




How can we stop this temptation against our faith in Jesus? Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI points out an answer: "To believe means first to accept as true what our mind cannot fully comprehend. We have to accept what God reveals to us about himself, about ourselves, about everything around us, including the things that are invisible, inexpressible and beyond our imagination. This act of accepting revealed truth broadens the horizon of our knowledge and draws us to the mystery in which our lives are immersed. Letting our reason be limited in this way is not something easy to do. Here we see the second aspect of faith: it is trust in a person, no ordinary person, but Jesus Christ himself. What we believe is important, but even more important is the One in whom we believe" (Homily at Mass in Krakow-Blonie, Poland, May 28, 2006). Let us also look at the example of the Blessed Virgin Mary's act of faith. When confronted with difficult situations, Mary said to the angel, "Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord. May it done to me according to your word" (Lk 1:38). In the practice of our faith, let us lay aside every weight and sin which clings so closely so that we can run with perseverance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus, our Lord and Savior. How far am I now in the practice of my faith in Jesus?

Adoration Chapel Meditations

"Teacher, do you not care that we are perishing?"

This cry of terror came from the disciples in whose storm-buffeted boat slept their Savior. For 21st century disciples requiring a piece of scripture relevant to their lives, this is it. This gospel is aimed at anyone overwhelmed by fear. The Pandemic has offered us a convenient excuse to be fearful—and therefore to occasionally lose our moral mooring. Pandemic-Age waves have been buffeting families' houseboats, accentuating fears for their future. Meanwhile, church attendance has dwindled steadily—reducing any chance for hearing the word of God with others on the same journey to help allay those fears. Fear has shifted our normal outward connection to others, inward, enabling the selfishness virus to displace Covid's most dangerous effects.

Sunday's readings offer a powerful message of faith, hope and love - Job's inability to see God amidst the storms plaguing him (Jb 38:1, 8-11) caused The Almighty to reveal Himself and say to the angry seas: Thus far shall you come but no farther, and here shall your proud waves be stilled!

Hard to tell if God was addressing nature's renewed strengths or humanity's ancient weaknesses. With Jesus's entry on the scene, God helped us navigate a route beyond our flesh and away from our fear. As Paul tells the Corinthians in Sunday's second reading (2 Cor 5:14-17), our flesh was stripped away with Christ's.

Maybe it would be easier to find our courage by realizing Christ is within us. In "The Spiritual Canticle," John of the Cross put into words the conviction that has given saints the courage to give their lives to God: "You yourself are the home in which he dwells! ... do not go off looking for him elsewhere."

Christ's own storm-buffeted disciples would have benefitted from remembering they and their Master were in the same boat on a common journey before exclaiming the headline of this week's blog—taken from Sunday's gospel reading (Mk 4:35-41). Let's close it with Jesus's response, echoing from within the depths of our 21st Century soul:

"Why are you terrified? Do you not yet have faith?"
