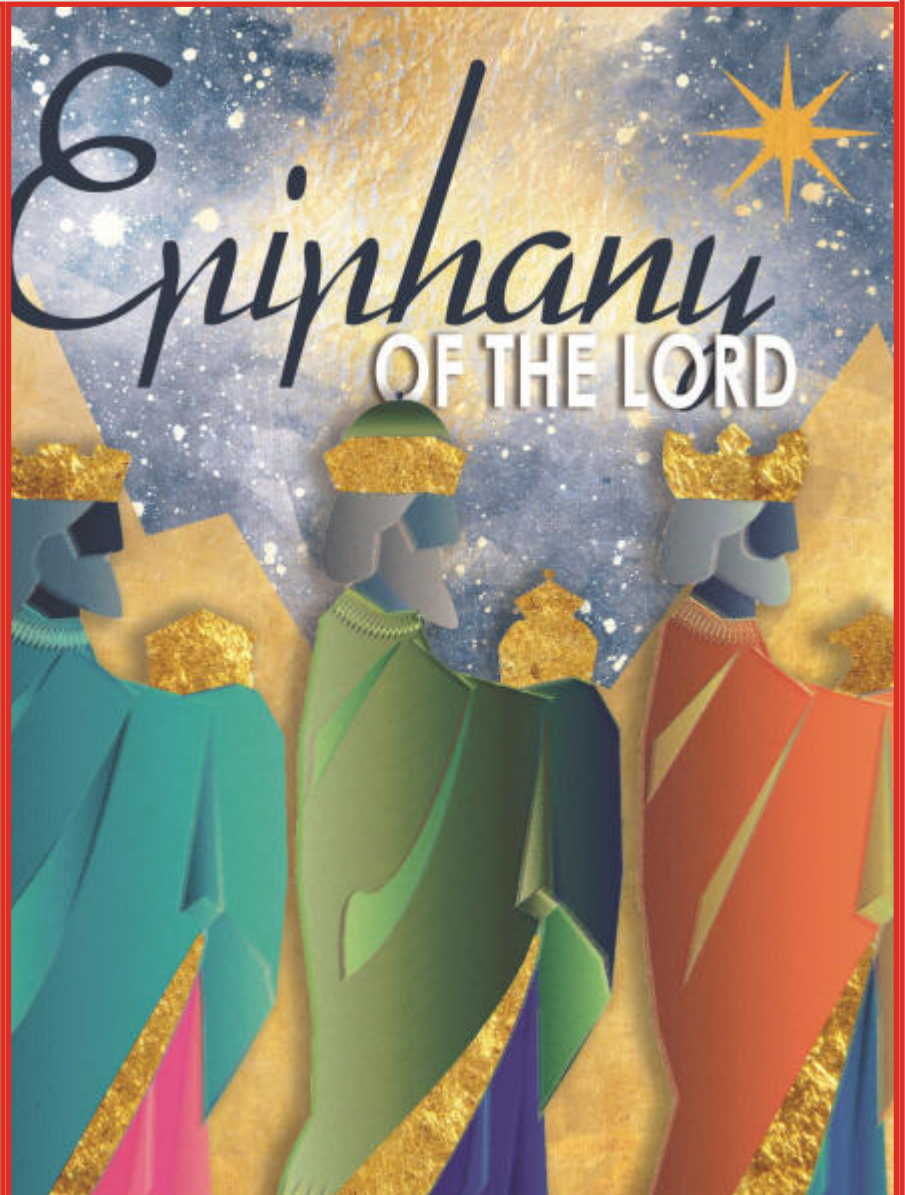

MEDITATIONS AFTER HOLY COMMUNION FOR THE SOLEMNITY OF THE EPIPHANY OF THE LORD

What are some gifts that you think Jesus received that are not known to us? What are gifts that you have given to the Lord? What will your gift for Him be today? What gifts has Jesus given you?

"Lord Jesus, I receive the greatest gift every time I receive you in Holy Communion. On this day, when Your family received the gifts of the Magi, I wish to offer You a gift, the gift of my love and service. I love You, Lord; I praise and adore You. Receive my gift and be pleased with it this day."

On Christmas day, I was thinking back to our family tradition of gathering at my grandparent's house on Christmas Eve. After Mass, we would eat dinner and then open presents. As a young boy, the hours leading up to this moment seemed like an eternity. I remember my parents telling me, "Wait until you are older; time will fly by." Of course, I didn't believe them, but like in many situations, they were right. Here we are, the start of another year. So, as we enter into 2022, I would encourage you to spend some time reflecting on this past year and the new year that God places before us. Here are some points to consider in your personal reflection (adapted from Aletaia Catholic Blog).



- Never forget that you are God's individual creation and, therefore, a gift He has bestowed on the world. Be humbled by the fact that He certainly has you in the palm of His hand. Without Him you are nothing.
- Be happy with who and what you are. God made you and loves you. If you feel you need to change to please Him, you can do it. Just ask for His help.
- The choices you make are your responsibility. Sometimes our choices hurt us. Embrace them and learn from them and move on. Thank God for the experience.
- Sometimes NOT getting what you want or what you think you need is a blessing. If you trust God, you will thank Him. When "one door closes, another opens."
- Always count your blessings, not your troubles.
- You can make it through whatever comes along. Grace will be there, but it only comes one day at a time. Don't fret about the future.
- Prayer is the most powerful of weapons and can be your greatest ally in all diversity.
- Don't take things too seriously, especially yourself.
- The key to happiness is to give of yourself, not to "get" for yourself.
- Miracles happen; don't overlook them.
- Temptation is everywhere. Remember, it only lasts for a short time and will pass away. So hold out, and say, "No."
- Finally, never fail to help a neighbor, whoever it may be, even a stranger.

