



#### ♦ HISTORY OF VETERANS DAY

November 11 became an official national holiday in the United States in 1938. In 1954 the name was changed to Veterans Day to honour those who had served in all Tomb of the Unknown U.S. wars. Ceremonies are held each year at the Tomb of the Unknown, and floral tributes are placed on the graves of service men and women and at memorials throughout the country. Naturalization ceremonies have come to be an important part of the day's activities.

#### ♦ HISTORY OF BLUE STAR MOTHERS


