

Glory to you, O Lord.

When the Pharisees with some scribes who had come from Jerusalem gathered around Jesus, they observed that some of his disciples ate their meals with unclean, that is, unwashed, hands.

—For the Pharisees and, in fact, all Jews, do not eat without carefully washing their hands, keeping the tradition of the elders. And on coming from the marketplace they do not eat without purifying themselves. And there are many other things that they have traditionally observed, the purification of cups and jugs and kettles and beds.

from the Pastor

The Pharisees, centered on the details of the practice of their faith, fail to see that the fulfillment of their faith is standing right in their midst. The Pharisees, who came on the scene around the second century BC, sought to live their lives in strict accord with the life-giving, liberating laws which Moses promulgates in today's first reading, taken from the Old Testament book of Deuteronomy. The truth of the matter is the Pharisees were striving really hard to keep their religion pure and unblemished amid the growing secularization caused by Hellenism and the secular world. Yes, they are "blind guides," in some respects were they really that different than many of us today who are striving to keep our faith, our families, our Church's teachings and worship centered on our Risen Lord and his calling us to Discipleship. The Pharisees encountered this son of a carpenter from Nazareth, who is claiming by his words and his deeds to be in breaking the Kingdom of God. This man heals the sick, feeds the multitude, and raises the dead. Some of his followers are claiming that this "rabbi" who eats with sinners, with prostitutes, with tax collectors, is the long-awaited Messiah, God Himself come in the flesh. This man surrounds himself with disciples who, for the most part, are from the lower echelons of society, fisherman and the like. The words that this Jesus speaks are like none they had ever heard. And it probably scared them to death. Would I be a Pharisee, a group which consisted of both clerics and laymen, if I were a Jew of the Lord Jesus' day? In my spiritual life, in my search for holiness, in my following of the rules which the Holy Church does teach, do I put more emphasis on the performance and the following of the tenets of my faith (which are important and are meant to be followed) and lose sight of the Lord Jesus who is standing in my midst, demanding my full and undivided attention?

This week, perhaps we might want to recognize the Pharisee who might live in you and me and catch ourselves, knowing that we need to be wise and follow the law of our faith, but at the same time not lose sight of the All-Beautiful One, Christ our Lord, who beckons us forward to follow him in spirit and in truth. Don't Just SAY Grace. Show It.

One of the unmentioned casualties of the Covid Pandemic has been civility. Managers of casual dine-in restaurants strapped by staffing challenges can testify to that. They've seen impatient customers throw fits when they have to wait long periods either for a table or for their dinner. Such immaturity inspired the manager of one diner to post a sign on her door: "If you can't be kind, find another place to dine."

So, consider this review question: when eating out, how often do we follow Jesus's example and thank God for the food in a moment of prayer? For that matter, how often do we take a moment to thank the server who puts it in front of us? As Christians, we are taught to believe that our gratitude in both situations has a common destination.

This Sunday's Gospel (Mk 7:1-8, 14-15, 21-23) gives us the opportunity to see ourselves as Jesus saw the judgmental consumers of his day—the Pharisees. Imagine Jesus and his disciples sitting down for a bite to eat at a local diner. Observing them from a distance is a gathering of Pharisees taking great offense—not at any lack of Godly gratitude for the food, but for the absence of phony human ritual.

"Why do your disciples not follow the tradition of the elders but instead eat a meal with unclean hands?," the critics ask. Jesus responds:

"Well did Isaiah prophesy about you hypocrites; ... Hear me, all of you, and understand. Nothing that enters one from outside can defile that person; but the things that come out from within are what defile."

The next time you eat out, take a good look at the person who greets you, the one who seats you, the one who serves you and the one who readies other tables for more customers. They are doing so not only for the customers you see, but to support their own families whom you don't see. Let's remember to be kind when we dine.



2021-2022 Program Overview

PSR is moving to **Tuesday nights going forward.**

This year's program will be a three part hybrid – 1 in-person class, 1 virtual session and 2 home studies each month. Classes will begin the first week of October and run through the end of April. Classes will take place in the St. Francis Center. In-person class time will be from 6:15pm-7:30pm. Virtual class times are 6:30pm-7:30pm.

The program fee for each student will be \$45 for the entire year, which includes the cost of the book.

Schedules, syllabuses and additional PSR materials will be available on each grade webpage like last year. Those links will be sent out by grade as soon as they become active again.

You do not have to re-register for PSR unless you are registering a new student. The registration form is available on the Parish website in the PSR section under the ABOUT US tab.

The rotation schedule can be found on the website as well.

There will be Open House nights the last week of September. Monday 9/27 thru Thursday 9/30 from 6:30-7:30pm in the St. Francis Center. Families will have an opportunity to pay tuition fees, pick up books, and fill out the necessary forms for this year.


