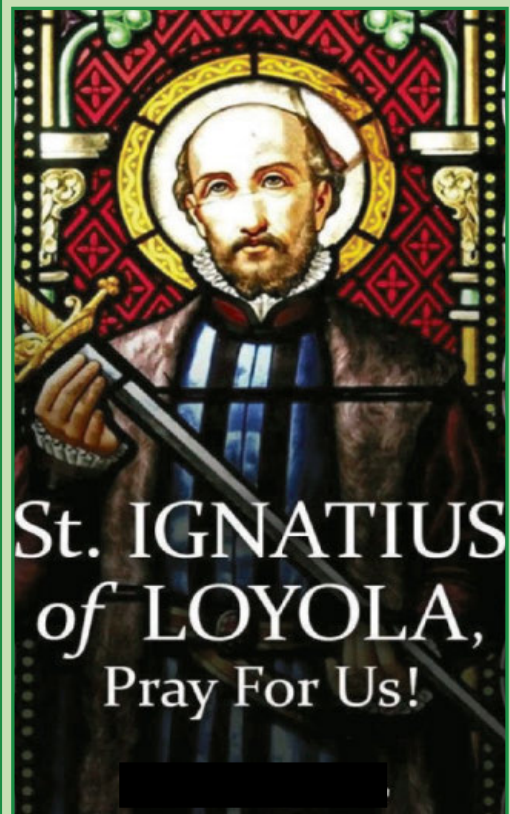
MEDITATIONS AFTER HOLY COMMUNION FOR THE SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

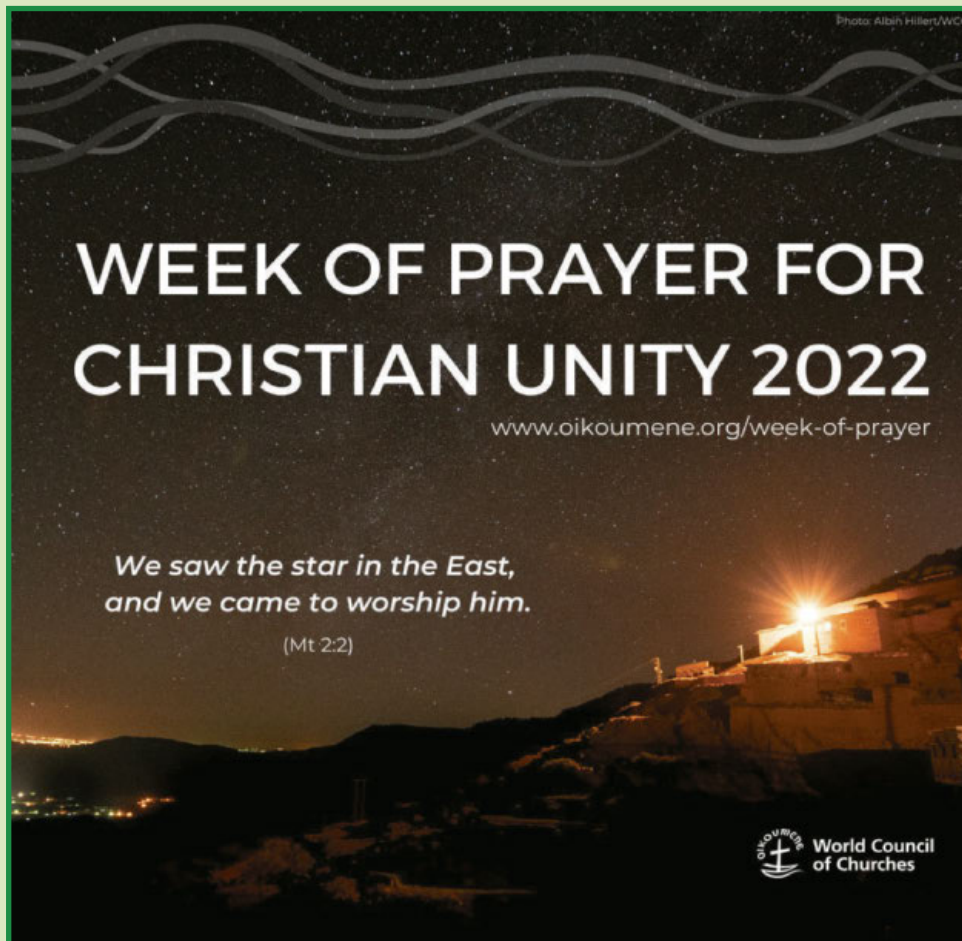


Last weekend, at our Masses, I announced that Father Bill Berkey, Pastor of Saint John and Saint Rose parishes in Latrobe, has been granted a sixth-month leave of absence for medical reasons. So, as the Dean, effective **January 13th**, I will become the Administrator Pro-Tem of Saint John and Saint Rose parishes. This new responsibility will not affect my ministry here at Saint James or my parish presence in our community. The retired priests of our diocese will cover the sacramental needs of Saint John and Saint Rose. I am grateful for their willingness to step in and assist so generously in providing for the sacramental needs of these parishes. As you can imagine, this is a difficult time for the parishioners of Saint John and Saint Rose. I ask that you please keep them in your prayers, along with the healing of Father Berkey. This situation reminds us of our constant need to pray for vocations and promote a culture of vocations throughout our diocese.

