

Pastoral Scene—continued

Each Sunday, we attend a parish-based Bay of Parables where our ordained clergy preach. Although it is easy for us to consider the parables as 'interesting stories' told by Jesus 2000 years ago, they continue to present the same 'life lessons' we need that never grew old.

Feeling at home by the Sea of Galilee, Sister Helene

Pastoral Scene

The Bay of Parables

The Gospels of Luke, Mark, and Matthew all report times when Jesus preached from a boat. Growing up near the Atlantic coast and having lived in an apartment on the shore of East Providence Bay, I wondered how and why Jesus would be able to do that, especially when he asks Peter to row out into the Sea of Galilee. By accident, I found the answers to my questions in an old book that talked about a little-known spot along the Sea of Galilee called "the Bay of Parables". It does not appear on any map of the Holy Land but can be visited if one knows where to look!

Very close to the city of Tabgha, the site of the Multiplication of the Loaves and Fishes, is a small chapel staffed by Benedictine monks. It sits at the edge of a road that runs along a hill which seems to plunge down into the Sea of Galilee. If you follow the road on foot, you can see an opening in the bushes and a narrow path that appears to plunge down to the sea. The hillside below the road forms a natural amphitheater where Jesus' followers could sit or stand, and easily hear Jesus' message from the boat because the water of the Sea of Galilee enhanced Jesus' voice.

The slope of the hill itself is unique – a natural spread of three plots of soil: desert-dry soil, rocky soil, and rich fertile soil, unfolding like a patchwork quilt. Scattered among these three areas of soil are thorn bushes and weeds. THIS site fits the description of the land described in the Gospels of Mark (4:1-9), Matthew (13:1-9, and Luke (8:4-8) where it is believed Jesus preached the Parable of the Sower.

Given the proximity of Capernaum to Tabgha, the Bay of Parables may have been the regular site Jesus used to preach other parables such as The Lost Sheep, The Lost Coin, and The Prodigal Son, to large crowds. I also may have been the site of the 'breakfast by the sea' that Jesus prepared for his apostles after a night of fishing. Perhaps, the grassy hill above the road leading to the Bay of Parables was the site of the second miracle of the loaves and fishes. For what is a relatively unknown site, the Bay of Parables may have been the favorite site of Jesus' preaching, even when he was not in a boat.




GOSPEL Luke 17:11-19
