Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

In the Catholic Tradition of responsible citizenship, we are morally obligated to participate in political life and to make choices based on a properly formed conscience, voting for the candidates who best support the moral teachings of our Catholic faith. As you prepare to cast your ballot for the upcoming November election, I ask that you pray for the guidance of the Holy Spirit and educate yourself on the candidates' positions on the critical issues that will affect us all, both now and in the future.

Before we are members of any political party, we must be faithful followers of Jesus, who told us "By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another" (John 3:35). So, it is incumbent on us who are believers to live our Catholic faith outside the walls of our Churches, putting Christ at the center of our public lives as citizens. Our consciences must be well informed through prayer and fidelity to the teachings of the Catholic Church. Then we must vote our consciences, which I urge you to do, so that your Catholic faith will impact the moral and social fabric of our society.

In the Introductory Note to Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship, the document issued by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops to help guide us on our political responsibilities, we bishops again said that the defense of unborn life remains our pre-eminent priority because abortion is a direct attack on the most vulnerable among us. We also recognize that other grave threats to the life and dignity of the human person include euthanasia, gun violence, terrorism, the death penalty, human trafficking, the redefinition of marriage and gender, threats to religious freedom, lack of justice for the poor, the suffering of migrants and refugees, racism, and the lack of care for our common home. All these issues must be considered when voting for the person who will best represent us, placing the interests of the most vulnerable first among others.

At a time when our nation is so polarized by partisanship and ideology, and the issues are so serious and complex, it is of the utmost importance that we persevere in hope, remembering the words found in the Book of Micah, who said, "You have been told, O mortal, what is good, and what the Lord requires of you: Only to do justice and love goodness, and to walk humbly with your God" (Micah 6:8).

For those looking for more information on faithful citizenship, both the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops and the Catholic Conference of Ohio (which outlines topics specific to our state) offer extensive materials and resources to provide guidance.

Society of St. Vincent De Paul St. Monica Conference Who We Are

At St. Monica Parish, St. Vincent de Paul (SVDP) has been in existence since 1980 to help bring God's love to the poor. At this time, thirteen members are actively involved in the Society's charitable works. Did you know there are still two active, original members from the first meeting in 1980? In the past several years, our St. Monica SVDP has made many home visits; provided financial assistance of about \$45,000.00; provided over 1,800 bags of food; passed out countless Christmas gifts; and many other charitable services to those in need.

How can you help grow your faith while helping others? Our operating funds come from St. Monica Parish through your donations in the Poor Boxes at Church entrances, your contributions in the quarterly SVDP envelopes found in your Church envelope packets, and from generous monetary and food donations from the many organizations and individuals in our parish. Our parishioners and our organizations enable us to help others and to keep our food pantry open to all in need. 100% of your donations are used to help others. We do not have any overhead or operating expenses. Everything you give goes to those less fortunate. Did you know we serve around 70 families a month? Today, we are experiencing dwindling funds due to the increase in families needing help. Right now we have had to reduce our budget costs to \$1,000.00 a month to feed and serve others. Yes, we receive food from the Greater Cleveland Food Bank, but that costs an average of \$450.00 a month. Our SVDP needs to keep growing and your help and continued generosity can truly be an example of faith in action. Remember to pray for those in need. We want to thank you and ask God's special blessings to all of you who help keep the St. Vincent de Paul Ministry alive and well in our parish.

Did you know we have a food donation drawer behind the screen behind the altar? Or that you can drop off food donations at the parish office? Or that the poor boxes at the entrances of the Church go directly to help our community?

Or that your St. Vincent DePaul quarterly envelopes are utilized directly to families in our St. Monica Parish boundaries?

Remember to keep praying for our St. Monica families who may be struggling during these difficult times. We can only help others with your assistance. We thank you and ask God's special blessings to all of you who help keep the St. Vincent de Paul Ministry alive and well in our parish.
