

If you have not attended a baptism prep class in the previous three years, you will need to attend. These sessions are held the 1st Thursday of each month at 7:30 pm. Baptisms are done every Sunday immediately following the 11:45 a.m. Mass.

FIRST PENANCE/FIRST COMMUNION/CONFIRMATION

Faith Formation in-person and at-home classes prepare 1st and 2nd grade students for First Penance and First Communion, and 7th and 8th grade students for Confirmation. Sacrament preparation is also available for students and adults in the Special Religious Education (SPRED) program at Sacred Heart. PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Having concluded the Advent and Christmas seasons, and now moving into Ordinary Time, within about eight weeks we will begin the holy and penitential season of Lent. Thus we are beginning to see Jesus' Galilean Ministry of preaching, teaching, and miracles. We can look to Matthew chapter 8 as the major part of his ministry and the choosing of 'the 12'. His journey from Galilee to Judea and Perea ultimately leads to Jerusalem where, like the prophets of old, Christ will be crucified and on the third day will rise from the dead. On the night he would be betrayed Christ would celebrate The Last Supper, a meal—Passover Seder meal where at the end Jesus offers bread and wine as His body, blood, soul and divinity.

There are multiple examples of feeding miracles in the gospels, for example, John 2:1-11 wedding at Cana, the feeding of 5000 in Matthew 14, Mark 6, Luke 9, and part of John 6: 1-14. The feeding of 4000 with seven loaves and two fish in Matthew 15: 32-39, Mark 8:1-9. We could discuss post resurrection feedings, however, they are of a slightly different nature. Although baptism is the prime or first sacrament, it is the eucharist that is celebrated most often.

The Church wants to 'feed' its children with the Bread of life. This is why the obligation to attend mass on Sundays and Feast Days binds in conscience morally unless there are exceptions in the law. Certainly if there are serious or grave health issues, whether it makes it impossible to get to church, or if a loved one is dying and you are caring for him or her. We do stream mass once a week for the convenience of our sick and shut ins. However, and this is my main point today in this column, that a streamed mass, perhaps helpful and better than nothing, does not ever replace physically going to church and worshipping God in the body of believers. One person actually said to me that they get more out of a streamed Mass than in coming to Mass itself. You cannot receive Holy Communion unless you attend Mass and a streamed Mass does not fulfill your Sunday Obligation.

GOSPEL MEDITATION

A DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

Second Sunday in Ordinary Time

God delights in you. How do you feel when you hear that? Delight usually comes with an exuberant flow of joy that seemingly arises from one's toes with the expression of great glee. Reflecting upon the deep measure of joy God has in us can be a source of joy for ourselves. Delight is infectious. A very young brother and sister were playing on the beach when the all too familiar ice cream truck made its daily rounds. The boy shook with excitement and delight as he took his sister's hand and exclaimed, "The ice cream man is here, isn't it great!" As they ran off toward the truck, one could hear the girl reply, "Yeah, I can't wait!" The experience of a child's delight in something so simple as ice cream, lifts our spirits from our burdens and transports us to the lighter,

more innocent side of life. Life is not meant to be a burden. Believe it or not. God actually wants us to be happy! In fact, the wedding feast at Cana shows us that God even puts His blessing on our happiness. It is okay to celebrate the wonder of ourselves and others. Life is good. It is always interesting to note that Jesus saves the good wine until last. You would think it would be the other way around. The superb quality of Jesus' wine points to the superior quality of life we find in Christ. It is not a life of burdens but a life of wonder and delight! In Christ, we are lifted from the superficial and mundane to a life of purpose, hope, and love.

God is with us through the long haul, through the challenges and sorrows as well as the successes and accomplishments. In spite of the fact that we often wander from the path, God's celebratory delight in us remains. As spouses are asked to remain faithful to each other through whatever life brings, God remains faithful too. This promise remains through this life and into the next. All we have to do is take the advice of Jesus' mother to heart when she says, "Listen to him." This wisdom saves us from foolishly giving in to the illusion that we can make better wine than Jesus.

STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION ON LECTIONARY READINGS

Second Sunday in Ordinary Time

It Takes All Kinds

"If every flower wanted to be a rose," wrote St. Therese of Lisieux, "spring would lose its loveliness."

Who is God asking you to be today? There is an obvious answer that springs to mind right out of the gate. God wants me to be a good person (a good father, a good husband) today; today, God wants me to be a saint.

But this answer fails to get to the heart of the question. We are all striving today to serve the same Spirit, but we are given different gifts to do so. The one who has the gift of knowledge may fail if today he decides he wants to be a healer. The one who has the gift of "varieties of tongues" might falter in the expression of wisdom.

Think about the wedding at Cana and the players in the scene: the servers, the guests, the bride and groom. They all have a unique role to play, and though it is to the servers that Mary gives the instruction, "Do whatever he tells you," her words apply to all.

Today, are we called to be the servers — do we wait on God's instruction and carry it out, no matter how foolish or impossible it may seem to our human ears? Are we asked to be the disciples, to bear witness to a miracle and to give our testimony? Are we called to imitate the Blessed Mother herself and give encouragement to follow God's word?

Let us examine our gifts and listen in the silence of our hearts to the direction of the Spirit. Then and only then, let us do whatever He tells us.


