PASTOR'S MESSAGE

The celebration of the Nativity of Our Lord should have the effect of leading us in spirit to the Grotto of Bethlehem, and of making us aware of the necessity of our spiritual rebirth. This can be done by a close union with the word of God made man and by becoming partakers of His divine nature to which man was raised. Pius XII letter Mediator Dei November, 1947. Because Christmas is so great and high a feast it cannot be celebrated in a single day. This is why there is an octave, or eight, days of celebration similar to, but different from, the secular hymn 'The 12 Days of Christmas' which runs to the Epiphany on January 6th and the 3 Kings or Wise Men. St Leo the Great in one of his talks said the following "In adoring the birth of our Savior we find that we are celebrating the commencement of our own life. For the birth of Christ is the source of life for Christian folk and the birthday of the Head is the birthday of the Body!" This means practically as Fr. Lasance, S.J., says in <u>Saints & Sages</u> that "Our love of one another should be marked <u>by real devotedness</u>. That is, we must be prepared to make sacrifices for our neighbor! We must give our times and pains according to our circumstances: to the poor, sick and the old!" In a real way, if our patience, our charity, our mercy and the ability to love and forgive does not grow, then we have not properly understood Christmas! For Christmas is not essentially about giving gifts or presents, it is about giving our love, our heart and souls to others! May Christ's love as an innocent, vulnerable baby who needs love find its way into your heart and soul, for this and every day of your life! GOSPEL MEDITATION A DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

January 2, 2021 The Epiphany of the Lord

In his Apostolic Exhortation, The Joy of the Gospel, Pope Francis references a thought from Pope Benedict XVI: "Being a Christian is not the result of an ethical choice or a lofty idea, but the encounter with an event, a person, which gives life a new horizon and a decisive direction." Today we celebrate an encounter with the Person of Jesus Christ! This simple but holy event in time dramatically changes human life, pointing it toward a new horizon and giving it a decisive direction. This is a message and truth that is not meant to be shared with only a select few who qualify but with the entire world. Pope Francis continues saying, "Thanks solely to this encounter or renewed encounter with God's love, which blossoms into an enriching friendship, we are liberated from our narrowness and selfabsorption. We become fully human when we become more than human, when we let God bring us beyond ourselves in order to attain the fullest truth of our being."

Look around at people. Where is life heading for them? What gives them direction? Even we who are people of faith can get distracted and lose our focus. God, in all of His fullness, is revealed in Jesus Christ and we can encounter Him! God is tangible, real, vulnerable, poor, and full of wonders, surprises, and opportunities. For those who are struggling and lost, today is a day of great joy. All they have to do is reach out and touch the truth of Christ. This presence is revealed in the poor, exploited, and vulnerable ones who cry out for compassion and love. But it is also found in the faithful ones who see in the Epiphany of God a liberation from structures and systems that hurt us, a narrowness of mind and heart that constricts us, and an absorption in our self-agenda that prevents us from seeing anything other than ourselves as important.

We have been given the charge of preaching this Good News. If only we could find a way to be more effective, it might stand a chance of doing what God intended it to do. There is always tomorrow and our memory of that bright new light that shone so brilliantly that Bethlehem night pointing us to truth and reminding us that we are loved.





STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION ON LECTIONARY READINGS THE LIGHT OF THE MOON

There If you own a television that has been turned on at any point in the last month or so, chances are you've caught at least a scene or two of the 1946 classic film "It's a Wonderful Life."

If you're not familiar with the movie, it follows the life of George Bailey from childhood through adulthood. A dreamer by nature, George has big plans for himself that involve world exploration and adventure — but family and community obligations keep him tethered to the same spot on the map, leading an altogether ordinary life.

One of the most memorable scenes from that movie is of George dancing with his sweetheart Mary while they sing "Buffalo Gals — Won't you come out tonight/And dance

by the light of the moon?"

That lyric always catches my ear. Of course, the moon doesn't have any light of its own. All the moon has is the ability to reflect the light that shines upon it.

The same holds for us, doesn't it? Our stewardship is purely a reflection of the grace granted to us by another. "Upon you the LORD shines," writes Isaiah, "and over you appears his glory." Every good action we will ever take begins in the mind of God. The fact that we have the honor of carrying it out on His behalf is a beautiful gift. It is God that makes our ordinary lives extraordinary.

In the end of the movie, George Bailey realizes that he had a far greater life because, instead of being the hero of his own story, he allowed himself to reflect goodness onto others.

Remember — the magi didn't chart their own course. They merely followed the star.


