





from the Pastor


Blessings and thanks to all the families and their kids who have been working to clean out the storage facilities in the school, and to Amanda and her team for starting the ministry at St Michael, starting with making sandwiches for our sisters and brothers in need at St Augustine in the Tremont community.

Theologian Dr Scott Hahn's reflection on the fulfillment of the Kingdom is connected to the transformative path that he and his wife Kimberly experienced on their journey as converts to Catholicism. Their son Jeremiah was ordained for the Diocese of Steubenville on May 21st.

Today's liturgy brings together several strands of Old Testament expectation to reveal Jesus as Israel's promised Messiah and king, the Lord who comes to feed His people. Notice the parallels between today's Gospel and First Reading. Both Elisha and Jesus face a crowd of hungry people with only a few "barley" loaves. We hear similar words about how impossible it will be to feed the crowd with so little. And in both the miraculous multiplication of bread satisfies the hungry and leaves food left over. The Elisha story looks back to Moses, the prophet who fed God's people in the wilderness (see Exodus 16). Moses prophesied that God would send a prophet like him (see Deuteronomy 18:15-19). The crowd in today's Gospel, witnessing His miracle, identifies Jesus as that prophet. The Gospel today again shows Jesus to be the Lord, the good shepherd, who makes His people lie down on green grass and spreads a table before them (see Psalm 23:1,5). The miraculous feeding is a sign that God has begun to fulfill His promise, which we sing of in today's Psalm - to give His people food in due season and satisfy their desire (see Psalm 81:17). But Jesus points to the final fulfillment of that promise in the Eucharist. He does the same things He does at the Last Supper - He takes the loaves, pronounces a blessing of thanksgiving (literally, "eucharist"), and gives the bread to the people (see Matthew 26:26). Notice, too, that 12 baskets of bread are left over, one for each of the apostles. These are signs that should point us to the Eucharist - in which the Church founded on the apostles continues to feed us with the living bread of His body. **In this Eucharist, we are made one body with the Lord, as we hear in today's Epistle. Let us resolve again, then, to live lives worthy of such a great calling.**

Then they will answer and say, 'Lord, when did we see you hungry or thirsty or a stranger or naked or ill or in prison, and not minister to your needs?' He will answer them, 'Amen, I say to you, what you did not do for one of these least ones, you did not do for me.'

Mary's Home to open in December; will aid medically fragile women experiencing homelessness.

Work is underway at Mary's Home, which will open in December in downtown Cleveland. It will be a companion to the nearby Joseph's Home. Both facilities are designed to serve the medically fragile who are experiencing homelessness. Joseph's Home, founded in 2000 by the Sisters of Charity of St. Augustine, aids men who meet those criteria. Mary's Home, a similar facility, will serve medically fragile women with the same issues. "Women experiencing homelessness in Cuyahoga County have no place to go to recover from acute health conditions after leaving a hospital," said Beth Graham, executive director of Joseph's Home. "These women desperately need a nurturing, caring place to recuperate - not only from physical illness, but also the additional trauma they face from homelessness." The 10-bed medical respite care facility will be located in downtown Cleveland, in a former school and day care center adjacent to Joseph's Home, Cleveland's only provider of medical respite care for men experiencing homelessness. The CSA Sisters saw an unmet need in the community for a place where medically frail men experiencing homelessness could recuperate after leaving a hospital, so they established Joseph's Home. Since then, it has helped hundreds of men recover from medical issues and obtain a permanent home. Of the residents who left Joseph's Home in 2019, 88% continued to remain medically stable, and 90% continued to live in a stable home one year later. The project is the result of strong community support, with a project goal of \$1.3 million. Among those making visionary gifts were Sisters of Charity Foundation of Cleveland, the Elisabeth Severance Prentiss Foundation, the Corrinne Doderer Foundation and the Sisters of Charity of St. Augustine. In addition to the nearly \$1 million raised so far, a recoverable grant from the Cleveland Foundation is serving as bridge financing to support initial construction and renovation of the facility. Contractor Regency Construction Services and Bialosky Cleveland, the architect, are working on converting the building.

The Sisters of Charity of St. Augustine made an additional significant contribution to the Sister Joan Gallagher Endowment Fund, which will support general operations of Joseph's Home and Mary's Home. Sister Gallagher was one of the "Dream Team" members and served as the first director of Joseph's Home.

Mary's Home, which will be located at 2302 Community College Ave., will include 10 private, furnished suites; kitchen, dining and restroom facilities; multiple meeting spaces for programming, including art and music therapy, and group sessions; isolation suites, given the risk of COVID-19 and other infectious diseases; and a dedicated health care clinic. Overhear Your Own Prayer

A little movie with a limited release tells a story of unlimited faith. *Shepherd: The story of a Jewish Dog*, is about Kaleb, a beloved German shepherd, taken from his Jewish family as they were rounded up, separated from each other and imprisoned in death camps by the Nazis in WWII Germany. The dog, however, is adopted by an SS Officer who trains him to attack and round up people at a work camp. The fact this dog later reunites with his family's little boy and helps him survive was the main miracle of this story. But a small scene in this film featuring a minor character's major miracle is one of the movie's key takeaways for people of all faiths.

In one of the cages imprisoning two men awaiting their certain fate, one of the men prays aloud to God. His cell mate, who long ago lost faith that God hears prayers, says, "Why are you praying, God doesn't hear you!" The man replies, "But I hear me." And so did the cell mate. The message that resonates here is that before we can expect God to hear our prayers, WE must hear them as God hears them in our own heart and from our own mouth.

Jesus understood the power of spoken prayer. It was an important part of his own Jewish traditions. He lived that Godly connection that makes the impossible possible, and made sure others overheard it.

In this Sunday's gospel about the miracle of the loaves and fish (**Jn 6:1-15**), Jesus tests the faith of his own disciples who see the impossibility of feeding the throngs surrounding them with just a few loaves and fish. "Where can we buy enough food for them to eat?" he asks Philip. John writes, "He himself knew what he was going to do."

Answer: the impossible.

"Then Jesus took the loaves, GAVE THANKS, and distributed them to those who were reclining, and also as much of the fish as they wanted."

He gave thanks out loud, like many faithful families do before sharing a meal, so he, his people and his Father could hear. This reminds us of what Jesus says in **Matthew 18:20**: "Where two or three are gathered together in my name, there am I in the midst of them."

In an age where people imprison themselves in solitary confinement, the only hope for release comes when we can hear ourselves ask God for freedom; not to free our bodies, but to give every one of us the key to our soul's jail cell.




