RECTOR'S RAMBLINGS

CATHEDRAL STAFF

Dear Parishioners & Guests,

Two weeks ago, on the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord we began a week of celebrating vocations in our Church. On that Sunday our focus was on the vocation of the baptized with an emphasis on vocations to priesthood and religious life. This past Sunday, with the Gospel about the Wedding Feast at Cana the focus centered on the vocation of marriage.

As our children grow into adulthood they are faced with a choice. Specifically, they must decide whether the special call God has placed in their heart at baptism compels them to offer their gifts and talents for the good of the whole church, or, by contrast, if God is calling them to use their gifts a little closer to home in the "domestic church" – that is, the family.

If a person decides that God is calling him or her to use their gifts to benefit the Church-at-large, they will most likely choose some form of religious life, since that is the life that is conducive to spending long hours in the service of others. If, on the other hand, they feel God is calling them to a more individualized ministry – specifically, changing the world "one diaper at a time" – then they will choose marriage as the best way to live out their baptismal calling.

Incidentally, this is the difference between a "vocation: and a "career." A "vocation" is the way a person chooses to live out their baptismal call. It is the way each of us works out our salvation, day after day, through the unique relationships we form with others and with God. Alternatively, our "careers" are the work we do, to exercise the gifts God has given to us as well as to pay the bills. To keep things in proper spiritual balance, our careers must always be secondary and supportive to our vocations. The priest who is a liturgist, or an administrator, or a teacher, or has some other specialized gift, must never let this comparatively minor work conflict with his vocation to be a shepherd to the parish he serves. In the same way, the husband who is a stockbroker, or the wife who is a physician, or PTO president, must never let this minor work conflict with their vocation to shepherd the family flock and teach each person in the family (themselves included) how to have intimate, loving, generous, peaceful and joyful relationships with one another. This is what Saint Pope John Paul II meant when he encouraged families to practice "solidarity" and reminds us all "the command [to Adam and Eve] to love preceded the obligation to toil."

Pray for vocations, pray for our children they follow the path God truly calls them to...

FAITH & OUTREACH

SACRAMENTAL LIFE

INFANT BAPTISM

Baptisms for children under the age of 7 are held privately at the convenience of the family and presiding clergy. Please contact the Cathedral Office for details and to make arrangements.

CONFIRMATION

Catholic adults, whom for various reasons have not received the Sacrament of Confirmation but would like to do so, please contact the Cathedral Office to make an appointment with one of the priests on staff.

EUCCHARIST

Communion to the homebound can be arranged by simply calling the Cathedral Office for details and to make arrangements. Parishioners who require low-gluten hosts due to allergies or other medical conditions may contact the Cathedral Office and we will be happy to make the proper arrangements for you to be able to receive Communion at Mass.

WANT TO BE CATHOLIC

If you are an adult (over the age of 7) and are already baptized in another Christian tradition the process for “Full Communion” with the Catholic Church is as simple as contacting the Cathedral Office for an appointment with the Rector, Fr. Jan Schmidt. In the event you are not Baptized, the process for becoming Catholic is called the RCIA or the *Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults* that requires a more in-depth preparation and period of study. For further information please contact Mrs. Debbie Birck through the Cathedral Office.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK

Please do not wait until the point of death to receive this sacrament. A careful judgement about the serious nature of the surgery or illness is sufficient. This sacrament may be repeated in the event the illness worsens. For those who are near death the Church offers Confession, Anointing of the Sick and the Eucharist as Viaticum or “*Food for the Journey*.” Contact the Cathedral Office to make arrangements or in an emergency please feel free to call the Rector, Fr. Jan Schmidt @513.520.7442.

MARRIAGE

Any resident Catholic of the Archdiocese of Cincinnati may celebrate their marriage in the Cathedral with permission of their rightful Pastor. Please contact the Cathedral Office for details and to make arrangements. Please contact us at least 6 months (minimum) prior to the tentative wedding date.

FREEDOM TO MARRY

An annulment is more accurately described as a “Declaration of the Freedom to Marry.” If you are a Catholic or are planning to marry a Catholic and you have been previously married and divorced we would like to assist you in the healing that is necessary in order to move forward with your life. Part of this healing is the effort to obtain an “annulment” or a “Declaration of Nullity” that then provides you with the freedom to marry in the Catholic Church. We want to help, it doesn't cost anything so, please contact the Cathedral Office to set an appointment with one of the priests on staff.

PRIESTHOOD, RELIGIOUS LIFE AND THE PERMANENT DIACONATE

If you think you may have a vocation to priesthood, religious life or the permanent diaconate please speak with one of the priests on staff or contact Fr. Dan Schmittmeyer for priesthood and religious life or Deacon Mark Machuga for the Permanent Diaconate @513.421.3131.

COMMUNION TO THE HOMEBOUND

If you are a registered parishioner who is homebound and would like to receive Holy Communion, please contact the Cathedral office.

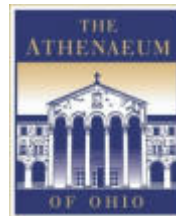


Five hundred years ago, Michelangelo unveiled what would come to be regarded as one of the world's great masterpieces of inspired art and perhaps the most beautiful sculpture ever created. Now, under an exclusive license from the Vatican Observatory Foundation, this masterpiece has been recreated in cast marble from an authorized mold derived from the original. This posthumous Pietà is a 1:1 casting that is faithful in every detail to Michelangelo's original. Of all his sculptures the Pietà was the only one Michelangelo ever signed. In the Pietà all of Michelangelo's attention was focused on evoking the ideal of spiritual beauty so important in the time of the Italian Renaissance. It is a testament to his abiding love of God, the source of his inspiration, that he was able to capture the compassion and serenity in Mary's face with so much grace that, half a millennium later, the vision of it continues to inspire us. One of the greatest sculptures ever created, it stands as an icon for the Christian faith, bringing inspiration to the millions who visit St. Peter's Basilica every year. A rare recreation of this masterpiece is on display here at the Cathedral for a limited time. To find out more about this special project, please call the Parish Office. The Pietà is located in the baptistery, to the right of the main altar and opposite the Blessed Sacrament Chapel. Public viewing is available Monday through Friday from 6:30am - 6:00pm, Saturday from 10:00am - 6:00pm and on Sundays during Mass times (8:30am, 11:00am & 6:00pm).

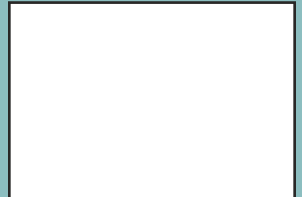