This week in the gospel, we hear the Wedding Feast at Cana. In this moment, Jesus himself institutes marriage as a sacrament of His love, which the Church continues to fight to protect in the world today. The Sacrament of Marriage is a precious gift God bestows upon a couple. Let us pray for those preparing for marriage, and rejoice in this gift that God has bestowed upon many of you. We need to remember that it is in the family that the faith is nurtured. It is from holy, committed Catholic families that vocations come forth. Let us pray for all those discerning their vocations, whether marriage, holy orders, or consecrated life.

Prayer of Christian Unity

The Week of Prayer for Christian Unity has a history of over 100 years, in which Christians around the world have taken part in praying for visible Christian unity. By annually observing the WPCU, Christians move toward the fulfillment of Jesus' prayer at the Last Supper "*that they all may be one.*" (cf. *John 17:21*). I ask that you please keep this intention in your prayer throughout this week.

Holy Father Asks Us All to Share Ideas In Survey, Town Hall Listening Sessions

Diocese of Greensburg announces "Synod" participation opportunities

The Diocese of Greensburg is undertaking a massive effort to listen to a broad range of people throughout our faith community and discuss major issues together with a goal of hearing where the Holy Spirit is calling the Church. These efforts include a pastoral connectivity survey and a series of both in-person and virtual town hall meetings at which Bishop Larry J. Kulick will be present.

What is a synod?

A synod is a gathering of church leaders, both clergy and laity. In April 2021, Pope Francis initiated a synodal journey of the whole People of God, to take place in individual Dioceses in 2022 and culminating in October 2023 in the Assembly of the Synod of Bishops.

The USCCB says this "Synod on Synodality" is intended to inspire people to dream about the Church we are called to be, to make people's hopes flourish, to stimulate trust, to bind up wounds, to weave new and deeper relationships, to learn from one another, to build bridges, to enlighten minds, to warm hearts, and to restore strength to our hands for our common mission.

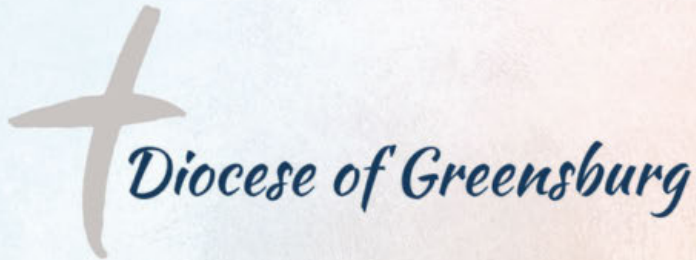

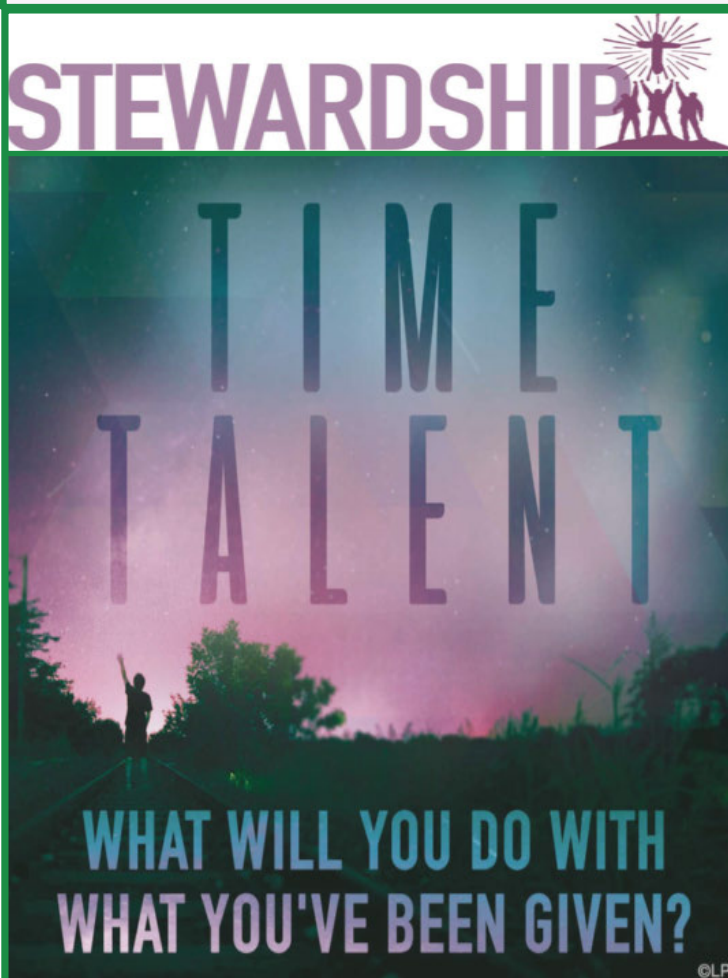
