

What's In It For Me

Does this phrase seem familiar to you? Unfortunately, it is used more often in our society than it should be. Is this phrase common sense, or is it just an excuse to be selfish?

Jesus taught us that there were two great Commandments upon which all the others rely: "Love God with all your heart, with all your mind, with all your soul, and with all your strength; and to Love our neighbor as we love ourselves. This was to be the basis of His way of life.

Many in our American culture believe that true happiness consists in the possessions that one accumulates. They are told that if they have an expensive home, a new car, the latest in technology gadgets, up-to-date modern appliances, beautiful clothing, a large stock portfolio, and plenty of money in the bank, they will be happy beyond their wildest dreams. But after a while, even these luxuries don't always make them happy. Where can we find long lasting, true happiness?

True happiness can be found in giving of ourselves. When God created us, He shared His love with us. This love that God shares with us is meant to be shared with others. When we give of ourselves to others, we are sharing the Love that God has for us. This love in turn goes back to God, because it is one of the best ways we can demonstrate our love for God.

The Season of Lent

The Season of Lent starts on Ash Wednesday with the distribution of Ashes. It begins for Catholics a period of forty days of prayer and penance. The role model for the Season of Lent is Jesus Christ, who spent forty days in the desert at the beginning of His Public Life. Jesus used this time communicating with His Father to prepare Himself for the next three years of very special ministry, culminating in His Death on the Cross and Resurrection from the Dead.

As followers of Jesus, it is important that we make His example our own. The Church recommends that in imitation of Jesus, we perform Penance during the Season of Lent. There are three forms of Penance that are recommended by the Church: Prayer, Fasting, and Almsgiving. We can do these in many ways.

Lent is a special time of Prayer. There are many forms of prayer available to us: Weekday Masses and Sunday Masses, the Rosary, Eucharistic Adoration, Liturgy of the Hours, Reading the Bible, Stations of the Cross, Reception of the Sacrament of Penance, and the Practice of Daily Prayer.

Lent is a special time of Fasting. There are several ways we can accomplish this: Fasting on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, Abstaining from meat on the Fridays of Lent and on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, giving up other foods we cherish, or giving up activities that we enjoy.

Lent is a special time of Almsgiving. There are many ways we can accomplish this: charitable giving, doing kind deeds for others, and volunteering acts of service for those who need our help.

Whatever way you choose to spend your time during the Season of Lent, please take advantage of this Season to grow in your relationship with Jesus Christ.



Pray Always – EVEN on Your Phone

From ancient times the Church has had the custom of celebrating each day with the Liturgy of the Hours, also known as the Divine Office and the "Work of God (Opus Dei)". The Liturgy of the Hours is the prayer of the whole People of God, who we became through our Baptism. It is through this prayer that the Church fulfills Jesus' precept to "pray always".

In the Roman Catholic Church priests are required by canon law to pray five of the seven Hours, while Deacons are required to pray morning and evening Hours and members of religious congregations pray the Hours required by their constitutions. The Liturgy of the Hours is like an extension of the Eucharistic celebration and the Church has always encouraged the laity to also pray these prayers. Okay, I 'hear' some of you asking, "Nice history lesson, Sister, but **what has this to do with me?**" Let me explain!

Until 2010 the only 'real way' to pray the Liturgy of the Hours was to purchase a collection of four books that contained the year's prayers. Depending upon the type of set of books one chose, the cost ranged from \$150 to \$200.

However, in the late 2010s, Don Paolo Padriani, Pastor of the Parish of St. Giorgio in Stazzano, Italy was holding his mobile iPhone in his hand and thought, "Why can't the Breviary (common name for the Liturgy of the Hours) be on my phone?" That idea blossomed into the Breviary application connected to the idea of mobility. This new mobility made it possible to do many things while travelling on the train, on the bus, in the park, in the church.

iBreviary's purpose is simply this: to link technology with the faith and the human need to talk with God, to feel closer to Him through the prayer at any time of the day. The iBreviary offers the complete texts of the Liturgy of the Hours in five languages, downloadable daily or for a full week.

The iBreviary also offers the complete texts of the Mass, the complete texts of rites for the celebration of all the sacraments, the funeral rites, the rosary, and other prayers of the Church.

The iBreviary TS is available online (<https://www.ibreviary.org>) for iPhone, iPad, iPod Touch, Android, Kindle Fire, Windows Phone 7, Blackberry, mobile version, widgets. AND the best part is that iBreviary TS app is FREE!!!

Be creative this Lent and try a new way to pray. You just may like it!


