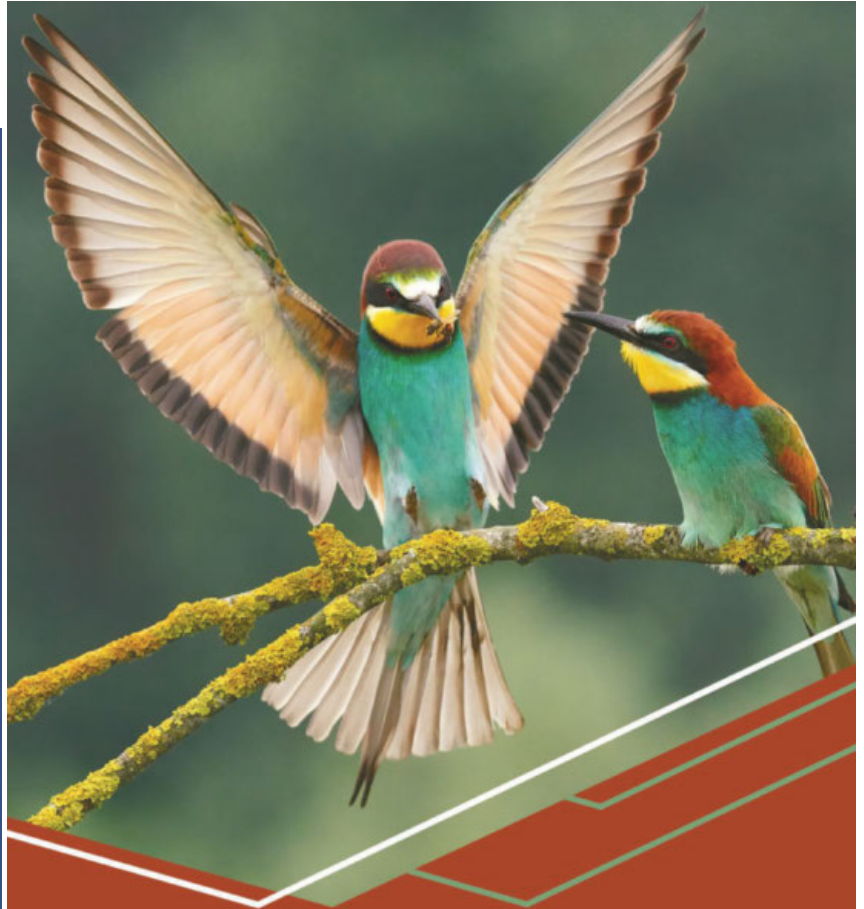

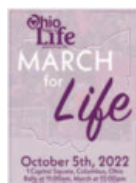

A NOTE FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

Last Saturday 29 of our parishioners completed their initiation into the Church by receiving the Sacrament of Confirmation. You will find their names in today's bulletin. As most everyone knows this Sacrament is received only once in a lifetime and is conferred by a bishop.

The Sacrament may be administered by a priest when an adult is being baptized, as at the Easter Vigil; when a baptized but never confirmed Catholic is near death; and when the bishop designates a priest to do so for an identified person or group for specific reasons. Such was the case this year when Bishop Malesic permitted me to confirm our parishioners on a specific date in his stead.

The reason for this exception was that the Diocese changed its practice of scheduling Confirmations after we already had set a confirmation date for 2022. Why the diocesan change? The Cleveland Diocese has only two bishops in active ministry for 185 parishes. And, many of these parishes have fewer than a dozen or two candidates for Confirmation.

Beginning in 2023 St. Martin of Tours parish will continue to prepare our own candidates for Confirmation, but the celebration and conferral of the Sacrament by a bishop will be with the candidates of Our Lady of Grace Parish (Hinckley) and those of Our Lady Help of Christian Parish (Litchfield). The pastors will suggest a date and location for Confirmation and the next available bishop will eventually be assigned. And, at this time, it has not been decided how often Confirmation will be held for our three smaller parishes.

Last year the Oktoberfest was such a success that we are holding another party in a few weeks – October 1st from 6:00 – 9:00pm following the Saturday evening Mass. Tickets for adults and children can be purchased on the parish website. It includes the evening event of music and dancing by the Culkar Band from Hofbrauhaus in Cleveland, and the food provided by Whole Hogg Catering of Litchfield. Tickets are \$30 for adults and \$10 for children under 12.

Like Oktoberfest 2021 and this summer's parish picnic, we presented these events not as fundraisers. They simply are opportunities for parishioners to come together and enjoy one another's company and make your parish "community" stronger. All are welcomed to bring whatever games they'd like,

as well as some comfortable dancing shoes. Just make yourself at home. After all, "we're family!"

