



Traveling Vietnam Wall

The traveling *Vietnam Wall* is a 3/5 scale replica of the *Vietnam Memorial* in Washington DC. It stands six feet tall at the center and covers almost 300 feet from end to end. Built in 1998, it is the largest replica *Wall* traveling the U.S., providing an opportunity for people to honor and pay tribute to those who served in the Vietnam War.

The traveling *Vietnam Wall*, also known as *The Moving Wall*, was created to bring the

experience of the *Vietnam Veterans Memorial* to communities across the United States. Here is a brief history:

- ♦ Concept and Creation: The idea for *The Moving Wall* came from John Devitt, a Vietnam veteran who attended the 1982 dedication of the *Vietnam Veterans Memorial* in Washington DC. Deeply moved by the experience, he wanted to share it with those who couldn't travel to the capital. With the help of his friends, he built the first replica, which debuted in Tyler, Texas, in 1984.
- **Purpose:** *The Moving Wall* was designed to provide a place for healing and reflection. It allows people to honor the over 58,000 men and women who lost their lives in the Vietnam War.
- <u>Traveling</u>: Since its creation, *The Moving Wall* has travel to hundreds of cities and towns across the United States. It typically stays in each location for about a week, allowing ample time for visitors to pay their respects.
- <u>Impact</u>: *The Moving Wall* has had a profound impact on communities, fostering a sense of unity and remembrance. It has also helped educate younger generations about the Vietnam War and its significance.


