LOVE FOR ALL ETERNITY

How do we learn about this great mystery we celebrate today - learn that it is something far greater than the natural exuberance of spring, gardens, and fertility. That it is the astonishing truth that Jesus Christ has conquered death forever, in his own person; and, that he offers the Resurrection as a gift outright to those who hear and keep his word.

How did the disciples learn-? First, they encountered an empty tomb. The puzzling empty tomb is only the first step in recognizing the resurrection of Christ. "They did not yet understand the Scripture that he (Jesus) had to rise from the dead.

They begin to learn as they personally encounter the risen Christ in subsequent days, they hear the testimony of others who have seen and heard him, and they ponder the Scriptures more deeply on this humanly inexplicable event - the glory of Christ risen becomes the center of their lives, and of their mission to proclaim the Gospel, and build the Church.

Where do we go to learn?

It is found in our serious Church life, as we attend the Eucharist as one community in Faith to "break the bread" of the Lord's Passover, in our fidelity to the apostolic teaching of the Church on matters of faith and morals, in our joyous proclamation of the Gospel to a skeptical age, and in the giving and receiving of forgiveness through the power of the Holy Spirit. We learn when we lean on each other during the beautiful funeral liturgy – a liturgy that heals our broken hearts through Christian Hope in the Resurrection.

We learn in the beautiful images and symbols of our Church, in Scripture, in beautiful art and music - from saints – living and dead. We learn from a nun who was under 5 foot born in Skopje in the region of Albania - who cared for the forgotten sick and dying - Mother Teresa. We learn from a Pope who during his journey has on Holy Thursday washed and kissed the feet of twelve women inmates at a Rome prison. We learn from Blessed Carlo Acutis, an Italian computer-coding teenager who died of cancer in 2006, known for his great devotion to the real presence of Jesus in the Eucharist.

Born in 1991, Acutis is the first millennial to be beatified by the Catholic Church. Shortly after his first Communion at the age of 7, Acutis told his mother: "To always be united to Jesus: This is my life plan." We know how Carlo shared his love of the Eucharist with the world, using his computer skills in creating Eucharistic miracle displays, which my sister Cathy's school, St Mary's in East Islip, NY, recently displayed. He will be canonized as a saint in Rome on Divine Mercy Sunday.

The next question is how do we live what we have learned? – how do we live something so counter-cultural- slap in the face – blinding – inexplicable- How do we live out in our lives the encounter of THE RISEN JESUS - SON OF GOD.

This is our baptismal vision- to see beyond "what is on earth," we steadfastly look forward to a new and eternal life lived "with Him in glory," as St Paul tells the Colossians in today's second reading. Easter remains the reason for our hope, the unending day in which we can always "rejoice and be glad."

Jesus Christ- born in a stable - WHO WOULD LEAD NO ARMIES OR AMASS GREAT WEALTH, WHO in his brief life wrote nothing – who encountered maybe only a few thousand people and spoke of love, charity, peace; amidst a world of blindness, violence, and hate - WHO did not come back as our Risen Lord for vengeance on those who tortured and crucified him and tried to BURY HIS TEACHINGS - but rather,

AS A LIGHT FOR THE WORLD SAYING-

I WILL NEVER GIVE UP ON CREATION - I WILL LOVE YOU FOR ALL ETERNITY.

Happy Easter- He is Risen!!!

The Search

Everybody's trying to find God. They may not admit it. They may not even know it. They may talk around it, shy away from saying the name, both to others and to themselves: *God*. But I know for a fact that every person who was ever born into this world spent their lives searching for Him - somewhere, somehow, even if the only place they thought to look was in money or drugs.

It's a comforting fact, really — a reminder of how alike we all are. Catholic, Jewish, Muslim, atheist, rich, poor, Black, white. When it comes right down to it, the history of humanity is a never-ending Easter morning scene that plays in perpetuity. The sorrow, the shock, the confusion. Again and again, as each newborn baby opens his eyes, the search begins anew. *Where did he go? What has happened? Where can I find him?*

Catechesis isn't enough. Even those who learn about Jesus Christ, who accept his word, hang hesitantly outside the tomb, afraid to go in. Jesus' best friend — the disciple whom he loved — ran faster than Peter, so desperate he was to find his Lord. But when he got to the tomb and saw it empty, he got spooked. He froze.

Sometimes, we expect God to be right where we left Him — in a certain parish, with a certain priest, in a certain relationship, at a certain job. We show up, and we're heartbroken to see that our expectations have been turned upside down. *He's left us*, we think dejectedly, but we're wrong.

There is no one who has been abandoned by God. There are only those who stop looking for Him.

Don't let the empty tombs define you. It's the search that defines you.

