OHIO WESTERN RESERVE NATIONAL CEMETERY HISTORY & BACKGROUND

- Ohio Western Reserve National Cemetery was dedicated September 19, 2000
- The cemetery serves an estimated 540,000 veterans in Ohio
- Situated on 430 acres, the cemetery accommodates casketed and cremated remains
- Over 3,000 burials are conducted each year
- Ohio Western Reserve also maintains the Confederate Stockade Cemetery located on Johnson Island near Sandusky and Woodlawn Soldiers Lot in Cleveland
- *Ohio Western Reserve* has a unique memorial pathway which consists of memorials donated by various veteran organizations
