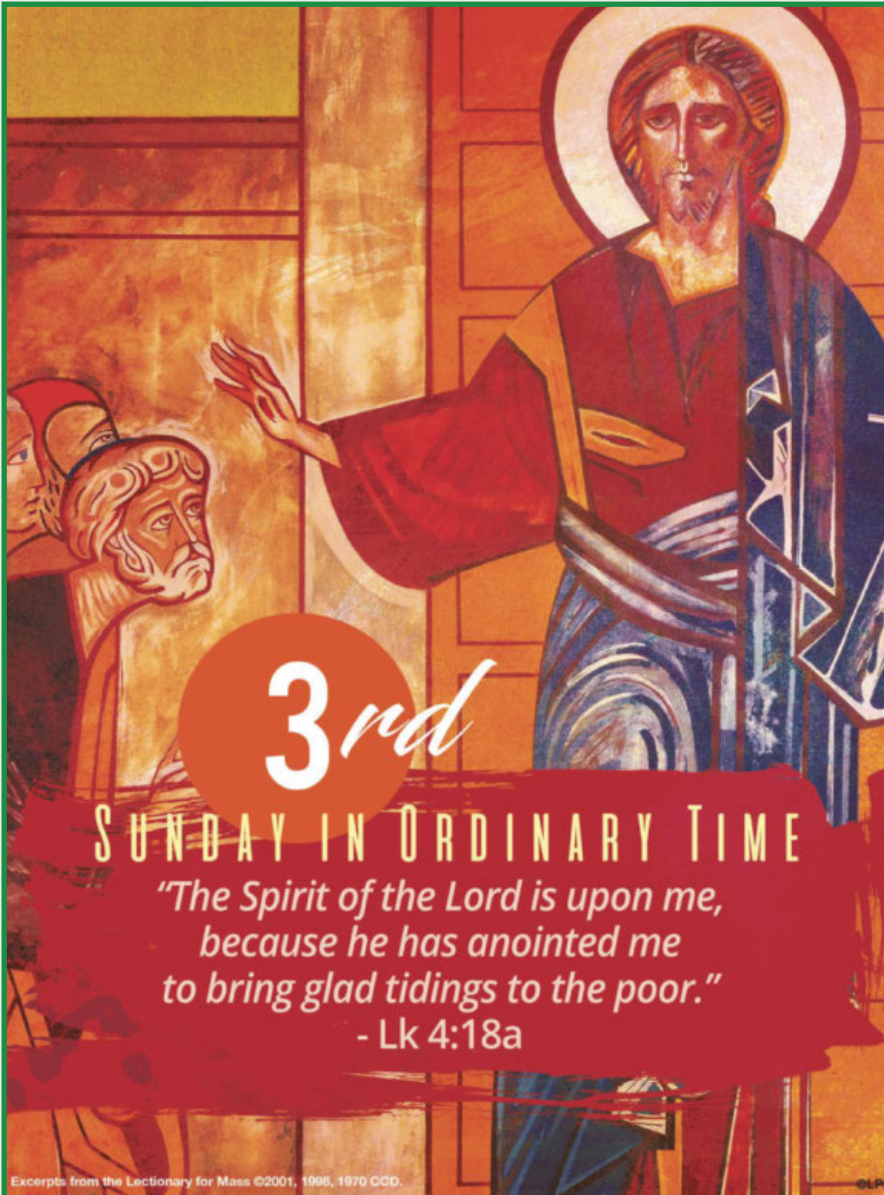

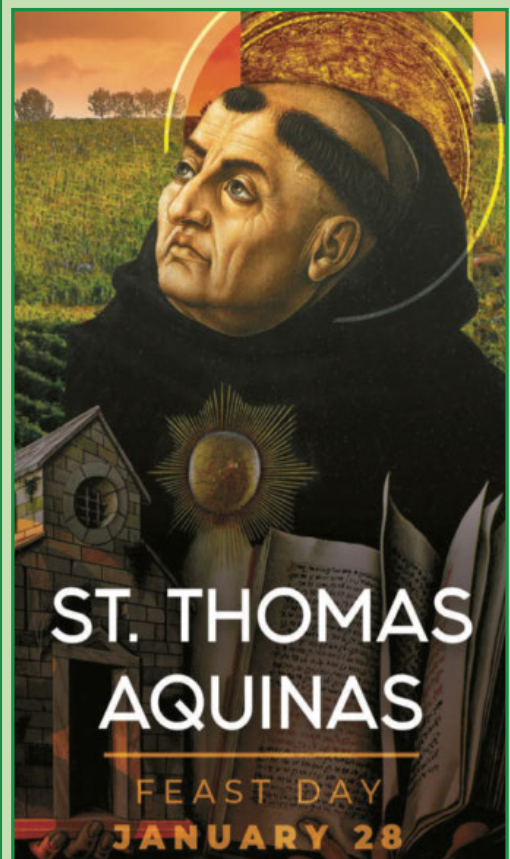
MEDITATIONS AFTER HOLY COMMUNION FOR THE THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

