



As we celebrate the Solemnity of Christ the King, we conclude the liturgical year and prepare next weekend to begin the Advent Season. We are entering into what can be one of the busiest times of the year, filled with the hustle and bustle as we eagerly count down the days to Christmas. Those days are usually filled with lots of shopping, cooking and planning — all in preparation for the impending celebration. However, in her wisdom, the Church counteracts the busyness of the holiday season with a four-week period that pulls our focus back to what is essential.

Advent is a time for us to focus on waiting. The need to wait for things in the world today has almost become a thing of the past. With instant communication, fast food made to order, delivery of products almost overnight, we don't have to wait for much. Of course, we all enjoy these benefits and the convenience they provide, but there is value in learning to wait patiently for the great things that are to come.

The word Advent comes from the Latin for “coming” or “arrival.” What is the arrival we are awaiting? The Universal Norms on the Liturgical Year helps us understand the season:

Advent has a twofold character, for it is a time of preparation for the Solemnities of Christmas, in which the First Coming of the Son of God to humanity is remembered, and likewise, a time when, by remembrance of this, minds and hearts are led to look forward to Christ's Second Coming at the end of time. For these two reasons, Advent is a period of devout and expectant delight. (39)

The *Denver Catholic Online*, in an article shared two ways that people generally approach this period of preparation, which could also be called a period of waiting. One is with excitement and eagerness — excitement for family to come into town, excitement to see the kids' faces on Christmas morning, and the excitement of the season in general. The other is one of dread and trepidation — dread about all the cooking that has to be done, dread about hosting in-laws, and an overall sense of wanting the season to be over before it's even started.

Spiritually, we all encounter these same feelings as well. We constantly pray, present our petitions to the Lord, waiting on Him to provide an answer. Sometimes we're excited about what he has in store for us; sometimes we're not. But it's that period of waiting for Him that can at times be the most excruciating.

Saint Augustine has something to say about this waiting period. *“If God seems slow in responding,”* he wrote, *“It is because He is preparing a better gift. He will not deny us. God withholds what you are not yet ready for. He wants you to have a lively desire for His greatest gifts. All of which is to say, pray always and do not lose heart.”*

As we prepare and wait for Christmas, let us use this season to prepare ourselves for the greater gift to come, which is the Savior Christ our Lord. May this Advent season remind us that God is always at work if we allow Him, and that we are not in control, He is.

Blessings to all of you as we prepare for the Advent Season! Enjoy this week with family and friends as we celebrate Thanksgiving and let us keep in our prayers those who cannot gather this year with their loved ones.



## PREPARING FOR ADVENT

The season of Advent will begin next Sunday, it is designed to help us prepare to celebrate Jesus' birth at Christmas. Think of it: God became man, died for our sins, rose from the dead, and now reigns as King of all creation. Every Christmas is a chance to welcome Jesus as an honored guest into our hearts. Think of all the planning, cooking, and cleaning needed to have a guest over. In Advent we prepare our hearts to welcome the Savior. Here are some suggestions to make the most of your Advent.

### Prioritize Prayer

- Know the story - read through Jesus's birth in the Gospels of Matthew and Luke.
- Get to know the Advent Saints - know God's friends!
- Visit the Blessed Sacrament at church.
- Rediscover Mass by trying to attend daily Mass.
- Spend 15 minutes daily with God in quiet prayer, reading scripture or praying the Rosary.

### Practice Penance

- Form an Advent habit, maybe get up 10 minutes early to pray.
- Electronic fasting, limit your electronic devices.
- Make a nightly examination of conscience.
- Experience God's mercy-frequent the Sacrament of Confession.

### Give Alms

- Donate resources, donate to a church food or clothing drive.
- Give your time to volunteer those who need your help.
- Welcome the lonely, the holidays are hard for those that are alone.
- Do acts of random kindness, hold a door open and smile.
- Practice patience.

### Anticipate with Joy

- Light the Advent wreath at dinner to build anticipation for Jesus' birth.
- Listen to Advent music.
- Set out the Nativity Scene slowly, on the first Sunday of Advent set out the stable and then each week, add the characters, wait until Christmas to place Jesus in the manger.
- Celebrate the feast days.
- Build your Christmas around the Mass - after all the waiting and preparing we are ready to receive the greatest gift of all; Jesus Christ, truly present in the Eucharist.
- Keep your Advent behavior going after Christmas - wait joyfully for the Lord at every Sunday - a "mini" Christmas when we meet the Messiah at the Eucharist!



## DONOR MATCH PROGRAM WESHARE

Saint James is a valued customer of the WeShare Program. This program provides us the ability to utilize our on-line giving program. WeShare is offering a special Donor Match Program for all parishioners that add new recurring gifts between **November 1 - December 31, 2021**. The holiday season is one of the largest giving seasons for churches and ministries, and the Donor Match Program will help us to promote recurring giving within our community. It is also a great way to promote digital giving within our Parish, which reduces our costs and time spent handling other forms of payment.

For every first gift from a new recurring donor that is added between **November 1 and December 31, 2021**, they will match that first gift, up to \$50.00, with a maximum match of \$1,000.00.
