


Prayer Before Mass

The National Catholic Youth Conference is an exciting, biennial three-day experience of prayer, community, and empowerment for Catholic teenagers and their adult chaperones. The schedule includes keynote addresses and workshop sessions addressing a wide variety of topics. In addition, Monsignor James Gaston will celebrate Masses next weekend at Saint James. Monsignor Gaston and I worked together during my time as parochial vicar at Mother of Sorrows Parish in Murrysville. Monsignor is a retired pastor of our diocese and currently serves as the Director of Clergy Formation. Please extend a welcome to Monsignor Gaston.

I want to call your attention to the return of the Holy Water found in the fountains at the church entrance. Last week the diocese announced several changes that will take place with the liturgy as we begin to return to the standard practices of our liturgy and sacramental life. DIOCESE OF GREENSBURG LITURGICAL POLICIES AND PRACTICES UPDATED COVID RESTRICTIONS

The Diocese of Greensburg Committee for Recommending In-Person Worship met to discuss the COVID-19 mitigation efforts and has updated the following policies that become effective on **November 3, 2021**.

- ◆ It is strongly encouraged that face coverings be worn by everyone while in church.
- ◆ No restrictions on Seating Capacity.
- ◆ It is not necessary to block pews such as to maintain six foot distancing.
- ◆ Cleaning/Sanitizing required regularly.
- ◆ High-contact surfaces should be sanitized at least weekly.
- ◆ Doors should be kept open to reduce contact points.
- ◆ Hand Sanitizer should be available at church entrance.
- ◆ Holy Water Fonts may once again be utilized.
- ◆ These fonts should be sanitized at least weekly.
- ◆ Reusable Hymnals are permitted.
- ◆ Collection Baskets may be passed through the Assembly.
- ◆ Receptacles for Offertory Envelopes may continue to be utilized.
- ◆ The Procession of Gifts may be restored.
- ◆ The Sign of Peace is exchanged in a non-physical fashion.
- ◆ After receiving Holy Communion, Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion are to wear face coverings.
- ◆ Choirs and Scholas are permitted.

CATHOLICISM 101


In the light of the lifted COVID restrictions, we would like to review why we follow certain practices in our Catholic faith. This week we will highlight the use of Holy Water:

Question:

What is holy water and how do I completely understand the reason that it is used?

Answer:

Holy water is a sacramental, a reminder of the life of the Church expressed and celebrated through the sacraments. God's grace is mediated through word and gesture (the outward signs). This comes to us through Jesus (instituted by Christ) as he entrusts to the Church his saving mission (to give grace). In turn the Church, through the sacraments, shares that grace and mission with us.



On Ash Wednesday, we receive ashes on our foreheads to remind us of our origins, humbly created from the dust. But by blessing ourselves with holy water, we are reminded of our destiny! We are baptized sons and daughters of God. This is also a call to conversion, to live more fully our baptismal call to live as disciples of Jesus. We see holy water whenever we renew our baptismal promises. This will occur during the Easter liturgy as well, reminding us that we are indeed on a journey of faith and renewed in Christ. Blessing ourselves with holy water reminds us that we are baptized into a community faith, and always in need of turning from sin and toward God. Holy water is a visible sign of our baptism!

The use of Holy Water in the home is also a practice that many Catholics practice. You may want to consider placing Holy Water inside the door of your house to use when leaving and entering. Holy Water is available in the back of the Church for your use.
