WHAT IS JUNETEENTH?

The day's name is a blending of the words June and nineteenth. It commemorates **June 19, 1865**: the day that Union Army Maj. Gen. Gordon Granger rode into Galveston, Texas, and told slaves of their emancipation. That day came more than two years after President Abraham Lincoln issued the [Emancipation Proclamation](#) on January 1, 1863. Even after Lincoln declared all enslaved people free on paper, that hadn't necessarily been the case in practice. Juneteenth became a US federal holiday in 2021.



June 14, 2024 Flag Day

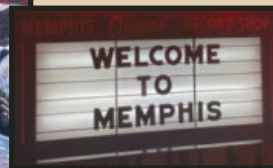
Here are 4 flag trivia questions:

3. Despite the myths, the flag can touch the ground and still be washed and used. However if the flag is torn or damaged beyond repair, the tradition is to burn it with dignity.
4. The US flag has been placed on the moon by an astronaut during six Apollo missions (11, 12, 14, 15, 16 and 17).
