


A Reading from the Book of the Prophet Jeremiah

Gospel - Luke 4:21-30

The Lord be with you. And with your Spirit.

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke.

Glory to you, O Lord.

Jesus began speaking in the synagogue, saying: "Today this Scripture passage is fulfilled in your hearing."

And all spoke highly of him and were amazed at the gracious words that came from his mouth. They also asked, "Isn't this the son of Joseph?"

He said to them, "Surely you will quote me this proverb, 'Physician, cure yourself,' and say,

'Do here in your native place the things that we heard were done in Capernaum."

And he said, "Amen, I say to you, no prophet is accepted in his own native place. Indeed, I tell you, there were many widows in Israel in the days of Elijah when the sky was closed for three and a half years and a severe famine spread over the entire land. 





Please God—Humor Us.

Prophets and the best comedians have something in common: they're fearless truth-tellers. They're also their own most honest critics. While on life's stage, for them, failure to win over an audience can result in literal or figurative death ("I died out there," a comedian might say).

Jesus deals with one of those hostile audiences and faces literal death in this Sunday's gospel reading (<u>Lk 4:21-30</u>). In fact, when his teaching about how God chooses his chosen people lands with a thud, Jesus responds:

"No prophet is accepted in his own native place."
Sounds like the tagline comedian Rodney Dangerfield made famous: "No respect; no respect at all."
Jesus' audience that day tried to prove it.

They rose up, drove him out of the town, and led him to the brow of the hill

on which their town had been built, to hurl him down headlong. But Jesus passed through the midst of them and went away.

This showcases the courage God's truth-tellers require. In Sunday's second reading (<u>1 Cor 12:31—13:13</u>), Paul uses the hyperbole of a comic to tell the Corinthians a truth that history will never let us forget:

If I speak in human and angelic tongues, but do not have love, I am a resounding gong or a clashing cymbal. And if I have the gift of prophecy,

and comprehend all mysteries and all knowledge; if I have all faith so as to move mountains, but do not have love, I am nothing.

Here, Paul demonstrates a skill professional truth-tellers learn: balancing between the comfort in knowing God is with them and the humility of realizing that gift is not for them alone. The prophet Jeremiah gives voice to that lesson in Sunday's first reading (Jer 1:4-5, 17-19):

Before I formed you in the womb I knew you, before you were born I dedicated you, a prophet to the nations I appointed you.

Let's conclude with the "Prayer for Good Humor," in which St. Thomas More, one of Catholicism's greatest and most courageous humorists, shares with us why he and his fellow truth-tellers deserve our undying respect:

"Grant me a simple soul that knows to treasure all that is good and that doesn't frighten easily at the sight of evil, but rather finds the means to put things back in their place. Give me a soul that knows not boredom, grumblings, sighs and laments, nor excess of stress, because of that obstructing thing called 'I.' Grant me, O Lord, a sense of good humor. Allow me the grace to be able to take a joke, to discover in life a bit of joy, and to be able to share it with others."



Then they will answer and say, 'Lord, when did we see you hungry or thirsty or a stranger or naked or ill or in prison, and not minister to your needs?' He will answer them, 'Amen, I say to you, what you did not do for one of these least ones, you did not do for me.'

WASHINGTON, D.C., Jan. 11, 2022 – Catholic Relief Services (CRS) is one of nine global humanitarian organizations joining Pearl Jam and other celebrities to urge the White House to address Afghanistan's worsening humanitarian crisis, which cannot be solved by aid alone.

"Having recently come back from Afghanistan, I can attest to the growing needs we're seeing across the country. If we act now, we can prevent untold suffering," said Sean Callahan, CRS' president and CEO.

The campaign is pushing for the U.S. and global leaders to address the economic drivers of the hunger crisis by facilitating banking access for Afghans and in finding new ways to support the country's critical services like hospitals, schools, and utilities.

The nine global charities include: Alliance for Peacebuilding, CARE USA, Catholic Relief Services, International Rescue Committee, InterAction, Norwegian Refugee Council USA, Save the Children USA, War Child USA and World Vision U.S.

As detailed in a joint statement issued by the nine humanitarian organizations, more than half the country's population of 38 million people are facing acute food insecurity, including 9 million who are on the brink of famine. According to the United Nations, if no action is taken, more than 100,000 children could die of starvation. While prices skyrocket, Afghan families cannot access cash to pay for food, medicine or other items.

As part of the campaign, CRS welcomes Catholics and others of goodwill to join forces and advocate for Afghanistan by sending a letter to the White House via the CRS website.

Catholic Relief Services is the official international humanitarian agency of the Catholic community in the United States. The agency alleviates suffering and provides assistance to people in need in more than 100 countries, without regard to race, religion or nationality. CRS' relief and development work is accomplished through programs of emergency response, HIV, health, agriculture, education, microfinance and peacebuilding.

Holy Land Gifts

After all Masses on February 12th & 13th, There will be a display of handmade articles for sale such as nativity scenes, crucifixes, rosaries, and many other beautiful religious items.

Because of conflict in the region, many Christian families in Bethlehem are struggling to make ends meet.

When you purchase one of these beautiful gifts, you are helping artisans in the Holy Land provide for their families who live and work with dignity in the region fraught with tension.