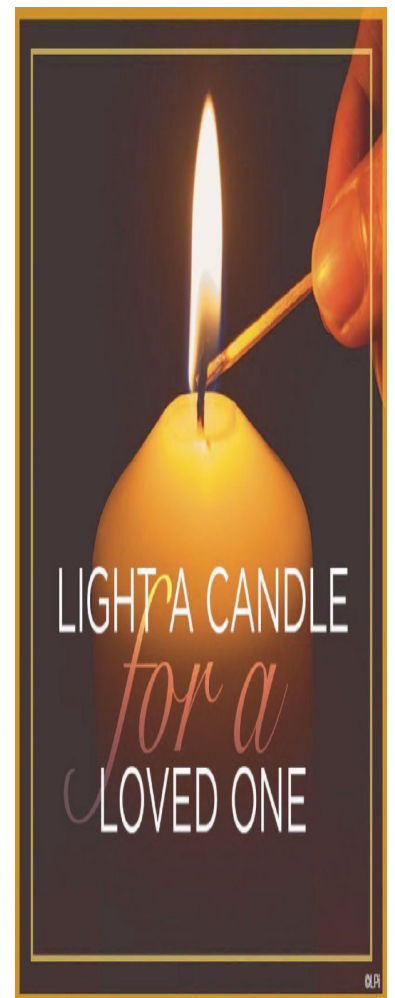

Divine Mercy Sunday 27 April 2025

*Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, Divine Mercy Chaplet and Benediction
following the 10:45 a.m. Liturgy.*



On the Second Sunday of Easter of the Jubilee Year 2000, at the Mass for the Canonization of St. Faustina Kowalska, Pope John Paul II proclaimed to the world that “from now on throughout the Church” this Sunday will be called “Divine Mercy Sunday”. The Church’s doctrine of Divine Mercy, and her liturgical practices are not based on St. Faustina’s revelations: they are based on Holy Scripture, the faith handed down by the apostles, and on liturgical traditions rooted in the worship life of the ancient, apostolic communities.

Why did the Pope so strongly recommend that we pay heed to the Divine Mercy message and devotion? Because he saw all this as more than just a collection of “private revelations”; rather, he saw them as *prophetic* revelations, in other words, revelations given to us by God to proclaim the heart of the Gospel – the merciful love of God shining through the death, burial, and resurrection of his Son.

The Chaplet of Divine Mercy is an intercessory prayer based on the Passion of Christ, and the Image of Divine Mercy (before which the Novena is usually recited) is primarily a manifestation of the Risen Christ. Therefore, the Novena of Chaplets (with the Image) focuses our minds and hearts on the Paschal Mystery – the death and resurrection of Christ. Nothing could be more appropriate at this time in the liturgical year!

Thus, to fittingly observe the Feast of Divine Mercy, we should: (1) **Celebrate** the Feast on the Sunday after Easter; (2) Sincerely **repent** of all our sins; (3) Place our complete **trust** in Jesus; (4) Go to **Confession**, preferably before that Sunday; (5) Receive **Holy Communion** on the day of the Feast; (6) **Venerate*** the **Image** of The Divine Mercy; and (7) **Be merciful to others**, through our actions, words, and prayers on their behalf.

*To venerate a sacred image of statue simply means to perform some act of make some gesture of deep religious respect toward it because of the person whom it represents – in this case, our Most Merciful Savior.

For you have died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God. When Christ your life appears, then you too will appear with him in glory.

or 1 Corinthians 5:6b-8

Brothers and sisters: Do you not know that a little yeast leavens all the dough? Clear out the old yeast, so that you may become a fresh batch of dough, inasmuch as you are unleavened. For our paschal lamb, Christ, has been sacrificed. Therefore, let us celebrate the feast, not with the old yeast, the yeast of malice and wickedness, but with the unleavened bread of sincerity and truth.

The Sequence 396 Christians, to the Paschal Victim

The Gospel John 20:1-9

On the first day of the week, Mary of Magdala came to the tomb early in the morning, while it was still dark, and saw the stone removed from the tomb. So she ran and went to Simon Peter and to the other disciple whom Jesus loved, and told them, "They have taken the Lord from the tomb, and we don't know where they put him." So Peter and the other disciple went out and came to the tomb. They both ran, but the other disciple ran faster than Peter and arrived at the tomb first; he bent down and saw the burial cloths there, but did not go in. When Simon Peter arrived after him, he went into the tomb and saw the burial cloths there, and the cloth that had covered his head, not with the burial cloths but rolled up in a separate place. Then the other disciple also went in, the one who had arrived at the tomb first, and he saw and believed. For they did not yet understand the Scripture that he had to rise from the dead.

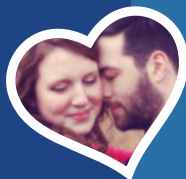

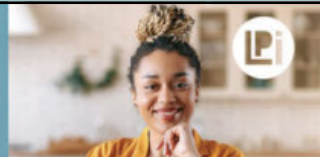
