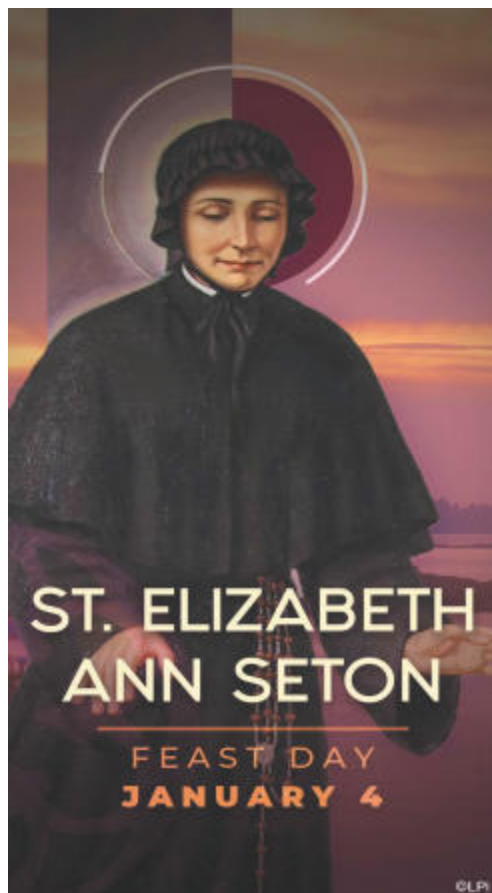

This is a fun way to blend faith and fellowship for the benefit of others.

A WORD FROM HAITI....

In August, a massive earthquake in Haiti's Grand Sud region (southern peninsula) resulted in at least 1,000 deaths and multiple thousands of damaged or destroyed houses and public buildings. Rich in Mercy, in collaboration with Spiritan priest, Fr. Patrick Eugene, CSSp and a network of reliable priest and personal contacts in the region, made available emergency relief in the form of food, water, hygiene supplies, and temporary shelters to more than 150 families in six rural villages that lacked access to other forms of immediate assistance. The distributed supplies included rice and beans, spaghetti, dried herring, sardines, cooking oil, sugar, and soap.

Financial support for the emergency relief came from generous donors to Rich in Mercy. Rich in Mercy will partner with additional funders to assist in the reconstruction phase of earthquake recovery and is currently preparing a strategy that targets highly vulnerable widows and single mothers who are among the least able to access other forms of aid. A similar strategy was employed after Hurricane Matthew ravaged the same southern region in 2016. Happily, all of the houses that were repaired or rebuilt in 2016 with funding from Rich in Mercy remained intact during the August earthquake. The same disaster-resistant house model will be employed in the reconstruction of earthquake-damaged houses.

Our monthly collection for our sisters and brothers in Haiti will be taken at MSP after all Masses next weekend.

Epiphany

In the church year, the feast of Epiphany, which means *manifestation*, is the climax of the twelve days of Christmas, with readings focused on God's gift of light to the entire world.

When we listen to Matthew's story, what strikes us is that the light appeared, but it was up to the Magi to interpret the sign and move toward it. Signs of the presence of God appear in many disguises. Some people dream; some have visions. Some are able to look at the wonders of creation and know that God is with them. The Magi consulted the sky, the thing they knew best, to learn of wondrous events. They did not have to find some esoteric object, nor did they have to learn an entirely new craft. The birth of Jesus was made manifest in what they already knew.

The second thing that strikes us is that their journey did not end at the manger, but at the place where they began. The encounter with God does not end with the travelers laying gifts before the newborn king. Rather, it manifests itself in the change that comes afterward. The Magi returned home by a different way. They had been warned not to go back to Herod, but these different roads also stand for the change that occurs when we encounter the divine.

We cannot go back the way we came because we are now different people. We do not see the world in the same way; we do not see ourselves the same way. Like the Magi, when we lay our gifts at the feet of God, we come away infinitely richer. We change direction.



