

Pastor's Note: FORTY-SEVEN YEARS OF CHANGE

On Tuesday, May 25, I will celebrate forty-seven years as a priest. And more than one third of those years (sixteen and counting) have been while serving here at this parish. How blessed can a man get?

On May 25, 1974, I was one of ten men ordained. Four of them have since died. Besides me, the others are retired, although most are still engaged in some sort of ministry.

What I want to share today is how varied my priestly ministry has been over the years. Starting a new parish here is the icing on the cake of rich experiences. I have been able to work with families at all levels, many times assisting at difficult times. But I have also benefitted from people's incredible kindness and generosity.

Prison chaplaincy was never a full-time responsibility, but the weekly trips to death row provided ministry that I may not have expected. Working with university students at Bowling Green was exciting and exhausting at the same time. Teaching theology to high school kids, working with Hispanics (including Mass in Spanish), and traveling on mission trips to Guatemala – each had its own rewards.

And then there were the RCIA groups from various parishes over the years – always enriching. The many retreats that we have had here and elsewhere have helped me on my own faith journey.


Finally, there are those regular and important Sunday Mass experiences. I made a resolution when I was ordained to never preach unless I felt fully prepared. Only once did I choose not to preach (on account of sickness earlier in the week) during those forty-seven years. Gathering for Sunday Mass has been a mainstay of all the other forms of ministry that has taken place.

As I look back, these have been years of wonderful opportunities to walk with God's people in our common quest. Thank God...and thanks to all of you who have assisted me.

The purpose is to help people tune in to some aspect of faith in the middle of the week while also learning to notice how God is at work on a daily basis.

CATHOLIC CONFERENCE OF OHIO

The Bishops of Ohio Announce the Lifting of the Dispensation from the Obligation to attend Holy Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation May 13, 2021

As we move beyond the worst of the coronavirus pandemic and access to the COVID-19 vaccine has become more widespread, the time has arrived for the good of all the faithful when the general dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation is no longer necessary.

Together, the Bishops of Ohio have decided that the general obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation (including the Saturday/Vigil Mass) is to be reinstated (CIC, can. 1247). This will take effect in each of the Dioceses of Ohio the weekend of June 5-6, 2021. As has always been the case, those who have a serious reason are exempt from attending Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation (*Catechism of the Catholic Church*, 2181). This includes those who are ill, have significant health risk factors or care for someone who is immuno-compromised or ill, as well as those who have significant fear or anxiety of contracting the coronavirus in a large group of persons. Nevertheless, these persons should observe the Lord's Day (CIC, can. 1247) and are encouraged to spend time in prayer on Sunday, meditating on the Lord's passion, death and resurrection; an appropriate way to do this is through viewing a broadcast of the Sunday Mass. Masses that are broadcast through various media are not intended as a substitute nor do they fulfill the obligation for the persons who are able to gather for a Sunday celebration and other Holy Days of Obligation. Instead, they are intended for the sick, home-bound, the imprisoned, etc., who are unable to attend Mass in person. Kindly consult your pastor with any specific questions regarding the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation.

The book of Exodus reminds us to keep holy the Sabbath day (Exodus 20: 8-10). As Catholics, we are invited by God to gather together in community, and participate fully in the Sunday Eucharist, which is the "source and summit of the Christian life." "Participation in the communal celebration of the Sunday Eucharist is a testimony of belonging and of being faithful to Christ and to his Church. The faithful give witness by this to their communion in faith and charity. Together they testify to God's holiness and their hope of salvation. They strengthen one another under the guidance of the Holy Spirit" (*Catechism of the Catholic Church*, 2182).

The obligation to attend Mass on Sunday and Holy Days is not something God asks of us out of his own necessity to be worshipped, but rather a gift to the faithful for their spiritual well-being, eternal salvation and formation in our relationship with God and one another. To that end, Saint John Vianney rightly asserts, "There is nothing so great as the Eucharist. If God had something more precious, He would have given it to us." The Eucharist is the greatest gift Christ left to the Church—the gift of Himself. There is no substitute for Mass celebrated in person.

We are profoundly grateful to our pastors and all of the faithful for their flexibility, fidelity and great generosity in support of the mission of the Church throughout this unprecedented time. As we prepare for the reinstatement of the obligation to attend Mass, we are excited once again to gather together in person without restrictions in our parish churches, most fittingly on the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. As we reflect on our Lord's goodness and mercy in the midst of the sacrifices made during the coronavirus pandemic, we ask Saint Joseph to intercede for us, that through his fatherly protection and care, we may experience a renewal of faith in the real presence of Christ in the Eucharist.

We welcome you back with great joy and eagerness!





LITURGICAL UPDATES

Restoration of Liturgical Practices

Since the middle of March, 2020, we have been restricted in the way we celebrate Sunday Masses, both here and elsewhere. At the guidance of our bishop, we are now able to move ahead with the lifting of some of the restrictions that have been put in place during this COVID pandemic. Changes will take place beginning the weekend of June 5-6.

OBLIGATION

Because of the pandemic, the bishops lifted the normal obligation for Catholics to attend Sunday and holy day Mass. As of June 5-6, this dispensation will be canceled, once again requiring weekly attendance and participation at Mass. (Please read letter on page 6.)

Our bishop has also written, "Members of the faithful who choose not to attend Mass in person out of significant fear or anxiety of contracting the coronavirus in a large group are also exempt from the obligation." (the word 'also' means in addition to those who are ill, have pre-existing conditions, or those who care for people with immune-compromised conditions.)

WHAT TO EXPECT

Throughout the summer months we will keep our present Sunday morning Mass schedule (8:30, 10:00, and 11:30 a.m.) The Saturday Mass will remain at 5:00 p.m. This was announced two months ago. After Labor Day we will have a new Mass schedule that allows more time between Masses.

Mask-Wearing

In keeping with the guidelines of the governor and the bishops, we will not require people to wear masks when entering the church building. Those who wish to wear a mask, however, may do so as long as they wish. Not wearing a mask is primarily based on the assumption that the person is fully vaccinated, something we continue to encourage, for the good of all.

Social Distance

The restrictions that have closed off certain pews will be lifted by the weekend of June 5-6. However, we will maintain limited pews in the sections of church to the right and to the left of the altar platform for those who desire more social distance. Also the chapel will remain open for those who want to sit somewhat apart from others.

Right now we are not going to re-introduce the offering of coffee and cookies after Masses in the Connection Center, primarily because the Mass schedule does not allow much time between Masses. (Coffee on the plaza outside the front doors may happen, however, as the weather allows.)

Liturgical Ministries

Processions (including that of the offertory gifts) will be re-introduced. The offertory baskets will once again be passed at the appropriate time to allow people to participate in having their gifts brought before the altar. Ushers will be re-instated for this purpose. Servers will actively participate at Mass. Lectors will be part of the entrance procession. Greeters will be giving you the weekly bulletin as you enter.

More to come

We cannot tell you right now when the Nest (nursery) will open again during Sunday Masses. We also have not yet scheduled when Children's Liturgy of the Word will resume. But we have not forgotten how important these ministries are. They will return!


