

Brothers and sisters:

When Christ came as high priest







from the Pastor





Dear friends in Christ- my eternal thanks for your support and prayers during these past months being there for each other and for our human family in need. As we celebrate the mystery of the Eucharist, let us center on our Lord and Savior in building up the Body of Christ.

"All of today's readings are set in the context of the Passover. The First Reading recalls the old covenant celebrated at Sinai following the first Passover and the Exodus. In sprinkling the blood of the covenant on the Israelites, Moses was symbolizing God's desire in this covenant to make them His family, His "blood" relations. Quoting Moses' words in today's Gospel, Jesus elevates and transforms this covenant symbol to an extraordinary reality. In the new covenant made in the blood of Christ, we truly become one with His body and blood. The first covenant made with Moses and Israel at Sinai was but a shadow of this new and greater covenant made by Christ with all humankind in that upper room (see Hebrews 10:1). The Passover that Jesus celebrates with His Twelve Apostles "actualizes," makes real what could only be symbolized by Moses' sacrifice at the altar with twelve pillars. What Jesus does today is establish His Church as the new Israel and His Eucharist as the new worship of the living God. In offering Himself to God through the Spirit, Jesus delivered Israel from the transgressions of the first covenant. And, as we hear in today's Epistle, by His blood He purified us and made us capable of true worship. God does not want dead works or animal sacrifices. He wants our own flesh and blood, our own lives, consecrated to Him, offered as a living sacrifice. This is the sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving that we sing of in today's Psalm. This is the Eucharist. What we do in memory of Him is to pledge our lives to Him, to renew our promise to live by the words of His covenant and to be His servants. There is no other return we can offer to Him for the eternal inheritance He has won for us. So let us approach the altar, calling upon His name in thanksgiving, taking up the cup of salvation"

Catholic Relief Services works to bring hope to the most vulnerable: CRS' HISTORY IN PAKISTAN

CRS began operating in Pakistan in 1954 and during that time CRS assisted in disaster response and preparedness, education, water/sanitation, and livelihoods help for vulnerable communities. Catholic Relief Services has consistently responded to large-scale disasters in Pakistan. CRS has supported more than 1 million people across the country in relief, response and recovery, building more than 60,000 transitional shelters, distributing more than 80,000 household kits, assisting 129,000 households to restore their agricultural livelihoods with seeds, livestock, and training, and providing 350,000 people with access to clean water and sanitation. Given Pakistan's vulnerability to natural and man-made disasters, CRS has also improved the resilience and preparedness of communities through disaster risk reduction. In southern Sindh, CRS helped people prepare for droughts that periodically affect the region. Meanwhile, the design and development of the water projects in Pakistan depended on the need of the geographic area and population to be served. All water projects were developed with an emphasis on disaster risk reduction and "Do No Harm" principles. Catholic Relief Services has carried out education programming in 3 of the 4 provinces of the country. Literacy rates dip below 30% in many communities, and enrollment and attendance rates are also low. CRS improved access to quality education for both girls and boys by engaging teachers, parents, religious leaders and community leaders to improve the quality of education. Since 2005, CRS has built 114 school structures, trained and mentored nearly 800 teachers, and conducted hygiene training for 6,688 students in rural communities in northern Pakistan. Through these efforts and the engagement of community leaders, CRS has increased enrollment by an average of 40% and improved attendance by 39% in those communities. Near the western Afghanistan border, CRS provided a basic literacy program for both Afghan refugee children and children from the Pakistani host community. As a result of the program, 64% of students continued their education after the year's end. Local Pakistani schools also benefited from training for improved teaching and increased enrollment by 17%.

Why is Death a Dead-End on Sesame Street?

"Street Gang" is a new documentary about the origins of the children's show, Sesame Street. At a critical point in the show's evolution, the doc tells us, one of the actors who played the beloved and elderly Mr. Hooper died. The secular press is shown praising the show as courageous for how it wrote the character out of the show—having various adult characters explain to childlike Big Bird that Mr. Hooper was gone and never coming back—surviving only in our memories.

Scripture tells a different story—particularly the readings for the solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ. What this documentary missed was the golden opportunity this show's producers missed by not helping parents of faith build a bridge for their children between past and present. The liturgy for this holy day does just that, bridging the gap between an old Covenant based on death (Ex 24:3-8) and a new one based on the eternal life made possible by the sacrifice of Jesus.

St. Paul tells the ancient story of humanity's attempts to sacrifice animals in reparation for humanity's faults (Heb 9:11-15).

For if the blood of goats and bulls and the sprinkling of a heifer's ashes can sanctify those who are defiled so that their flesh is cleansed, how much more will the blood of Christ, who through the eternal Spirit offered himself unblemished to God, cleanse our consciences from dead works to worship the living God.

The gospel shows Jesus using our appetites for bodily sustenance to grow our yearning for spiritual sustenance. He used bread and wine—foods closely tied to human culture—to give us a sacrifice that would last throughout the ages (Mk 14:12-16, 22-26).

"Take it; this is my body," he said of the bread. Then he took a cup, gave thanks, and gave it to them, and they all drank from it. He said to them, "This is my blood of the covenant, which will be shed for many. I shall not drink again the fruit of the vine until the day when I drink it new in the kingdom of God."

Sesame Street could have freed parents in its audience who are bound by the laws of mortality and have trouble grasping the promise of eternal life so they can share it with their kids. As Paul once explained to the Romans, "You are not under the law, but under grace."

The grace Christ made possible by his death offers an insight into the timeless power of our soul. So, what if Sesame Street had taken the opportunity of Mr. Hooper's death to give voice to churches of all faith traditions that add so much to a neighborhood's soul? It could have had one of the adult cast members of the show explain to Big Bird something like:

"Let us talk about the gifts the churches up and down our street tell us we are born with—faith, hope and love. Yes, Mr. Hooper died, but many faiths teach that those gifts are the elements forming the bridge that help us pass to a life beyond this one."

"You're crazy," Oscar the Grouch might object. "Nobody can prove that."

But Big Bird could then say, "Well, I don't believe anyone can prove that death is the end, either, Oscar."

The End (Not).


