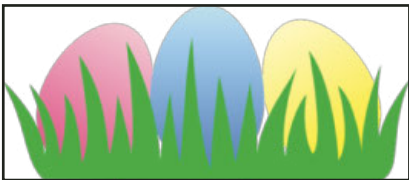

WELFARE CHECKS - As of January 2022, the *Fairport Harbor Police Auxiliary Unit* will be conducting weekly welfare checks on our most vulnerable senior citizens. This could include seniors with long distance family contact or limited mobility. The program will be available as a public service and consists of an *Auxiliary Police Officer* coming to the door as a friendly visit and making sure everything is okay. They will not enter the home (unless under certain circumstances) due to COVID-19 restrictions. You must live in Fairport Harbor. If you, or a family on behalf of our seniors wish to sign up, please contact the Police Department at 440-352-3150.

Fairport Senior Center Guidelines (updated)

1. When you enter the senior center, one of our volunteers will sign you in. Please be patient and practice social distancing!
2. The fitness room & pool room are now open Monday thru Thursday from 8am until 3pm. The fitness room will also be open on Friday from 8m until noon.

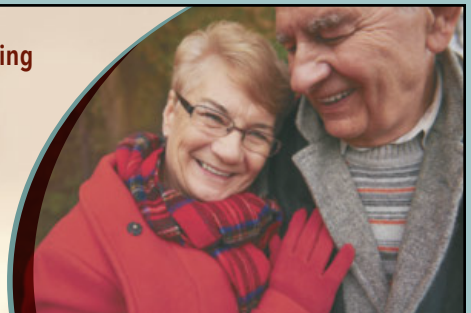

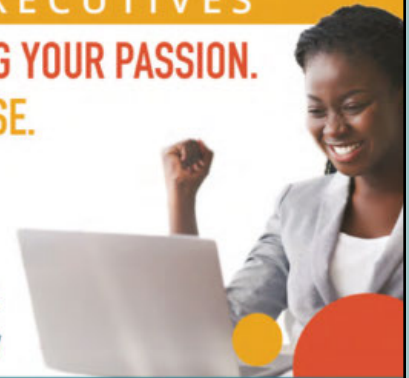
