


Sunday Morning Summer Sampler: Refreshing the Soul

"Care for Creation" Corner

Take a look into your kitchen trash can and what do you see?

Plastics bags and packaging for the most part. Here's how to recycle them to lower your trash volume.

May tips — Plastic bags and packaging

Basic: Take plastic retail bags back to the retail store. Collection cans are located at most Kroger, Meijer, Whole Foods, Target, JCPenney, and Lowe's. PLUS you can also return the following to these cans: other retail bags, bread bags, produce bags, newspaper bags, dry cleaning bags, ice bags, Ziploc bags (cut off zippers), cereal liners, case overwrap, cup wraps, paper product overwraps, film, flat air pillows, bubble wrap, and plastic shipping envelopes (cut off paper labels).

Intermediate: You can take all other flexible packaging to Cincinnati Recycling and Reuse Hub, at the back of 911 Evans Street. They accept clean - frozen food bags, #5 bags, salad/fruit bags, chip/snack bags, candy/cookie wrappers, and clean trash bags. They also accept mesh produce netting. The Hub is open Thursdays from 12pm to 6pm and Saturdays from 10am to 2pm.

Advanced: Separate out all Kroger brand flexible packaging (Simple Truth, Kroger, and Private Selection) when taking packaging to the Cincinnati Recycling and Reuse Hub. The Hub ships these to Terra Cycling and they get a little money back for them. They also receive money from the following brands, so separate them out for return as well: Babybel, Ballpark, Barilla, Brita, Brownberry, Burt's Bees, Dunkin' Coffee, Entenmann's, Gatorade, Gerber, Gillette, GoGo, Ocean Spray, Rubbermaid, Swiffer, Taki Snacks, and Thomas'. Just give this "special" packaging to one of the attendants when you arrive at the Hub.
