


### Prayer Before Mass

# FROM THE DESK OF OUR PASTOR

## LABOR DAY, MORE THAN JUST A DAY OF REST FROM OUR LABOR!

When I think of Labor Day, I think of the end of the summer season and returning to school. For many, Labor Day weekend marks a transition from the hectic pace of the summer to the new hectic pace of the school year. This secular holiday allows us one last long weekend to rest from the work of our jobs and enjoy the beautiful September days.

As we enjoy the benefits of this holiday, we must ask ourselves what this secular celebration teaches us about the dignity of all human work? This is a timely question to ask when employers are making desperate requests for more workers in order to keep their business in operation. Thus, Labor Day is more than just an opportunity to enjoy a long weekend-it is a time to reflect on the importance of human labor. I want to share with you an excerpt written by Saint John Paul II on human work. As you read this, please keep in mind that his use of "man" is used inclusively to include men and women.

In the introductory paragraph in *Laborem Exercens* (1981), he wrote: "(W)ork means any activity by man, whether manual or intellectual, whatever its nature or circumstances; it means any human activity that can and must be recognized as work, in the midst of all the many activities of which man is capable and to which he is predisposed by his very nature, by virtue of humanity itself. Man is made to be in the visible universe an image and likeness of God himself, and he is placed in it in order to subdue the earth."

"From the beginning, therefore, he is called to work. Work is one of the characteristics that distinguishes man from the rest of creatures, whose activity for sustaining their lives cannot be called work. Only man is capable of work, and only man works, at the same time by work occupying his existence on earth. Thus, work bears a particular mark of man and of humanity, the mark of a person operating within a community of persons. And this mark decides its interior characteristics; in a sense it constitutes its very nature."

Saint John Paul II reminds us that the worker is more than just an "instrument" or "object" used to produce a product, but is a reflection of God's blessings bestowed upon the human person. The Catholic Catechism instructs us: "Human work proceeds directly from persons created in the image of God and called to prolong the work of creation by subduing the earth, both with and for one another." Although our work may be tedious and lead to complaining, the work that we do is a gift that allows for human development, the opportunity to serve others, and opens our eyes to our humanity and the humanity of others.

As good as work may be, there is a risk of being overfocused on the results of our labor. The late Pope offers a word of caution, reminding us that we can easily fall into the seductive trap of desiring even more work, to the point that we need to be rescued "from the logic of profit, from the lack of solidarity, from the fever of earning evermore, from the desire to accumulate and consume." In the moments we experience these temptations, we must focus on the words of the Divine Master, "For what does it profit a man if he gains the whole world and loses or forfeits himself" (Mk 8:36)?

On this day that we celebrate work, let us remember the unique talents and gifts we have each received. Let us all ponder how we use these gifts in Christian service as a response to our discipleship given at baptism. Ultimately, how does my work give glory to God through service to others? On this Labor Day, let us be reminded of how our work honors God, who created us in His image and likeness. Let us also pray for those who desire to work but are not able. Finally, let us pray for those who endure hardship due to their work; may they unite their work in union with Jesus, who suffered greatly for our salvation. May the Holy Spirit renew our minds and the work that we do.

Yes, Labor Day might be a day from rest, so as you rest today, let me say "thank you" for all that you do, and may this day be an invitation to ponder deeper how your work sanctifies and changes the world that we live in, a world that God created and still loves. Blessings to you on this Labor Day!
