



#### **BAPTISM**

Parents are required to attend the Parental Baptismal Preparation Program prior to baptism of their child. If you have not attended a baptism prep class in the previous three years, you will need to attend. These sessions are held the 1st Thursday of each month at 7:30 pm. Baptisms are done every Sunday immediately following the 11:45 a.m. Mass.

#### FIRST PENANCE/FIRST COMMUNION/CONFIRMATION

Faith Formation in-person and at-home classes prepare 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> grade students for First Penance and First Communion, and 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grade students for Confirmation. Sacrament preparation is also available for students and adults in the Special Religious Education (SPRED) program at Sacred Heart. #### **PASTOR'S MESSAGE**

Have you ever wondered why immediately after Christ's birth in the Christmas season we immediately begin to celebrate several saints who were martyrs? One Christmas hymn puts it this way "Lo, He comes with clouds descending... once for our salvation slain... God appears on Earth to reign." Christ was born to reign from a cross! Right after Holy Family, we celebrate St. Stephen the Martyr. St. John the Evangelist who, although not a martyr, supposedly was boiled in oil but escaped and exiled to Patmos while working in the salt mines! He wrote the Book of Apocalypse. The Holy Innocents, 2 years and under, murdered by Herod out of fear! Saint Quodvultdeus of Carthage, a 5<sup>th</sup> century Bishop, quoted "The children die for Christ though they do not know it. They can not use their limbs to engage in battle, vet already they bear off the palm of victory!" (Liturgy of Hours Vol. 1 P 1274-1275.) St. Thomas A Becket was murdered in his own cathedral by order of Henry II in 1170. Cardinals wear red traditionally because they are to be willing to shed their blood for Christ. One wonders if any bishop or cardinal is willing to do that today? As Brandsma, a Dutch Carmelite would say, "If you wish to win the world for Christ, you must be willing to enter into conflict against it." The Joyful Mysteries of the Rosary, especially numbers four and five and the Presentation and the Finding of Jesus in The Temple, point to future foreboding events. The Blessed Mother, our greatest saint heard, "A sword will pierce your heart" Luke 2:35. Therefore, holiness means entering the full liturgical year with the Saints and solemnities imitating and living the life of Christ. We do this through the sacraments which as Fr. Schillebeeckx, O.P. said are encounters with Christ. Sadly, only 20-30% believe in the "Real Presence." Why ban the traditional Latin mass which is growing, beautifully celebrated, and all believe in Christ's Real Presence at that sacrifice?! Holiness begins at Baptism! We are adopted as children of God (St. Paul). Meditation, as St. Theresa of Avila says, is the royal road to Heaven. Are you like St. Jane Francis de Chantal, willing to step over the body of your son to leave the world and become a nun? True renewal in the church -Fr. Holmes are the Saint's lives!


#### A DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

#### January 9, 2021 The Baptism of the Lord

What reference point do you use when making decisions? Many times, impulse takes control and decisions are made based solely on emotion and desire. We all know that these types of decisions can often get us into trouble. When a person has a confident sense of who they are and a real understanding of what is important and of value, the likelihood of kneejerk impulsive choices diminishes. Baptism gives us what we need to make well informed and purposeful decisions. By this simple gesture, God claims us as His own and provides us with the identity and purpose we need to properly live life. It is tremendously reassuring, when we truly embrace this revelation and realize that we no longer have to wonder about the purpose of our lives or

struggle to find our way. The answer of who we are in God has been given to us. We no longer have to fumble around, trip over ourselves or walk aimlessly about. Issues surrounding the sacredness of life, the meaning of death, the protection of those most vulnerable, care for the weak and the poor, offering hospitality to those in search of a home, the purpose and proper place of work, how to create a just social order, caring for creation, and understanding our roles as heralds and stewards are just a few of the wonderful gifts baptism brings. When we make decisions based on things such as these core Gospel truths we really act as Christ himself, revealing to others the new creations that we are. This is how we live our baptism. It is difficult to walk against the tide. Yet,

that is precisely what baptism calls us to do. Although we are sinners, in need of mercy and far from perfection we are called to order our life and make decisions based upon the wisdom and guidance of Almighty God. He alone is the one who can claim us as His sons and daughters. Standing up for our principles will not make us popular. But who ever said Christianity is a popularity contest? Baptism calls us to stand up for that which goes against the grain of secularism. Standing in line with other sinners, we have our anchor to steady us in the tempests of life and God is very pleased. Forge ahead. There is nothing to fear.







## STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION ON LECTIONARY READINGS

#### I Hope I Am Like Him

"Who is this Christ? Is he like you?"

Perhaps you've heard this story, often attributed to the life of St. Teresa of Calcutta. A sick man asked her this question, as he marveled at her tireless service to himself and others in the name of someone named Jesus Christ.

"He is nothing like me," the saint is said to have answered. "But I hope I am like him." Though the authenticity of this exchange cannot be verified, its message rings perfectly true: all the value of our stewardship lies in its relativity to the one in whose name we perform it.

Consider the figure of John the Baptist — a magnificent,

towering character even purely from a literary or historical perspective. A martyr who fed on wild locusts and boldly spoke truth to power — a man so great some mistook him for the Messiah.

But why is he great? Because he prepared the way. All his accomplishments and escapades mean nothing if they are taken out of the context of salvation history. He only makes sense relative to Christ — and this is exactly as he wanted it. "One worthier than I is coming," he insists. And because of that humility and that total embrace of God's will, he is given one of the greatest honors in the New Testament — he baptizes the Son of God.

Let's examine our lives in the light of their relativity to Christ. How do we prepare the way? When Christ comes to us, what do we do? How do we leave ourselves open to be actors in God's plan?


