Pastoral Scene

My Father's Eyes

Much to my Mother's chagrin, and my Father's delight, I was "Daddy's girl", and his shadow. My Mother often complained that if faced with learning how to cook or helping Dad wire something in the garage, I always chose the latter. And, yes, if given a choice on stopping for ice cream during a Sunday drive, the vote was always 'two to one', and you can guess who voted 'no'! Dad had the ability to find the good in everything that happened, was always one who would volunteer to help others, and who instinctively knew what people needed physically and emotionally without them saying a word. He shaped my concept of what being a 'father' was then that carried over in how I teach the little ones what 'God the Father' means today.

Fathers are incredibly important people in the life of a family and know all too well what it costs to be the figure who passes down the family heritage, is gentle yet firm, can console and discipline, and who provides a living example of his role. Fathers teach boys how to be men and husbands, and also teach girls what to look for and expect from the man that they choose for a husband.

Despite the fact that I chose religious life over married life, I learned from my father what love for your wife, family, and friends entails. My mother and father shared everything – joy and sorrow, hope and hardship, financial challenges, and the loss of three children before I was born. My father was always there for my mother and me without ever being controlling. Although Dad spoke little – giving both women in his life 'space' -- when he did speak, we listened.

Now, do not interpret that statement as saying their married life was always smooth sailing because they were very different. My mother had no sense of humor, but my father had a double share! It often led to interesting situations. However, both knew how to forgive from the bottom of their hearts and to correct without humiliating the other. My father would have died for my mother without a second thought. She, too, would have done the same. They never let the sun set on an argument! Considering they celebrated their 60th anniversary before my dad died, (even though at the altar, before renewing their vows, my dad loudly told my mom that their first wedding was officiated by an actor priest, after which my mom bopped him with her purse), confirms they were truly meant for each other.

At my Dad's wake, the people I met told me what a great man my father was, what he had done for them without expecting anything in return, and who saw how he lived his Catholic faith. Statements such as those only confirmed that fathers are our true role models and heroes. They put what they believe into everyday action.

The following lyrics from Amy Grant's song, 'My Father's Eyes', say it all.: – "eyes that find the good in things when good is not around, eyes that find the source of help, when help just can't be found, eyes full of compassion, seeing every pain . " It is my hope, that when I am gone, those who knew me can honestly say I had "my father's eyes".

Answer:

The Catechumenate is the period of instruction for a person preparing to receive the Sacrament of Baptism in the Catholic Church.

Funeral Liturgy Planning Ministry

St. Monica parish has always been noted for being a caring and hospitable community. One of the ways we can show our care and concern for others is by reaching out to them in a time of need.

Our Funeral Liturgy Planning Ministers contact the family of one who has died and will be celebrating a Mass of Christian Burial at our Parish. Meeting with family members (by phone, internet, or in person), the Planning Minister guides them in choosing appropriate scripture readings, music and other details that will be used during the funeral Mass.

This ministry requires a little bit of training. The training sessions consist of three meetings (approx. one hour each). Sessions are set up with Bob Soeder on a mutually agreed upon basis.

There is Hope

During these past fifteen months, many of us might have wondered: “Is there any hope left for our world”. Our religious leaders seem to say that there is Hope. But we ask: “When is it going to happen?”

There are many reasons to believe that the world we are now living in is hopeless. In the past decade we have seen difficulties that we never would have imagined in our lifetime. The world seems to have been turned upside down. The killing of children in the womb is looked upon as a woman’s basic right; the killing of a child after birth is legal in some States; marriage is no longer seen as a life-long relationship between a man and a woman – it can also be entered into by two men or two women; one’s gender no longer is determined by the genetic structure when one is conceived, but by the choice a person makes when one becomes of age; history is no longer seen as the entire picture of what has taken place over the centuries, but is being replaced with events chosen to represent the past during an arbitrary period of time (cancel culture); persons who encourage and participate in violent crimes are considered heroes, while those who protect the rights of innocent persons are persecuted; a main stream news media that is supposed to defend the truth, glories in its own propaganda and half-truths; and religious truth is being replaced by the opinions of “experts”.

But there is Hope, and it is not very far away. All we have to do is to place our Hope in the right Person. When Jesus Christ came into the world, many difficulties existed that seemed hopeless: the immorality of paganism, the cruelty of the Roman Empire, the drudgery of living out one’s daily existence, and then there was death, and the question about what would happen afterwards.

Jesus was sent by the Father with a mission – to bring Hope to this world. He brought Hope by telling all persons that God loves each and every one of us. He taught us how to love God, and how to love each other. He not only taught this love, He showed it by the way He lived His life. He was willing to die for us so that someday we could be with Him in heaven. He rose from the dead to demonstrate that there is truly life after death. He then ascended into heaven after He told us His final message: “Go out to all the world and tell the Good News”. Finally, He promised that He would be with us until the end of time, while we worked at completing this task.

Now we have a very important mission. Our job is to spread this Hope to everyone we meet. We do this when we live our lives according to Jesus’ teachings, when we take a stand for the values that Jesus taught us by handing them on to our families, when we refuse to support the evil propaganda that our government, our media, and our high tech industry is trying to force upon us. There is one reason we can do this. We already know that in the end, God will win a complete victory over evil. Our job now is to stand with Jesus Christ, and to pray for His help in these difficulties. There is Hope. It is found in our love of Jesus Christ.

Of its own accord the land yields fruit, first the blade, then the ear, then the full grain in the ear. And when the grain is ripe, he wields the sickle at once, for the harvest has come."

He said, "To what shall we compare the kingdom of God, or what parable can we use for it? It is like a mustard seed that, when it is sown in the ground, is the smallest of all the seeds on the earth. But once it is sown, it springs up and becomes the largest of plants and puts forth large branches, so that the birds of the sky can dwell in its shade."

With many such parables he spoke the word to them as they were able to understand it. Without parables he did not speak to them, but to his own disciples he explained everything in private.