This Sunday is Catechetical Sunday. We look to ways this coming season to grow in our faith and relationship with God. PSR had its first in-person Session last Sunday. There are 114 young people in Levels 1 – 8. For Adults seeking to know and understand more about their Christian/Catholic faith, we have two weekly sessions: 1) A session on Church History that is coming to an end this month with the hope of beginning something new and to their interest in October; and 2) An evening Bible Study Session that will begin this Tuesday, September 20 at 6:30pm in the parish hall meeting room. Growing in our faith is a lifetime venture.

As mentioned in prior columns and advertised in the bulletin, we also offer a men's and women's Fellowship Group on the first and third Saturdays of each month at 8:00am. You are welcome to gather to pray and share your story of God's activity in your life. It's rather comfortable, low-key, and inspiring. The men also meet on the fourth Monday for prayer in the Adoration chapel at 7:00pm.

This weekend, as on mostly every third weekend, volunteers will again be at the doors with baskets for donations to the Mission in Reynosa. Next month Tim O'Connor will be here to celebrate Mass and provide an update on their mission activity at the U.S./Mexican border. I am aware of the friendship Fr. Dunphy had with Fr. Tim and the O'Connor family going back to their days together in Akron. I also heard that back-in-the-day the youth of our parish also supported the mission. Even with all the monthly second collections in your box of envelopes and online, parishioners of St. Martin have had a special place in their heart for the Reynosa Mission. Plan on welcoming Fr. Tim back the weekend of October 15 and 16. Volunteers will be ready to accept any donations for their mission work.

For the Feast of St. Francis, a blessing of animals will be held near the pavilion on Monday October 3rd at 6:30pm.

The biennial Priest Convocation with our bishop will be held Oct. 4-7. Masses here are cancelled, but I will offer the intentions at daily Mass with the bishop. Pray for us!

GOSPEL MEDITATION

ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

September 18, 2022~25th Sunday in Ordinary Time

"You cannot serve both God and mammon." Merriam-Webster defines mammon as material wealth or possessions, especially having a debasing influence. While God does not take issue with our need to use money for the business of our lives, there can be a problem with the attitudes we bring to it. We can easily become so preoccupied and obsessed with money that it becomes the real "god" we worship. Do we serve mammon instead of God? In their book, *Wealth, Riches and Money*, Craig Hill and Earl Pitts outline symptoms of mammon's influence in our lives. Some of these are worry and anxiety over money, money mismanagement, fear over "never having enough," an "I can't afford it" mentality, impulse buying, stinginess, greed, debt, and discontent.

Many of the things on that list can consume us to the point that we are distracted from what we really need to be doing. Many people spend an inordinate amount of time worrying about money and it becomes the source of their worst fears. If we are honest with ourselves, we need to admit that we place far more emphasis on our material securities than we ought. In fact, we have actually convinced ourselves that we cannot live without it. Are we that certain about the presence of God? Many of the world's problems, especially those involving inequity and injustice, result from conflicts about money. Many equate money with happiness. Those successful in accumulating large amounts of it quickly realize just how wrong they are.

"Your ultimate allegiance is not to the government, not to the state, not to nation, not to any man-made institution. The Christian owes his ultimate allegiance to God, and if any earthly institution conflicts with God's will it is your Christian duty to take a stand against it. You must never allow the transitory evanescent demands of man-made institutions to take precedence over the eternal demands of the Almighty God (Martin Luther King, Jr.)." This is the point Jesus is trying to make. Unfortunately, when we look around our man-made kingdoms are far more prevalent than God's kingdom. When we start seeing greater evidence of justice, equity, dignity, respect, opportunity, gentleness, holiness, solidarity, honesty, simplicity, care for creation, and a decrease in ambition, then we will know that God's kingdom is being served. HOW BIRTHCARE HELPS

In recent months Birthcare has assisted many clients with basic, critical needs. One evening a client came in who was fostering two children. Then the opportunity came to foster the children's young sibling, this client needed clothing, diapers, wipes, baby wash and formula for her new charge. Another young parent was homeless and living in a hotel with three young children under the age of five. 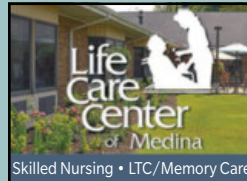

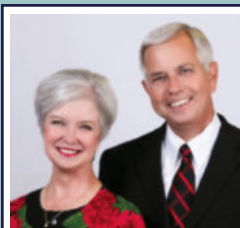
