

Our second category in the Living Stewardship matrix (column two) is Car. Whether we are the driver or a passenger, being in a car requires an almost single-minded focus on safety. Wearing a safety belt, putting little ones in an approved car seat, obeying traffic laws and avoiding distractions are top priorities. Good stewards seize the opportunity to give God praise through prayer, thoughts, and actions while in the car. First Reading



Gospel Reading


Peter, John, and James witness the transfiguration that revealed Jesus' divinity. Why do you think the three apostles "fell silent" from this encounter?

Throughout the history of the Catholic Church, in her most troubled and turbulent times, God has raised up great saints as beacons of hope in the midst of darkness. Among these great saints, the four women Doctors of the Church stand out as models of courage, wisdom, and trust. "Trust shows the



way," wrote Saint Hildegard of Bingen. These words set the courageous standard by which she, Teresa of Ávila, Catherine of Siena, and Thérèse of Lisieux lived. In Women of Hope, Terry Polakovic introduces these amazing women and describes the troubled times in which they lived and persevered. These women remind us that God can work through anyone to bring about his purpose. They prove to us that, as Christians, we can live in confident hope, no matter the circumstances in which we find ourselves. This parish's time-tested line to God

Most people would consider a link of communication that stretches over a half-century remarkable and, almost certainly, extraordinary. When that chain is a solid and precious one with our Father, it's also a wonderful blessing.

In the early '70s, when several dozen Saint Clare parishioners started a prayer group, one of its many benefits was the start of a prayer-support network. What began as a kind of telephone chain that alerted other prayer-group members to requests for prayer support, has not only continued uninterrupted over all these years, but has supplied faith-based support to countless people who have asked for the promised effects of "where two or three are gathered together in my name."

For many years, Margie and George Kaminsky oversaw what eventually grew into the Saint Clare Prayer Line. People would call their home with requests for spiritual support. If someone was home, the caller made the request in person. If no one was home, the caller left a voice message. In either case, this dedicated couple would get the word out to the network quickly.

When they no longer were able to staff this, there was a possibility that this decades-long resource could end. But thanks to the resourcefulness and technical knowledge of our liturgy and music director, Darin Art, that did not happen. He located and installed software that allows people to email a message to the prayer line or call the parish office and leave a voice message that transfers to a verbatim email that is sent to the prayer line custodian. Like a cyber-age George and Margie, that person makes sure the nearly 50 people who have asked to be part of the support group receive a same-day Flocknote email. Since these changes were put into place in July 2020, more than 350 requests have come into the prayer line as requests for support, updates or as messages of thanksgiving for blessings received through combined prayer.

We pray as a body for these requests and know that God lovingly listens.