As Catholic Christians, we enter the New Year with God's help. We have the armor of the Church to protect us in whatever we will face in the year ahead. Ask yourself how important are the celebration of the Sacraments to you and your family? Do you make the celebration of the Sacraments a priority (Sunday Mass, the Eucharist, Confession)? The Sacraments serve as the armor of God that Christ gives to us each and every time we participate in these sacred rituals. We are also blessed to have the angels and saints at our defense. Do you remember to pray asking for their intercession? Here are several "go-to" saints to keep in your daily prayers.

- St. Michael the Archangel will always "defend us in battle."
- St. Anthony will help us find lost items.
- St. Jude will help us through seemingly impossible barricades.
- St. Joseph is ready to help us, and especially to help all men be good fathers and husbands.
- St. Monica will help mothers and those who have strayed from the faith.
- St. Dymphna will help those experiencing emotional difficulties or suffering from Alzheimer's disease.
- St. Peregrine brings strength and healing to cancer patients.
- Blessed Virgin Mary is always there for all of us.

As we begin this new year, please know of my prayers for each of you. I want to share the prayer to Saint Michael the Archangel with you and your family. Perhaps some of you may be familiar with it.

I encourage you to pray this prayer together as a family and entrust yourself each day to the protection of God and His angels.

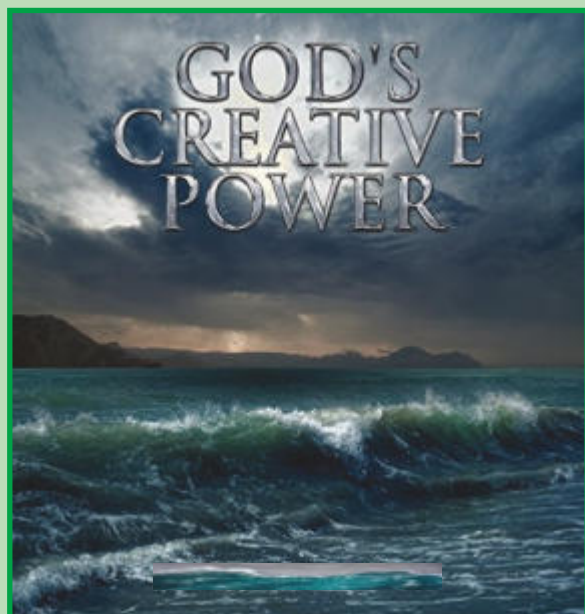

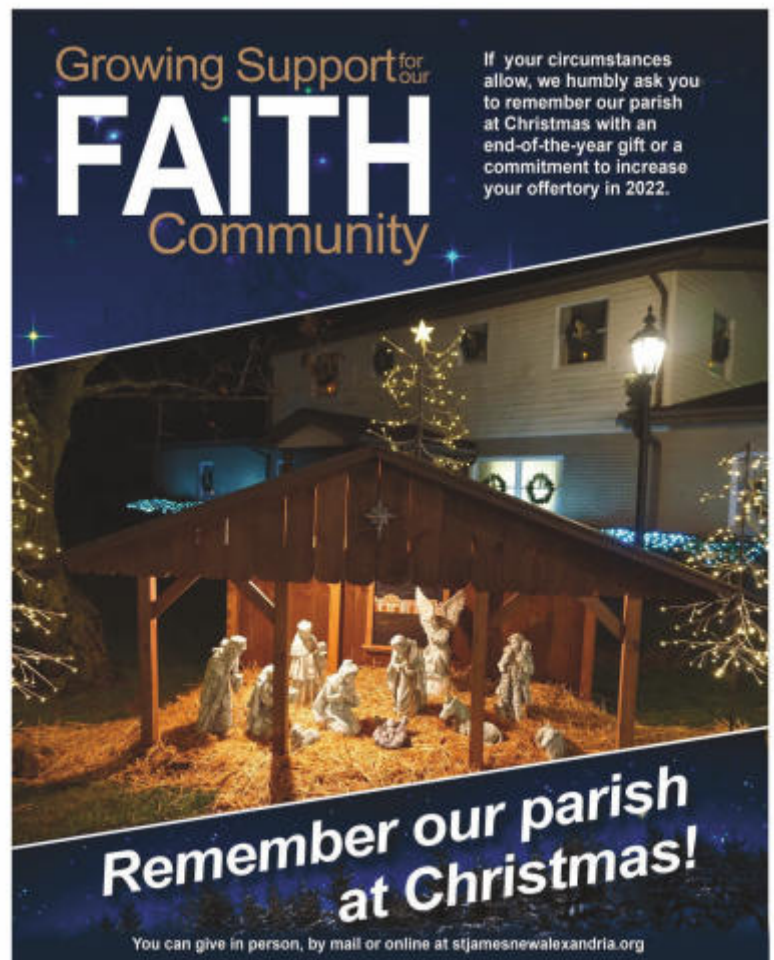
