



If you rely on a wheelchair, or feel you need any assistance physically or cognitively, you must have your own able bodied caregiver for all trips. Please pay for all trips when signing up & write a separate check for each trip. <u>Refund</u>: If you must cancel a trip, we will attempt to sell your seat when possible so that you can be refunded. <u>Trip Insurance</u>: Please inquire about insurance when booking a trip. <u>A complete list of trip policies & procedures is available at the Center's office. Patriots Day -- In the immediate aftermath of the attacks, carried out by terrorists from al-Qaeda , President George W. Bush proclaimed Friday, September 14, 2001 as a **National Day of Prayer and Remembrance**.

A bill to make September 11th a national day of mourning was introduced in the U.S. House on October 25, 2001, by Rep. Vito Fossella with 22 co-sponsors. The result was the resolution

to proclaim September 11, 2002, as the first Patriot Day.

The flag of the United States is flown at half-staff at the White House and on all U.S. government buildings and establishments throughout the world. Additionally, a moment of silence is observed to correspond with attacks, beginning at 8:46am—the time the first plane, American Airlines Flight 11, struck the North Tower of the World Trade Center on September 11, 2001.

Prisoner of War Missing in Action Remembrance Table is set for one, symbolizing the fact that members of our armed forces are missing from our ranks. The table set for one is small, symbolizing the fragility of one prisoner alone against their suppressors. The tablecloth is white, symbolic of the purity of their intentions. The single red rose in the vase signifies the blood that many had shed. The yellow ribbon on the vase signifies the yellow ribbons worn on the lapels of thousands who demand proper accounting of their comrades. The salt sprinkled on the plate reminds us of the countless tears of families. The glass is empty and inverted...they cannot toast tonight. The chair is empty...they are not here. The candle is reminiscent of the light of hope which lives in our hearts.


