**Pastoral Scene**

**Why Didn't Jesus Take the Easy Way?**

Why did the Second Person of the Blessed Trinity do it the hard way? He could have chosen a much easier way, after all he's God. Jesus didn't choose Pharisees or educated aristocracy to be numbered as his Twelve – who would then authoritatively teach in relatively safe places of higher learning. Rather, he took simple, ordinary, maybe semi-educated people who roamed from town to town and place to place, enduring treacherous roads and dangers, talking to anyone would give an ear. Again, I ask, "Why?"

One day, I took a little drive out to the country and sat at a spot on the river where my Dad (Pappy) and I frequently fished when I was a kid. As I took in the beautiful scenery, my mind wandered back in time. I closed my eyes and could almost hear Pappy telling me what bait to use and just where to cast in the river to catch some great fish. We both loved going for rock bass – they're great fighters and make for a good meal. Being an out-of-the-box thinker (or maybe just bull-headed), I always had to modify his instructions and usually didn't succeed. By the end of the day, he'd have a stringer full of fish and I had a couple (maybe...if I was lucky). As we would hike back to the car, he'd say "If you would have done as I suggested, you'd have a stringer full too," and then he'd laugh...and so would I because I knew that he was absolutely right. Similar to "Goundhog Day," this same scenario played out dozens of times throughout my youth. Pappy was always hopeful that I'd get what he was saying as I would nod and agree with his words, but at the end of the day he knew that it most likely wouldn't happen – at least not easily.

Pappy was a firm believer in Ockam's Razor which basically states that given a problem, the simplest solution is most likely the right one. In my view, I think that Jesus would have liked Ockam's Razor too. For the most part, our Lord's teachings are very pragmatic (i.e., the two great commandments, don't worry about tomorrow, you're either with me or against me, etc.) – deeply rooted and profound, but definitely not rocket science. However, most human beings (myself included) have to try to find a better way (or a different way). We convolute his teachings with politics, technology, and other multifaceted nonsensical stuff, when the simple way (our Lord's way) is the right way. Sometimes I think that in his humanity, Jesus was hopeful that the people of his time (and us as well) would "get it," but his divine nature knew that it wouldn't be easy – although "with God all things are possible." To that end, the example set in our Lord's ministerial life gave his Church a modus operandi – and through his passion, death and resurrection gave us a foretaste of the victory we all can attain (if we're smart enough to follow).

### The Year of St. Joseph

On December 8, 2020 Pope Francis asked the entire world to celebrate "The Year of St. Joseph". This special celebration will last until December 8, 2021.

St. Joseph is sometimes referred to as "the silent saint" in that no actual words of his are recorded in the Bible. But even though his words are not recorded, his actions have played an important role in the life of the Holy Family. Joseph was a carpenter, but in those times this occupation may also have included being a craftsman, working with both wood and stone. We know that he can trace his ancestry back to King David, which is seen in both the Gospels of Matthew and Luke.

According to tradition his espousal to Mary took place in either Jerusalem or in Nazareth. This was a period of one year before they came to live together as a married couple. In Luke's Gospel we see the dilemma of Joseph when he found that Mary was with child, and we also see his response when he is told by an angel in a dream that this was God's doing. Then follows the wonderful stories about Joseph and Mary in Bethlehem with the birth of Jesus; the scene in the temple with Simeon and Anna; the visitation of the Magi; and the one hundred seventy-five mile Flight into Egypt due to King Herod's death threats on the life of Jesus; and finally the loss of Jesus for three days when Jesus, at age twelve, was found in the Temple. Joseph certainly showed good character in all of these stories. From this time until his death, which according to tradition might have happened when Jesus was about thirty years of age, we see nothing about Joseph again in the Scriptures. But as a role model, he taught Jesus how to be a faithful Jew, and probably how to help support their family through the carpentry trade.

During this year there are two special feast days to honor St. Joseph: March 19<sup>th</sup>, and May 1<sup>st</sup>, the feast of St. Joseph the Worker. Please take some time this year to pray to St. Joseph. He certainly understands what it is like to raise a family.



## Divine Mercy Sunday

As a sign of Jesus' forgiving love and mercy, the Church celebrates Divine Mercy Sunday on April 8<sup>th</sup>. Jesus told Saint Faustina: "I want this image to be solemnly blessed on the first Sunday after Easter: that Sunday is to be the Feast of Mercy. Whoever will go to confession and receive the Holy Eucharist will receive complete forgiveness of sin and punishment." A deed of mercy was also asked by Jesus. Giving food to the St. Vincent de Paul pantry, providing a ride to a neighbor to Mass, or donating to Operation Rice Bowl are just a few ways we can show Jesus' love and mercy to our neighbor.



Our Lord gave Saint Faustina the Novena of Divine Mercy which consists of nine days of prayer for all people to recognize Jesus' love and mercy. The novena, which is said privately, begins on Good Friday and is to be said for nine days, each day praying for a different intention to bring souls back to Our Savior. The Chaplet of Divine Mercy is also said and may be continued daily throughout the year. *The novena booklets may be obtained at the doors of the Church.*

**All are invited to attend special devotions on Sunday, April 8<sup>th</sup> following the 10:45 a.m. Mass.** The Divine Mercy Holy Hour will include Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, Praying the Chaplet of Divine Mercy, Veneration of the Divine Mercy Image and the relic of Saint Faustina, and Benediction.