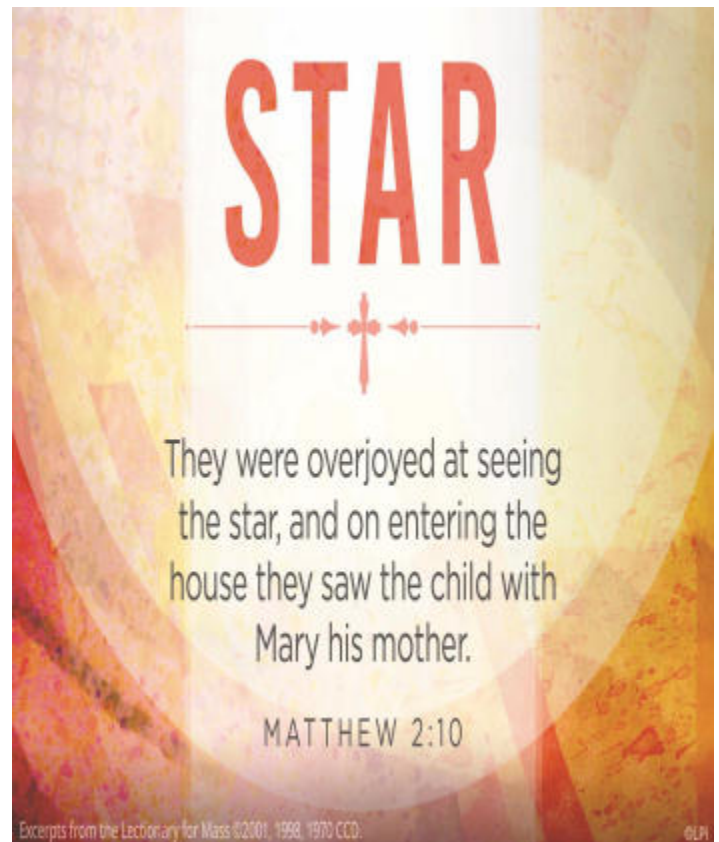
Into the House

Notice how the Magi found Jesus “on entering the house.” The door to your house is the door to where God lives!

You can bless your house - and all who enter it this new year - by inscribing a prayer above your front door. With a piece of chalk or a lump of coal, inscribe this above the doors to your home:

20 + C + M + B + 22

Legend has it that the letters stand for the names of the Magi - Caspar, Melchior and Balthasar. Blessing your doorways in January is appropriate. The Latin word *janus* means portal or doorway, and January is the doorway to the coming year of faith.

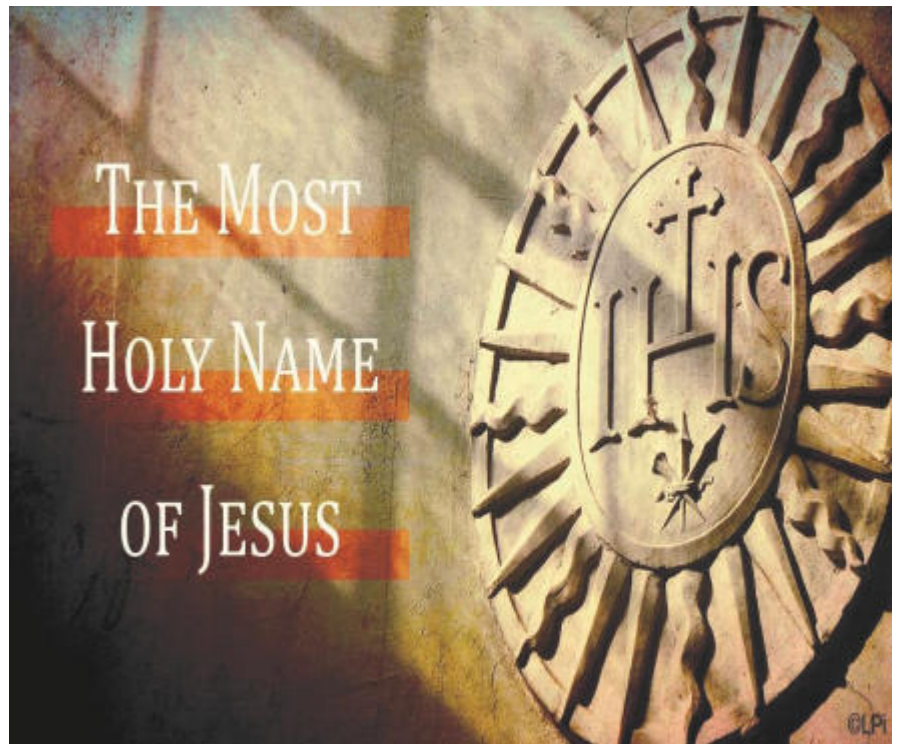
