A Homebase for Your Lenten Spiritual Spring Training

The Living Stewardship matrix highlights six aspects of daily life in which we can find opportunities to strengthen our relationship with God and God's creation. The first category in Living Stewardship (column one) is Home. Home is where our family lives—whether it is a family of one living alone or an extended family of parents, children, grandchildren, grandparents or special guests living together. Gospel Reading


Jesus confronts and defeats the devil before he begins his public ministry. As we begin the season of Lent, in what ways do you think the devil is present in your life?

CARE FOR CREATION

"Care for Creation" Corner

Finding where to recycle items that do not go into the recycling bin can be very complicated and time consuming. Luckily here in Cincinnati we have a one-stop drop-off location for hard to recycle items near the center of the city. **The Cincinnati Recycling and Reuse Hub** is a non-profit organization which allows the general public to recycle a large amount of items in one place. The Hub is located at 911 Evans Street (off Gest Street) in Cincinnati (45204). It is open on Thursdays from 12 noon to 6:00pm and Saturdays from 10:00am-2:00pm. Their contact **phone number** is 513.629.9040 and email address is <u>cincinnatirecyclingandreusehub@gmail.com</u>. You can also find and "Like" it on Facebook. More importantly is their **website**, <u>http://cincinnatirecyclingandreusehub.org</u>, where information about all the items the Hub takes can be found. If you are looking to recycle items that are not permitted in traditional recycling bins or offer items for reuse, the Hub is your #1 resource.

March tips - Plastics that do not go in your recycle bin

Basic: Look for the numbers in the triangles on all rigid plastics. Save and take the #2, #3, #4, #5, #6, #7, and no-number plastics to the Cincinnati Recycling and Reuse Hub. (#1 rigid plastics are NOT recyclable in Cincinnati at this time. If you have a resource for these, let us know.)

Intermediate: The Hub also accepts the following unusual plastic items: used gift cards, plastic bread bag closure tabs, plastic pizza "tables", plastic tape dispensers, plastic utensils, unattached plastic lids and plastic bottle caps, plastic hangers, and plastic straws. Save and take them to the Hub when you go.

Advanced: Volunteer at the Cincinnati Recycling and Reuse Hub. A helping hand is always needed. Children under 16 are welcome with adult supervision. It's also a great place for your teen to pick up service hours or a scout troop to visit. Contact the Hub for scheduling.