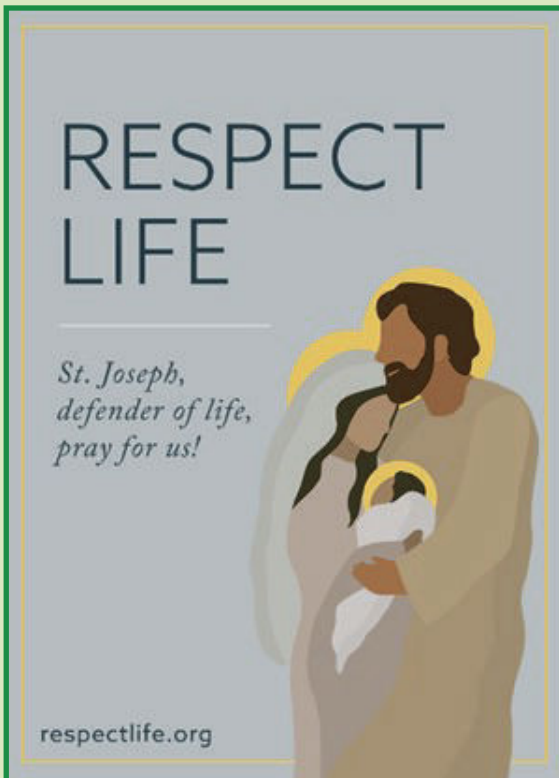
What did you do to prepare for Sunday Mass this weekend? Was there any spiritual preparation? If not, why did you not prepare? Were you too busy? Rushed in the morning? What would your ideal preparation look like? Create a checklist so you will know what you would like to accomplish before next Sunday's Mass.

January has become a month designated for the respect of all life, from the moment of conception until death. In all the Dioceses of the United States of America, January 22 (or January 23, when January 22 falls on a Sunday) shall be observed as a particular day of prayer for the full restoration of the legal guarantee of the right to life and of penance for violations to the dignity of the human person committed through acts of abortion. The over 56 million abortions since the 1973 decisions of Roe v. Wade and Doe v. Bolton reflect with heartbreaking magnitude what Pope Francis means by a “throwaway culture.” However, we have great trust in God’s providence. We are reminded time and again in Scripture to seek the Lord’s help, and as people of faith, we believe that our prayers are heard.

As we mark this important anniversary, let us turn to St. Joseph, asking for his intercession for the respect of all life, at all stages, and in every way. I want to share with you a reflection that I came across on St. Joseph as he serves as a model for all as we strive to live out the call of respect for our own life, and the life of others.

Saint Joseph – Faithful Protector of Mother and Child

The infant Christ “came into our world in a state of great vulnerability. He needed to be defended, protected, cared for and raised by Joseph” (PC 5). The humble and often hidden carpenter of Nazareth accompanied Mary in her pregnancy, assisted at the birth of the Messiah in a stable, presented Jesus in the Temple, fled with his family far from their homeland to protect them, and lovingly raised Jesus as his own son in the years to come.

While the angel of the Lord appeared to Mary to announce that she would bring forth the Savior of the world, it was revealed to Joseph in a series of dreams how God’s plans would be brought to fulfillment. As Pope Francis highlights, “God trusted Joseph, as did Mary, who found in him someone who would not only save her life, but would always provide for her and her child” (PC 5).

Like every other human family, the Holy Family had to confront real and concrete challenges. Yet, “in every situation, Joseph declared his own ‘fiat’” (PC 3). His “yes” to the Lord meant that regardless of the hardship and personal sacrifice to himself, he consistently chose to put the needs of Mary and Jesus before his own. Joseph’s devotion helps reveal to us our own call to show special care for the lives of those whom God has entrusted to us.

