

Saints for this Week

July 11 – St Benedict – brother of St Scholastica, was born in Italy in 480. His family was wwealthy, and he was educated in Rome.Benedict is bent known for establishing a monastic community. His 'Rule of Benedict is still followed by those of the Benedictine Communities – our local Vincent in Latrobe being one of many communities.

July 14 – St Kateri Tekakwitha – known as the "Lily of the Mohawks" and the "Geneiveve of New France," she was born in the Mohawk fortress of Ossemenon in what is now New York State – the daughter of a Mohawk warrior and a Catholic Algonguin woman whom he had saved from captivity at the hands of the Iroqouis. When about 4 yrs of age her parents contracted smallpox and died, she then was adopted by her uncle. She received some knowledge of Christianity from Jesuit missionaries when she was 11, and was determined to live the life of a Christian virgin. She died at the age of 24.

July 15 – St Bonaventure – was born near Viterbo, Italy in 1218. He became a Franciscan and studied at the University of Paris. He is best known for some of his great writings. A constant joy seemed to fill genuine follower of St Francis.

Sept 16 – Our Lady of Mt Carmel – The prophet Elijah ascended Mt Carmel to pray for the heavens to open when the country around him was dry and without water. Finally, he saw a small cloud coming in from the sea bearing life-giving rain. In the 12th century, Christian hermits came to live and pray on this mountain. In their vision, the cloud was a symbol of Mary, the Mother of God, who brought life to a parched world. They honored her under the title of Our lady of Mount Carmel and later founded an order devoted to prayer under her patronage.

WORSHIP TOGETHER

15th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Today's Scripture readings present us with a challenge: to live out our Christian lives whole-heartedly, to love God with everything that is in us, and to put aside our own comfort and ease in the continuous of our paid here.

the service of our neighbor – especially at the moment we see someone in need.

In the selection from Deuteronomy Moses has been going over a lot with the people – reminding them of past favors given to them by God; the Covenant that binds them to God and with one another; a warning against idolatry – reminding them that there is only one true God, and the punishment they would receive for practicing idolatry. Now we reach the point where Moses presents them and us with this deep challenge as he tells his fellow Israelites to return to God with all their heart and all their soul, listening to God and obeying God's commands. In the Gospel, the scholar seems to understand this demand when he tells Jesus that the way to eternal life is by that love of God with one's whole and undivided being.

This is a tall order, and it calls on you and me to examine our conscience. It asks us to think about all that we do each day, and ask ourselves whether or not we are indeed loving God and neighbor absolutely and completely. We might even consider how we express that love in the midst of our busy lives, when we have kids to take care of, jobs that call on much of our attention

each day, and responsibilities to our friends and our community.

We learn from scripture that the Samaritans and the Jews were enemies. So when a Jewish person is lying and dying on the road (a rather infamous road noted for robberies and murders), it's important to the story that while three Jewish religious leaders pass by without helping, the Samaritan man is the one who goes well out of his way to help., to the point of putting his own life in danger. This is the clear message that we are all familiar with. We should be willing to help anyone – regardless who they are.

But notice that the story begins with a question about the Jewish law. These laws were vast in number, strict, and incredibly important to the culture in Jesus' community. The people were even carefully scrutinized by the leaders to make sure these laws were scrupulously kept. But this brings us to another point — a point that Jesus makes in the story. Do we obey and keep the laws for the sake of keeping them. Or do we keep the laws as a way to show us how we are to reach out and

care for one another.

For Example: let's say that we're going down a road at 2:00 in the morning to a hospital with a sick friend or relative. We encounter a Red Traffic Lite. We all know what we are to do. But - there's no traffic around. Do we wait til it turns green, or do we stop, look and listen, and if there

is no oncoming traffic we proceed? I think we all know what we would do.

You see — The 3 Jewish leaders were adhering to law as it was written. They avoided the injured, and possibly dying individual. There was blood because of the fight. They may have been on their way to fulfill their priestly duties and did not want to become "Ritually" contaminated, which would prevent them from fulfilling their responsibilities. They didn't understand the WHY behind the laws. The Samaritan did. He understood that laws are meant to help us be more loving and caring people, and that at times it is OK to break one of the individual laws in order to more fully accomplish the end goal - of loving our neighbors.

In the end, the question is not - Who is my neighbor? Instead the question that we ask of ourselves is - am I a loving neighbor to those around me? Will I take the time out of my busy sched-

ule to help those needing help?
