"What is love?" That phrase isn't just the opening to an early '90s Eurodance song. It's a question that the human heart has asked throughout history. Is it a feeling? A bond experienced between family and friends and romantic partners?

In today's Gospel, Jesus gives us the unique, Christian answer: love gives without counting the cost. It seeks the good of the other without looking for repayment in return. This is the kind of love that Jesus encourages His disciples to have, "for the measure with which you measure will in return be measured out to you."

We're called to love like this in all our relationships. With our spouse, our children, our coworkers, and with others in our community. If ◆ you're looking for another concrete way to ◆ love—to give without counting the cost— ◆ consider contributing to our Annual Diocesan ◆ Appeal. Reread today's Gospel and see where the Lord leads you.

### LITURGICAL NOTES

Entrance: O Lord, I have placed my trust in your merciful love; my heart has rejoiced in your salvation. I will sing unto the Lord who has dealt bountifully with me.

**Offertory:** Hearken to the voice of my prayer, O my King and my God, for it is you, O Lord, whom I implore.

**Communion:** I will relate all your wondrous deeds. I will be glad and rejoice in you; I will sing to the honor of your name, O Most High.

"O Lord, I have placed my trust in your merciful love" constitutes the heartbeat of the Propers and readings today. David spared King Saul because he (Saul) belonged to the Lord by virtue of his anointing, and David placed his trust in God to bring all things to a good end. Our Lord's exhortation to love our enemies is a call to trust in the God who made those same enemies of ours in His image and likeness. In short, we are called to exercise the virtue of hope. This splendid virtue gives us the courage to "sing to the honor of [His] name" in the midst of tribulation. Following in the footsteps of Christ is difficult; we need hope to assure us that God does not go back on His promises and that we will "bear the image of the heavenly [Adam]" after persevering through this vale of tears. Hope therefore offers us an interesting lens through which we examine the Offertory Antiphon in particular. The cry to hearken to our prayers is imbued with confidence. The curious interjection, "for it is you, O Lord, whom I implore" seems redundant after just having addressed God as "my King", but the psalmist seems to be saying that he is addressing his prayer to God because he knows he will be heard. It is integral to God's identity to deliver those who trust in Him. Let us then, relate His "wondrous deeds" of mercy in our lives and share the fruits of the Good News in our lives with a world craving the peace and love that flows from union with God.



### FROM THE PASTOR





PREPARING FOR LENT

Part II

Very Rev. Joseph Mary Lukyamuzi, V.F.

"Be alert and of sober mind. Your enemy the devil prowls around like a roaring lion looking for someone to devour. Resist him, standing firm in the faith, because you know that the family of believers throughout the world is undergoing the same kind of sufferings."

I Peter 5:8-9

It is common at the beginning of a running race to hear words like "On your mark, get set, go!"; if we were in the music field, we would hear "Ready Steady Go!" So, I would consider that if our *Go* is on Ash-Wednesday (March 2, 2022), then this period prior to the *Go* is very important for setting our minds on how we are going to run the upcoming Lenten race.

St. Paul, writing to the Ephesians calling them to preparedness, put it this way: "Therefore take up the whole armor of God, that you may be able to withstand in the evil day, and having done all, to stand firm. Stand therefore, having fastened on the belt of truth, and having put on the breastplate of righteousness, and, as shoes for your feet, having put on the readiness given by the gospel of peace. In all circumstances take up the shield of faith, with which you can extinguish all the flaming darts of the evil one; and take the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God, always praying in the Spirit, with all prayer and supplication." Ephesians 6:13-18

When it comes to spiritual warfare, it's important to note that the end goal isn't finding a demon behind every bush. Instead, it's a call to be faithful and stand firm against the inevitable attacks. Standing firm in the face of temptation doesn't come from our

own will power. Christ is our ultimate source of power and where we find our strength and rest. Even when we lose a battle, Jesus is with us, and His love knows no end.

I believe this time of preparedness is a period of training and it must be somehow rigorous. Paul, writing to the Corinthians, said: "Everyone who competes in the games goes into strict training. They do it to get a crown that will not last, but we do it to get a crown that will last forever. Therefore, I do not run like someone running aimlessly; I do not fight like a boxer beating the air. No, I strike a blow to my body and make it my slave so that after I have preached to others, I myself will not be disqualified for the prize." 1Corinthins 9:25-27. What we must be aware of is that every day that God blesses us to wake up, we are faced with a spiritual battle. The Bible says that Satan is like a thief that wants to steal, kill, and destroy. He wants to steal our joy, kill our spirit, and destroy our soul. The Bible describes Satan as a lion that roams around seeking whom he may devour (1 **Peter)**. As such, every day we are faced with a spiritual battle, and if we plan on winning this spiritual battle then we must prepare to win. How are we going to win?

The Bible tells us, "Be strong in the Lord and in the strength of his might." Notice that it doesn't say your power or your might but the Lord's might. You see, when we try to lean on our own power and our own might, we will find ourselves getting in the way of the victory that God is trying to give us.

After wandering in the wilderness for just two years. God tells the Israelites that they could go in and possess the land he had promised them centuries ago. When the Israelites sent out spies to give a report, however, ten out of the twelve spies discouraged the Israelites from moving forward for they said there were giants in the land that made them look like grasshoppers. God had already told them that he would give them victory, but since the Israelites could not see how to win the battle by their own power and by their own might, they had decided not to fight at all. They lost before they even went into battle. So, when you trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not to your own understanding, when you rely on his power and not yours, instead of being a loser before you even go into battle, you can claim victory over every spiritual giant in your life because God has already given you the victory. It is important, then, to prepare to depend on God's power and not yours because God fights differently than we do.
