





If you need to say farewell to your faded flag, you should never just throw it away. After all, it's a sacred symbol. Actually, according to the **U.S. Flag Code**, the preferred method of disposal is burning. Many organizations will hold flag burning ceremonies on **Flag Day** and are happy to include your flag in their observance. You can find disposal boxes outside of **Veterans of Foreign Wars** and **American Legion** posts, as well as some state and county governments, who may also collect flags.



You can also do this job at home! Just be sure to burn cotton flags, since setting synthetic or nylon materials on fire let off nasty gasses and vapors. It's simple enough to do, and you could even make a little family ceremony of it. Here's the "how to" from the **U.S. Department of Defense**: First, lower the flag and fold it into a traditional triangle shape. Light the fire pit and as the flag burns, say the **Pledge of Allegiance**. Once there are only ashes left, you should also have a moment of silence before burying them. (*Be sure to check local fire and state codes before you get going.*)


