

BAPTISM

Parents are required to attend the Parental Baptismal Preparation Program prior to baptism of their child. If you have not attended a baptism prep class in the previous three years, you will need to attend. These sessions are held the 1st Thursday of each month at 7:30 pm. Baptisms are done every Sunday immediately following the 11:45 a.m. Mass.

FIRST PENANCE/FIRST COMMUNION/CONFIRMATION

Faith Formation in-person and at-home classes prepare 1st and 2nd grade students for First Penance and First Communion, and 7th and 8th grade students for Confirmation. Sacrament preparation is also available for students and adults in the Special Religious Education (SPRED) program at Sacred Heart. 



PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Today the 4th Sunday of Advent, "cycle C," the gospel is Luke 1:39-45, the 2nd joyful mystery of the rosary, the Visitation of Mary, blessed Virgin to Elizabeth. In his Life of Christ, Fulton Sheen says "the Annunciation was actually God asking the free consent of a creature to help Him to be incorporated into humanity. Having given her fiat the Theotokos or God-bearer visits her cousin Elizabeth. barren yet also pregnant here "when child bearers became the 1st heralds of Kings!" Our salvation on Jesus' part requires flesh and blood, says scripture scholar Fr. Francis Martin. Christ wants to become incarnate in all of us! The fathers of the church say that Mary conceived Jesus in her heart. Really, she conceived Him in her ear, by the words of the angel! He comes to the lowly, insignificant Bethlehem, Ephrathah. Bethlehem, in Hebrew, means House of Bread. Ephrathat means fruitful. Micah states in Ch. 5 "from you who shall come forth for me, one who is to be ruler in Israel; whose origin is from of old, from ancient times. The psalmist states, "make us turn to you, the word Shoob in Hebrew is an imperative command involving conversion or metanoia, if we see your face we shall be saved, this is for heaven." Christ came to feed us with His flesh as St. Bernard states "The manna descended from heaven so that the hungry might rejoice "My body and blood is real food and true drink," John 6: 51-57. Perhaps we don't have gold, frankincense and myrrh, but the wise men knew they didn't know everything. May Jesus be magnified through you! -Fr. Holmes

GOSPEL MEDITATION

A DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

December 25, 2021

The Nativity of the Lord (Christmas)

"He so loved us that for our sake He was made man in time, through Whom all times were made; was in the world less in years than His servants, though older than the world itself in His eternity; was made man, Who made man; was created of a mother, whom He created; was carried by hands which He formed; nursed at the breasts which He had filled; cried in the manger in wordless infancy, He the Word without Whom all human eloquence is mute (St. Augustine, Sermon 188)." The miracle of what happens at Christmas is truly an awesome mystery. Revealed in the silent ordinariness of life is God's intimate love for humanity and all that he made. The Word, existing for all time, comes and dwells among us. God kisses us. We can seek and soar with playful delight as a joy never known before fills our heart.

Joy is best expressed through dance. There is just something truly wonderful about the selfabandon a beautiful melodic dance reveals. If we are able to let go and really be free, it celebrates life in a way few other experiences really can. With the birth of Jesus Christ, God takes the Divine Dance to a deeper and more tangible level. We can now not only see what we believe but believe what we see! This most perfect dance is a call to beauty, innocence, truth, purpose, hope, faith, and love. Today we know, beyond doubt, that we are a necessary part of God's beautifully choreographed masterpiece of life and not just a random happening without real intent or purpose. We are loved, treasured, and blessed.

Accepting the truth of God's birth in time we also accept an invitation to dance with God. We can let go of what tethers us to anxious concerns and superficial securities. Throw caution to the wind and go with God. We have been blessed with talents, gifts, and life eternal. Follow the rhythm of the dance with joy and listen to what the Word who became flesh tells us about what the next steps can be. Today, heaven remains the same, but earth has been profoundly

changed.

It is estimated that around 5000 pounds of food was handed out. This would not have been possible if not for the community of Sacred Heart. People donated all the food except for the turkeys, which were purchased from Harris Teeter (from generous donors.) Volunteers then gathered to put together turkey dinner kits and all day long. Volunteers then came to assemble the rest of the bags to be handed out. There were 50 people working to make sure food was given out and traffic flowed smoothly. Boy Scout Troop 608 made 50 pumpkin pies from scratch. The American Heritage Girls made 50 apple pies and also volunteered Friday and Saturday the week the kits were handed out. The John Paul the Great basketball team came out

Saturday morning to help with distribution. This amazing event was truly humbling. On behalf of all the families who had a wonderful Thanksgiving meal because of YOU, thank you!!!







Stewardship Ties

There is a lot of imagery around Christmas that has to do with adoption — or, more specifically, with a child being loved by another as if they belonged to that person and loved in such a profound way that in time, they do come to belong to that person.

We see this with Joseph and the infant Jesus. Joseph is not Jesus' biological father. But through a series of actions, and through his faithfulness in small, everyday matters, Joseph becomes the foster father of Jesus. Perhaps we are parents who have adopted children, or we ourselves were adopted. We have also seen how,

through a series of actions of love and sacrifice, someone can become the parent of a person who is not their "blood." A lot of times these families celebrate the day of the adoption. I've heard it called a "gotcha day," and it's marked joyously, like a birthday.

Most of us are not descended from the Israelites, God's Chosen People. But through a series of extraordinary actions of love and sacrifice, God has made Himself our parent, too. And through our own actions, and through faithfulness in small and everyday matters, we are His children. But in this family, instead of blood ties, we have stewardship ties. It's not about who we look like, it's about how we treat one another. How we take care of one another.

So this Christmas, let's think about how we will celebrate our adoption. As much as it is Jesus' birthday, it's also our "gotcha day" — the day we received the gift of eternal family.


40TH CATHOLIC CHARITIES
