Stop and Smell the Roses

They that hope in the LORD will renew their strength, they will soar on eagles' wings; They will run and not grow weary, walk and not grow faint. Isaiah 40:31

Thomas Tusser in A Hundred Good Points of Husbandry, 1557, first mentioned the observational cause and effect of precipitation and growth, "Sweet April showers Do spring May flowers."

The sentiment indicates the trails before the treasures we all endure in life. Lent, for example, is the penance we embrace before the glory of the Easter Resurrection. Also, we look at our lives as a pilgrimage, a pathway of struggle onto eternal happiness and glory; we live here, but we are not destined to stay here.

Even our calendar expresses this concept of struggle and joy. Our weeks are mired in toil and then we rest on Sunday; we look forward to the weekend. Wednesday is "hump day," the half-way point to the weekend.

God designed His creation this way; He created for six days and on the seventh He rested. As we are made in the image and likeness of God, we, too, rest on the seventh day. We come together to praise God and then we feast on the Sunday Meal.

The seasons of the year reflect this sentiment. We plant in the spring and we harvest in the fall. The leaves drop off in October and the trees and grass spring back to life in April.

Our own lives reflect this sentiment. We are born and we die; we start school and we graduate; we begin a new sport season and we conclude and (hopefully) celebrate with the championship. We came close, so close, this year in the NFL, but it wasn't meant to be, again. But that's another story for another day.

God made us to be one with Him. He longs to be with us with a perfect love and wants us to love Him and each other. And at the same time, He knows we are fallen because of original sin; we are born with a fractured and disordered human nature.

Because of this, we have seasons of repentance and seasons of celebration; we prepare for Christ's coming during Lent with almsgiving, prayer and fasting. We prepare for Christ's coming during Advent with prayer and anticipation. We examine our conscience before going to confession, reflecting on all the ways we have fallen short and not loved God fully. Then we celebrate; we celebrate the Resurrection during the Easter Season; we celebrate the Incarnation during the Christmas Season; we celebrate God's love and mercy when we receive absolution in the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

It's during these times of celebration that we take time to reflect on all our blessings. We remember God's unfailing love, compassion, and forgiveness. We celebrate the victories in our lives like new life, both in birth and in Baptism; we celebrate graduations; we celebrate our team's victory (but not this year – maybe next year). It's in these times of celebration and victory that we stop to smell the roses, count our blessings, remember those around us who love us, appreciate the many gifts given us, the beauty of the world around us.

The world has many troubles, but the same world gives us many wonderful and stunning sights that stir marvel and delight in our hearts. It's in these times we recall the beauty all around us. We take time because it refreshes our hearts, our minds and our souls.

Yes, there's a time to address the struggles we must endure. But there is a time to embrace the allure and peace that exists in our lives. It is in these times of quiet reflection that we recognize that God is in control, and we can rest in His loving arms. We must stop to smell the roses, let the sunshine on our face, look at the colorful sunset, hug a loved one, listen to the night sounds and smile at the knowledge that all this was made for us. This is the time to be glad and thankful, to be in the moment to appreciate that God made us and all that is around us. He made us and the whole world good.

40 Days for Life - 2022 Spring Campaign

Another successful campaign with many babies' lives saved and multiple workers quitting their jobs with Planned Parenthood. The following are two stories of workers who quit working and shared their reason with vigil participants. (The following is from 40 Days for Life)

Planned Parenthood in California is down another abortion worker thanks to the prayers of 40 Days for Life volunteers. Vigil participants were wrapping up their shift on the sidewalk when a young woman pulled up in her car to chat. "Now that I don't work here anymore, I'm allowed to talk to you!" she began. "You are doing good work. Keep it up." Vigil participants introduced themselves to the now-former abortion worker, who reported that their peaceful prayer presence disrupts the abortion facility's operations in two key ways:

- Large numbers of abortion clients cancel their appointments when they see prayer warriors on the sidewalk.
- "Employees get testy and grumpy and even angry, and it becomes a miserable place to work."

The newly liberated abortion worker was blocking the turn lane, so she had to cut the conversation short and move on...but before she left, she told the campaign volunteers, "I'm so grateful and happy that I don't have to work at that place anymore!"

<u>Western United States:</u> 40 Days for Life volunteers at a vigil in the western United States noticed the local abortion facility appears to be short-staffed. They now know why. "We found out two more Planned Parenthood workers quit!" reported the local campaign leader. One of the staffers who converted had worked at the facility for more than a decade. The other stopped to talk with 40 Days for Life participants after quitting. "She said she quit in response to us," the campaign leader said.

The vocation of a Vincentian is to follow Christ through service to those in need and to bear witness to Christ's compassionate and liberating love. Here is a story shared by Janet and Rob Lunnemann of their commitment to Saint Vincent de Paul. Rob and I were assigned a client, "Chris," who was in need of some food and clothing. I spoke to Chris on the phone to better understand his circumstances and get some basic information. He had been out of work for a while. He was divorced and had a young daughter who stays with him on the weekends. He said he needed clothes so he had something decent to wear when looking for a job. When I found out he didn't have a car but lived close to a bus line, I asked if bus passes would be helpful; he said they would be very appreciated. Rob and I headed over to the food pantry to pack a box for Chris, he said his food supply was very low. We packed the usual items, keeping in mind his visiting daughter might enjoy a fun cereal, crackers, and spaghetti-os. Chris met us in front of his apartment, we set the box of food on the step so we could talk with him. He told us that, after his divorce, his father passed away. Then, three months ago, his mother passed away; he was very close to her. It took a while before Chris was ready to face the world again. He misses his mother terribly. We asked if it was okay to pray with him, he said that would be fine. Rob put his hand on Chris' shoulder and prayed for his situation, for employment, for healing. When Rob asked the Holy Spirit to aid in relieving Chris' grief; tears streamed. He quickly wiped his face, said he didn't know how to thank us, then took his food box, voucher, and bus tickets up the stairs. We are never sure when we go out on a call how it will go but it is always our hope that our visit and prayers will bring the client closer to the Lord. Thanks for allowing us to help our neighbors in need.

- 23 calls serving 47 people and 96 hours of Vincentians' time
- Conference-funded Aid: \$2,861 (\$1,456 for rent, \$305 for utilities, \$710 for food, transportation \$375, medical \$15)
- In-Kind Goods: \$1,296 (\$580 pantry food, \$350 furniture vouchers, \$240 clothing vouchers, \$126 household vouchers)
- Total Receipts/Income: \$5,024

We want to thank St. Henry District High School Student Council for the donation of \$861 for purchases to help supplement our pantry with hamburger, hot dogs, and bread. These are items we buy to supplement the food drive donations provided by the parish.
