## Saint of the Week

St. John Paul II was born Karol Wojtyla in the small Polish town of Wadowice. During World War II, when the Nazis invaded Poland, Karol secretly studied for the priesthood in an underground seminary. He was ordained to the priesthood in 1946, appointed Archbishop of Krakow in 1964, and three years later he was made a cardinal. In 1978, he was elected the 264th pope, where he took the name John Paul II.

St. John Paul II made evangelization a key part of his papacy and made pastoral visits to all parts of the world. In 1981, he was shot twice in an assassination attempt. Following Jesus' example of compassion, he later met with his would-be assassin in his prison cell, where he forgave him for what he had done.

St. John Paul II was well-known to be an active sportsman throughout his life, hiking and skiing well into his 60s. In 1992, his health began to decline, and it was later discovered that he suffered from Parkinson's disease, a degenerative disorder of the central nervous system.

Near the end of his papacy, it became difficult for him to speak, and his poor health and physical suffering made public appearances difficult. Still, he continued his pastoral work. He died April 2, 2005, and he was declared blessed on May 1, 2011. He became a saint on April 27, 2014.





On Tuesday, **November 2**, the Church remembers those who have died and gone before us. In preparation for All Souls Day, I would like to invite you to bring a picture of your deceased loved ones to the church to be displayed throughout the month of November. This will remind us of our need to continue to pray for the dead. Please make sure your picture is in a frame. Pictures will be collected before **October 31**. Please place your

picture on the table in the back of the church. This will allow our staff to arrange them in preparation for Mass on **November 2**. In preparation for celebrating All Saints Day and All Souls Day, some commonly asked questions often arise in our faith. I hope you find these informative.

**What are the four last things of man?** Every human being experiences the four last things: death, judgment, Heaven, or Hell. When we die, we immediately undergo our particular judgment (Heb 9:27). At this moment, the destiny of the person is revealed by God. Those souls in a state of grace and without any sin are immediately rewarded with the eternal gift of life in Heaven. Those in Heaven are called Saints, which is the goal for each of us – we all should strive to be saints! We celebrate all those in Heaven on the Feast of All Saints Day, November 1st. The Church often refers to those in Heaven as the Church Triumphant.

**What about Purgatory?** Purgatory is the state of those who die in God's friendship, assured of their eternal salvation, but who still need purification to enter the happiness of heaven. Think of it this way. In order to be in the presence of God himself, we must be purged, or completely purged of all stain created from sin. Those in purgatory we refer to as the Church Penitent (CCC 1030-1031).

**How can we help the souls being purified in Purgatory?** Because of the communion of saints, the faithful who are still pilgrims on earth are able to help the souls in Purgatory by offering prayers in suffrage for them, especially the Eucharistic sacrifice. This is why it is important to have a Mass offered for your deceased family and friends. You can do this by calling the Parish Office. We also can help them by almsgiving, indulgences, and works of penance (CCC 1032).

**Is Hell real, and are people there?** Although we cannot say for certain that there are people in Hell, for this judgment depends upon God alone, we can for sure say that the state of Hell does exist (Matthew 25:41). Hell consists in the eternal damnation of those who die in mortal sin through their own free choice. The principal suffering of Hell is eternal separation from God in whom alone we can have the life and happiness for which we are created and for which we long (CCC 1033-1035).

October is the month of the rosary! Praying the rosary is a beautiful Catholic devotion. This month, would be a great way to start incorporating praying the rosary into your family's daily or weekly routine. Don't be afraid to start it even if you have very young children. You can make praying the rosary with young children meaningful and appealing. Below you will find a few suggestions on how to begin this devotion with your family and the words to some of the prayers specific to the rosary.

## Tips on Praying the Rosary

1. Start by teaching your children the prayers of the rosary
2. Have a variety of rosary for them to choose from
3. Set up a prayer space in your home
4. Begin with one decade of the rosary and build up to a full rosary

## MONTH OF THE ROSARY

- 1 Make the Sign of the Cross & recite the Apostles' Creed.
- 2 Recite the Our Father.
- 3 Recite three Hail Marys.
- 4 Recite the Glory Be.
- 5 Announce the first mystery and recite the Our Father.
- 6 Recite ten Hail Marys.
- 7 Recite the Glory Be and the Fatima Prayer.
- 8 Announce the second mystery. Recite the Our Father and repeat the steps through the rosary.
- 9 After completing the mysteries, recite the Hail Holy Queen & end with the Sign of the Cross.
