Holy Week 2021

The week we embark on is called: HOLY. Each year, at this point of our preparation for the Solemnity of the Resurrection of the Lord, we are asked to focus our attention on the work Jesus did on our behalf. "God became man so that we might become like God" as the early writers of the Church taught.

For those who will be received into the Church at the Easter Vigil, this week is filled with the final preparation for that event. For the rest of us who are members of the Church, the week is a time to be holy. As we begin this week may we continue to carry out our Lenten promise. The call to be a praying community must be intensified personally and in the gathering of the Church in public prayer and worship. The call to fast continues in all aspects of our lives particularly in fasting from sin.

As we pray for those who will enter the Church may our prayer include those who are alienated from the Church, those who find it difficult to seek the forgiveness of the Church through sacramental confession and those who cannot forgive themselves for their past sins.

I have often talked about times of God's grace and truly this is the time. Beginning with the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Thursday evening until Easter Sunday evening, the term TRIDUUM is used, namely "three days" looked at, as **one long day** of walking with Jesus immersed in His love for all of us. Make time to join in the liturgical prayers beginning on Thursday evening. Invite your family and friends to join you. Be a welcoming call to those who may be drawn by God's grace and peace.

The Eastern European tradition of food blessing on Holy Saturday reminds us of sharing God's gifts and seeing them as blessings. Taking the blessed food to our homes to be eaten on Easter morning, asks that our homes be truly places of blessing and peace. This is my prayer for all of you.

On Easter Sunday there will be many more people coming to St. Monica Church. Welcome them as brothers and sisters in the risen Lord. We often talk about our parish as a "welcoming parish", may our words and actions display that attitude so that the light of Christ will shine in wondrous splendor on Easter Sunday and the following week.

The Year of St. Joseph

On December 8, 2020 Pope Francis asked the entire world to celebrate “The Year of St. Joseph”. This special celebration will last until December 8, 2021.

St. Joseph is sometimes referred to as “the silent saint” in that no actual words of his are recorded in the Bible. But even though his words are not recorded, his actions have played an important role in the life of the Holy Family. Joseph was a carpenter, but in those times this occupation may also have included being a craftsman, working with both wood and stone. We know that he can trace his ancestry back to King David, which is seen in both the Gospels of Matthew and Luke.

According to tradition his espousal to Mary took place in either Jerusalem or in Nazareth. This was a period of one year before they came to live together as a married couple. In Luke’s Gospel we see the dilemma of Joseph when he found that Mary was with child, and we also see his response when he is told by an angel in a dream that this was God’s doing. Then follows the wonderful stories about Joseph and Mary in Bethlehem with the birth of Jesus; the scene in the temple with Simeon and Anna; the visitation of the Magi; and the one hundred seventy-five mile Flight into Egypt due to King Herod’s death threats on the life of Jesus; and finally the loss of Jesus for three days when Jesus, at age twelve, was found in the Temple. Joseph certainly showed good character in all of these stories. From this time until his death, which according to tradition might have happened when Jesus was about thirty years of age, we see nothing about Joseph again in the Scriptures. But as a role model, he taught Jesus how to be a faithful Jew, and probably how to help support their family through the carpentry trade.

During this year there are two special feast days to honor St. Joseph: March 19th, and May 1st, the feast of St. Joseph the Worker. Please take some time this year to pray to St. Joseph. He certainly understands what it is like to raise a family.


Did you know that fifteen years ago there were ten full time staff serving St. Monica Parish; now there are five full time staff members serving our parish?

Divine Mercy Sunday

As a sign of Jesus’ forgiving love and mercy, the Church celebrates Divine Mercy Sunday on April 11th. Jesus told Saint Faustina: “I want this image to be solemnly blessed on the first Sunday after Easter: that Sunday is to be the Feast of Mercy. Whoever will go to confession and receive the Holy Eucharist will receive complete forgiveness of sin and punishment.” A deed of mercy was also asked by Jesus. Giving food to the St. Vincent de Paul pantry, providing a ride to a neighbor to Mass, or donating to Operation Rice Bowl are just a few ways we can show Jesus’ love and mercy to our neighbor.



Our Lord gave Saint Faustina the Novena of Divine Mercy which consists of nine days of prayer for all people to recognize Jesus’ love and mercy. The novena, which is said privately, begins on Good Friday and is to be said for nine days, each day praying for a different intention to bring souls back to Our Savior. The Chaplet of Divine Mercy is also said and may be continued daily throughout the year. *The novena booklets may be obtained at the doors of the Church.*

All are invited to attend special devotions on Sunday, April 11th following the 10:45 a.m. Mass. The Divine Mercy Holy Hour will include Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, Praying the Chaplet of Divine Mercy, Veneration of the Divine Mercy Image and the relic of Saint Faustina, and Benediction.

Four Times Blest

If you attended or virtually viewed the 10:45 a.m. Mass on the last three Sundays, you would see four individuals called up to stand before the sanctuary for a special blessing from the Rite of Christian Initiation – a process followed when a teenager or adult wishes to come into the Church. Each entered because of a special nudge by God to inquire about the Catholic faith and develop a relationship with Jesus Christ.

The RCIA process has several distinct stages. The initial period before one chooses to commit is called **'Inquiry or seeking'** – checking out if this response to God's call is really for you. Those who decide to continue their faith journey, enter the **'Catechumenate'** – and are called *catechumens* – an ancient name for the early Church that describes learning the basic points about the Catholic faith and life based upon the Apostle's Creed, which is the summation of our faith and the content of our baptismal promises.

On the First Sunday of Lent, the four Catechumens participated in **The Rite of Election** – being approved to enter the final and most intense period of prayer and preparation of the RCIA process. Their names were inscribed in the *Book of the Elect* – a sacramental book that memorializes their desire to go forward. The past three Sundays have intensified their commitment through special blessings and Gospel-based prayers termed **'Purification'**.

Now they are ready for the final step, **'Initiation'**, -- the culmination of the RCIA process that will bring them into the Church during the Easter Vigil Mass on April 3rd. Please keep them in your prayers. These Chosen Four are a blessing to both the Church and our parish!






