

Engaged couples must make an appointment with the pastor at least six months in advance of the wedding date. Please contact the parish office.

#### **Anointing of the Sick**

Any parishioner who is seriously ill and would like to receive the Anointing of the Sick should contact the parish office.

#### Holy Eucharist for the Sick & Homebound

Drop them in the basket in back of church. We will burn them and use the ashes for our Ash Wednesday service next year.



# THIRD WEEK OF LENT

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## Let Us Do the Work of the Lord

The third category (column three) on our Living Stewardship matrix is Work. Whether we work in an office, a factory, retail store, healthcare facility, school, home or other setting, there are many opportunities to offer our work as a wordless prayer to God, to think of others ahead of self, and to act in a loving and accepting manner toward our colleagues, clientele, and supervisors.

The traditional observances of Lent urge us to recalibrate and rebalance our lives. We are encouraged to fast, for example, because it teaches us to be hungry for the Lord, both physically and spiritually. Similarly, we can fast from the "appetites" that may lead to excesses on the job. Is the profit motive leading us to be greedy? Does our focus on personal advancement prompt us to manipulate or cheat others? Are we slackers or workaholics? How would you like most to improve in creating a God-centered focus while at your work? Resolve to pray about it daily. Commit to keeping your mental focus on humble service to those you work with and work for. Stick to doing one little thing each day to counter that which draws us away from Godly behavior at work. With Living Stewardship as a framework, write down specific prayers, thoughts and actions to ensure all of your work is the Work of the Lord.




# A Message from Archbishop Dennis M. Schnurr

# **Praying and Advocating for Peace in Ukraine**



- ◆ <u>Wear the blue and yellow ribbon</u> you received this week each time you come to church as a visible reminder that, as parish, we support Ukraine and peace in Eastern Europe. And wear it often as a reminder that what is happening in Ukraine impacts the entire world and as reminder to ourselves and others to pray constantly for the end of the conflict.
- Sign a petition to Senators Brown and Portman stating that "We are concerned about the Russian attack on Ukraine and ask that you continue to advocate for US support for Ukraine on our behalf". These will be available at the church doors the next three weekends
- ◆ On <u>Tuesday evening</u>, <u>March 29</u>, the St. Clare Peace and Justice Commission invites everyone to <u>join together in praying the rosary</u> for peace in Ukraine. We will meet in church at 7:00pm. Even if you can't be present, you can join us in praying the rosary wherever you are. The children of Fatima were asked by the Blessed Mother 105 years ago to pray the rosary for peace to bring an end to World War I. We follow that example by praying the rosary for peace in Ukraine. Joining together our prayers are multiplied. If 50 people join us in praying the rosary on Thursday, that will be 2,500 Hail Marys for peace! To join us in spirit, <u>fill out the slip below and put it in the box marked "Rosary for Peace"</u> found at the front church doors. Thank you for your prayers for our sisters and brothers devastated by this war in Ukraine.
