

Why do we call Jesus the Good Shepherd

Most of us have never seen or met a shepherd in 'real life'. As a result, it is not unusual when children and adults ask me to clarify that title. I must confess, that I never met a shepherd, although I have seen shepherds caring for their small flocks on farms in Connecticut and Maine.

because sheep are not the brightest of animals. If left alone, they will wander off, and in a rainstorm, they just stand there rather than searching for cover. As a result, the shepherd is crucial to preserving the safety of the flock. As I reflected on the Scriptures for this article, I saw why Jesus is called the Good Shepherd, and we are termed His flock.

Shepherds are smart individuals who have to be in three places at the same time to control their flock and keep them safe. The first task of a shepherd is leading the sheep by walking in front of his flock and having them follow his lead. Jesus, as the Good Shepherd led His apostles and disciples by providing them with a vision and explaining what that vision meant. That was especially important to his special band when Jesus' explanations clarified the parables.

Shepherds are in the midst of their sheep, and wear "their smell". A shepherd checks on his sheep by walking through the flock as they are on the move. Jesus was the first to practice "the ministry of presence". A good leader in any initiative has to show up in the flock rather than watch from a distance. He or she manifests the statement, "I'm here!" Jesus is most often pictured 'among the people' rather than as a bystander and was always present to those He led!

Last, but not least, shepherds also walk behind their flocks to help any sheep that is struggling to keep up. This was one of the greatest charisms of Jesus – He was there for those considered 'sinners' and 'outcasts. Think about the Samaritan woman at the well, the man born blind, Matthew the tax collector, and those society excluded from society. It is the job of the shepherd to recognize potential problems and intervene early before they become worse. Often, we are the cause of our own problems. Never be afraid to call on Jesus, the Good Shepherd, to keep you safe in His flock.

Entrance Chant 403 Christ, the Lord, Is Risen Today (LLANFAIR)

First Reading Acts of the Apostles 9:26-31

When Saul arrived in Jerusalem he tried to join the disciples, but they were all afraid of him, not believing that he was a disciple. Then Barnabas took charge of him and brought him to the apostles, and he reported to them how he had seen the Lord, and that he had spoken to him, and how in Damascus he had spoken out boldly in the name of Jesus. He moved about freely with them in Jerusalem, and spoke out boldly in the name of the Lord. He also spoke and debated with the Hellenists, but they tried to kill him. And when the brothers learned of this, they took him down to Caesarea and sent him on his way to Tarsus.

Second Reading 1 John 3:18-24

Children, let us love not in word or speech but in deed and truth.

Now this is how we shall know that we belong to the truth and reassure our hearts before him in whatever our hearts condemn, for God is greater than our hearts and knows everything. Beloved, if our hearts do not condemn us, we have confidence in God and receive from him whatever we ask, because we keep his commandments and do what pleases him. And his commandment is this: we should believe in the name of his Son, Jesus Christ, and love one another just as he commanded us. Those who keep his commandments remain in him, and he in them, and the way we know that he remains in us is from the Spirit he gave us.

Gospel John 15:1-8

Jesus said to his disciples: "I am the true vine, and my Father is the vine grower. He takes away every branch in me that does not bear fruit, and every one that does he prunes so that it bears more fruit. You are already pruned because of the word that I spoke to you. Remain in me, as I remain in you. Just as a branch cannot bear fruit on its own unless it remains on the vine, so neither can you unless you remain in me. I am the vine, you are the branches. Whoever remains in me and I in him will bear much fruit, because without me you can do nothing. Anyone who does not remain in me will be thrown out like a branch and wither; people will gather them and throw them into a fire and they will be burned. If you remain in me and my words remain in you, ask for whatever you want and it will be done for you. By this is my Father glorified, that you bear much fruit and become my disciples."