During this Year of St. Joseph, each of us can find in him “an intercessor, a support and a guide in times of trouble” (PC, Intro). Joseph shows us how to say “yes” to life, despite our own fears, frailties, and weaknesses. For it is Joseph who was “chosen by God to guide the beginnings of the history of redemption. He was the true ‘miracle’ by which God saves the child and his mother” (PC 5).

May we, too, be miracles in the lives of those who are most in need, especially at the beginning and end of life. Dear St. Joseph, you who were “able to turn a problem into a possibility by trusting always in divine providence” (PC 5), help us to imitate your faithful trust and courage.

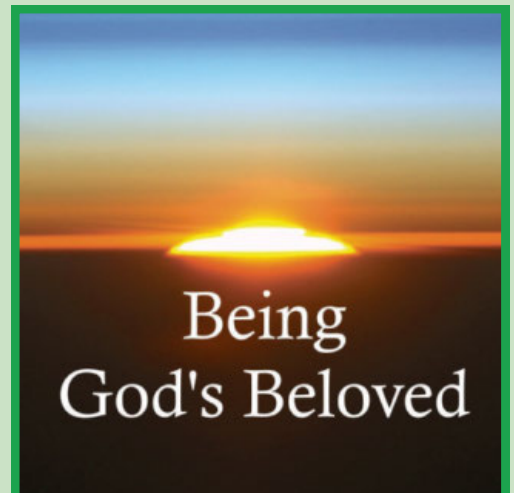

LIVE THE LITURGY INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK

People can easily lose a sense of the sacred and transcendent. When we lose a sense of God's special presence, we need to be brought back. Ezra brought people back to the word of God and they realized what they were missing. Jesus proclaims God's word in the synagogue with true conviction and tells those gathered that he is the fulfillment of all that Isaiah taught. Even though people get lost, distracted, discouraged, and often journey down the wrong path, God's timeless law remains. When we allow ourselves to truly hear God's word and act on it, that living word slowly, over time, changes us. It has the power to soften and mold us, creating within us a joyful spirit.

We realize the truth in what God speaks and become open to God's love. Gradually and gently God leads us back where we belong. We discover again the sacred character of life and the wonder of God's power. It is no wonder that Luke addresses his remarks to Theophilus. It is a name that means "*beloved of God*," a name that can be used by anyone who desires friendship with God.

