The Miracle of the Holy Fire in Jerusalem

Until Trapper Jack told us about the Miracle of the Holy Fire, I had no clue that this recurring miracle even existed. It occurs yearly, on the Orthodox Easter Saturday, at the same time, in the same manner, and on the same spot – the Church of the Holy Sepulchre in Jerusalem which also contains both Golgatha, the little hill on which Jesus was crucified, and "the new tomb" given by Joseph of Arimathea that received Jesus' dead body. Although our Easter changes

dates each year for Catholics and Protestants, the Orthodox Easter does not because it follows the Julian Calendar, not our Gregorian Calendar.

The miracle of the Holy Fire happens at 2:00PM, but already around 11:00 AM, the church itself and the land around it are 'erupting' with visitors. At 1:00 PM, local authorities' elbow through the crowds...... Their function is to represent the Romans in the time of Jesus, to seal the tomb of Jesus, so that his disciples would not seal his body and claim that Jesus had risen. The Israeli officials seal the tomb of Jesus, but first they enter the tomb to check for any hidden source of fire which could produce the miracle through fraud.

A blue light from the very stone on which Jesus laid rises from it. At a certain point, the light rises and forms a column from which others are able to light their candles, but it is fire that does not burn with any heat! The fire is changed with a blue light – and it rises and forms a column in which the fire is of a different nature. It is from that light that arises, so the Patriarch can light his candle and then light the Coptic Patriarch's candle as well. The flame then is presented to all present in the Sepulcher.

The miracle is not confined to the Church itself, because the blue fire appears and is active outside the tomb. It ignites candles spontaneously, even from a distance, often moving around the Church and spontaneously attesting to the blue light that has lit one's candle. The miracle of Holy Fire is almost like a sacrament to those at the ceremony. It makes the Resurrection of Christ present to all as if he had died only a few days ago. The biggest argument against fraud is not the testimony of the patriarchs or priests. It is the testimony of participants whose candles have been lit spontaneously, and there are thousands of those!

Miracles cannot be proved, have never been filmed and probably never will be. The true miracle in the Christian tradition has only one purpose – to extend the Grace of God in creation. It depends upon the faith of the people, for without faith no miracle can happen!

First Reading Acts of the Apostles 3:13-15, 17-19

Peter said to the people: "The God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob, the God of our fathers, has glorified his servant Jesus, whom you handed over and denied in Pilate's presence when he had decided to release him. The two disciples recounted what had taken place on the way, and how Jesus was made known to them in the breaking of bread.

While they were still speaking about this, he stood in their midst and said to them, "Peace be with you." But they were startled and terrified and thought that they were seeing a ghost. Then he said to them, "Why are you troubled? And why do questions arise in your hearts? Look at my hands and my feet, that it is I myself. Touch me and see, because a ghost does not have flesh and bones as you can see I have." And as he said this, he showed them his hands and his feet. While they were still incredulous for joy and were amazed, he asked them, "Have you anything here to eat?" They gave him a piece of baked fish; he took it and ate it in front of them.


He said to them, "These are my words that I spoke to you while I was still with you, that everything written about me in the law of Moses and in the prophets and psalms must be fulfilled." Then he opened their minds to understand the Scriptures.
