also let our parishioners know that the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays was abrogated, but that Catholics should find some other ways of worshipping God in place of attending Mass. Many of our parishioners began to watch for the television Masses that were available on various stations, including EWTN. At the same time that St. Monica Church was closed, so was St. Benedict Catholic School.

During the months of March through May our staff tried to accommodate our parishioners as best we could. Around Holy Week we provided Palms and Outdoor Stations of the Cross in the area in front of our Church. The Priests continued to celebrate Masses privately in Church. For communication, the St. Monica Web Page was used extensively, and letters were sent to all parishioners. We also began to live-stream the Weekend Masses on our parish website. On Pentecost Sunday, in June, our Church was once again opened for the celebration of Masses, and for the Sacrament of Penance. Since that time many of our parishioners have once again returned to attending Mass in Church. Also we purchased equipment so that Masses could be viewed on an improved St. Monica Website.

In the month of July we celebrated the First Holy Communion of several of our children. In August, we replaced our annual Summer Festival with another Raffle Fundraiser that helped net over \$21,000 for our Church. September saw the remote opening of St. Benedict Catholic School. In October, the School began classes both “in person” and “remotely”. November saw the visit of Bishop Amos for the sacrament of Confirmation to nine of our parishioners. Bishop Amos also visited our Church for a special Diocesan Holy Name Society event, “In His Name Day”. Finally, the month of December arrived. The St. Vincent de Paul Society sponsored the annual Christmas “Gift Giving” event, and a full Christmas schedule of Masses was celebrated (although a terrible winter storm limited attendance).

Since June, many of our parish groups began to meet: Thursday Rosary Group, Divine Mercy Sunday Devotees, Sandwich Saturdays, The St. Vincent de Paul Food Pantry, the Walking Group, the G.A. Group, The Holy Name Society, the Pastoral Council and the Parish Finance Council, and Zelies’ Home events.

Our parish finances have been helped greatly by the generosity of our parishioners. Many, who are not able to attend Mass, have been sending in their donations, or bringing them to the parish office. Many have made extra donations to help our Church during these times. our Parish Staff and Priests have worked very hard to keep our parish “alive and well”, so that we can still function during this pandemic.

As a conclusion, thank you all for continuing your support of St. Monica Church.