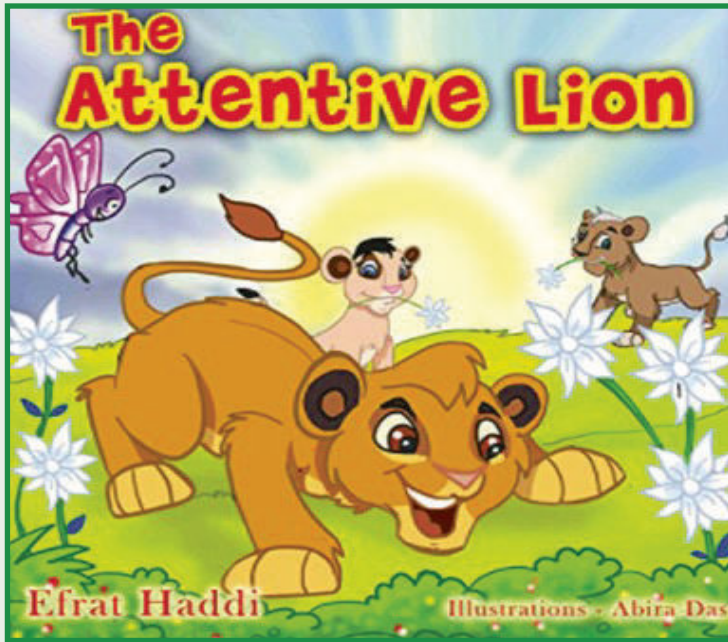

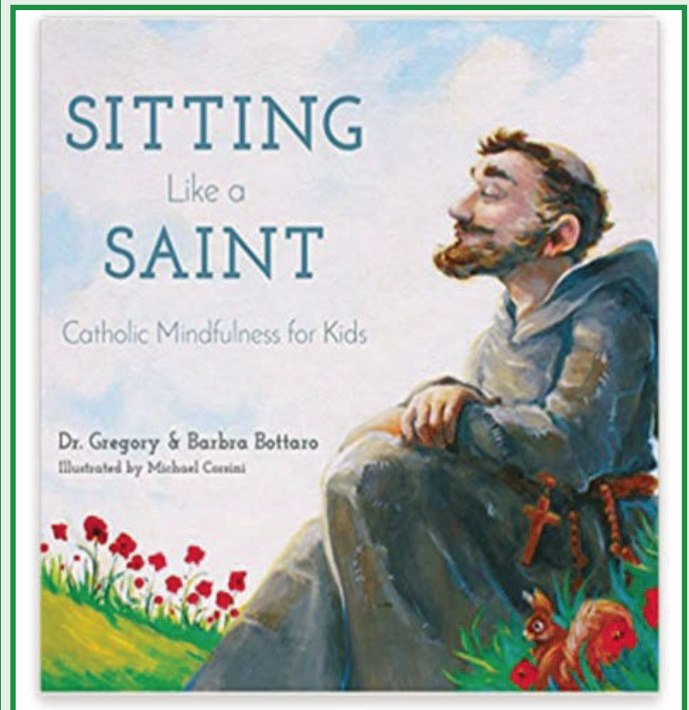
BE ATTENTIVE

LEARNING TO BE STILL

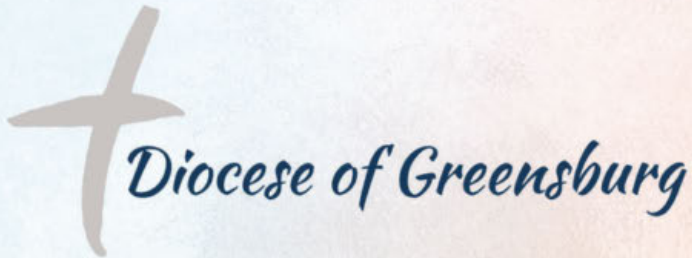
Learning to be still, is something that takes patience and practice. It is something that can be beneficial for adults and young children. Start with small amounts of time and increase as your children get better at it. The first time, you try this it may not go as well as you would like. In my classroom we take time each day to sit in silence for individual prayer time. My students love it! I begin the year by just having the students sit on the carpet and close their eyes for a minute. The next time I have them repeat the name of Jesus when they feel like moving or opening their eyes. After we get good at that, before we begin, I tell them that this is their time to tell God anything they want. Then after awhile of doing that, we begin listening for what God is saying to us using scripture or a song. It seems so simple and yet it has a great impact on the students.

I have had students tell me that when they can't fall asleep at night, they meditate or when they get angry, they go to their room and meditate. I think sometimes we forget that children need time to be still. When we give them the tools, they can begin to use them when they need it. I have added a book that you can get on Amazon to introduce this type of prayer and it also tells the story of a few saints as well. It would be a great Easter gift for your children or grandchildren.

Diocese of Greensburg announces "Synod" participation opportunities

The Diocese of Greensburg is undertaking a massive effort to listen to a broad range of people throughout our faith community and discuss major issues together with a goal of hearing where the Holy Spirit is calling the Church. These efforts include a pastoral connectivity survey and a series of both in-person and virtual town hall meetings at which Bishop Larry J. Kulick will be present.

What is a synod?

A synod is a gathering of church leaders, both clergy and laity. In April 2021, Pope Francis initiated a synodal journey of the whole People of God, to take place in individual Dioceses in 2022 and culminating in October 2023 in the Assembly of the Synod of Bishops.

The USCCB says this "Synod on Synodality" is intended to inspire people to dream about the Church we are called to be, to make people's hopes flourish, to stimulate trust, to bind up wounds, to weave new and deeper relationships, to learn from one another, to build bridges, to enlighten minds, to warm hearts, and to restore strength to our hands for our common mission.

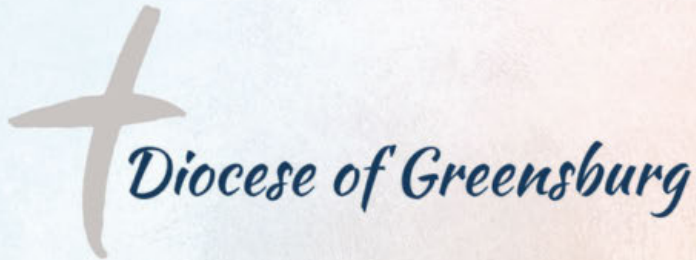
