How do we know someone loves us? Is it through the sweet words they say to us, the grand promises they make? While these things can be part of the equation, we come to learn that love can only prove itself through deeds. We know someone loves us not when they say they love us, but when they show they love us—by prioritizing us, caring for us, and seeking our good, even when it might mean making a sacrifice.

if this applies to us determining if someone loves us, it can also help us reflect on whether we truly love others. Do the things we say we believe about love, giving generously, and serving others lead to concrete deeds in our lives—the “good fruit” Christ talks about in today’s Gospel—or do they tend to not translate into action?

It can be difficult to tell! But the Lord gives us opportunities to put love into action each and every day—in our family, our workplace, and our wider community. As a parish, we actually have one of those opportunities before us today: the chance to contribute to our Annual Diocesan Appeal. This is a concrete opportunity to not only give generously, but also to contribute to the “good fruit” that our diocese is producing today, sharing the love of the Lord with so many who desire to receive it. ## LITURGICAL NOTES

**Entrance:** The Lord has become my protector; he has brought me forth into free and open spaces; he delivered me because he was well pleased with me.

**Offertory:** Turn to me, O Lord, and deliver my soul; save me for the sake of your love.

**Communion:** I will sing unto the Lord who has dealt bountifully with me; I will praise the name of the Lord, the Most High.

*The passage from Sirach in the first reading is pithy and sets the stage nicely for the Gospel, which treats of much the same content. In short, avoid hypocrisy and cherish self-knowledge, the grace that is the beginning of spiritual growth. It is in light of these themes that we join our prayer to the Offertory Antiphon, begging the Lord to save our souls “for the sake of your love.” As always, the Psalmist uses just the right words – we do not deserve mercy, yet it is God’s very nature to show mercy as an expression of His omnipotent love. Those who are contrite and appeal to His love may expect His mercy with confidence. Receiving the excellent gift of self-knowledge humbles us and truly should lead us to “sing unto the Lord who has dealt bountifully with [us]”, no true growth can occur without knowing our weaknesses. All this is a perfect preparation for Lent, which starts this week! Pray for this knowledge of self, give thanks to the Lord for it, and then do the work that needs to be done to remove the plank from your eye. Let the Epistle from Paul about the “sting of death” being lost in the victory of immortality spur us on to persevere through our Lenten penances and life’s crosses, knowing that the victor of self will find eternal rest and never again fear the loss of God’s friendship through sin. Miserere nobis Domine!*

# FROM THE PASTOR



## PREPARING FOR LENT

### Part III

**“Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight, and sin which clings so closely, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us.” Hebrews 12:1**

### AND

**“An athlete is not crowned unless he competes according to the rules.” 2 Timothy 2:5**

**Lent begins on Ash Wednesday (March 2<sup>nd</sup>. 2022).** Are you ready? Lent is considered the Catholic’s favorite season of the year! Even many non-Catholics take the time to get ashes. But this ancient practice is often misunderstood by non-Catholics. Have you ever had a helpful person say, **“You have something on your forehead”**, thinking you picked up some dirt somewhere?

Ash Wednesday is a great start to Lent, but have you prepared enough to take on that journey? We are creatures of our senses. We experience the world, and in fact, we experience God through our senses. Holy water fonts remind us of our baptism; genuflecting before the Blessed Sacrament reminds us of the Real Presence of Jesus; the bread and wine become Christ’s Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity—the Catholic Faith uses physical reminders of theological truths seriously, and we can do something like that in our own daily lives and even at our homes to remind us of the season of Lent. Don’t you think that can be included in your planning?

Besides preparing your home with daily physical reminders, prepare your heart with daily spiritual reminders. The Church recommends prayer, fasting, and almsgiving during Lent. What is your schedule for these three pillars? ***If you don’t have a daily prayer habit***, Lent is the perfect time to begin! If you do, you can add a devotion or practice that will improve your Lenten preparations and help you remain attentive to the spirit of Lent. Keep it simple or you will feel overwhelmed and be less likely to keep it up. Many people find a Lenten booklet especially helpful in persevering without feeling overwhelmed. Besides daily prayer, consider going to confession more frequently and adding a daily Mass, if you are able. The sacraments are the greatest gifts the Lord gave us for growing in grace, and we should utilize them as often as possible.

**An aspect of Lent that is often forgotten is fasting** – very few like to fast! With our American culture that provides abundance, surrounded by so many comforts and pleasures, and instant gratification, it can be so difficult to allow ourselves to experience any form of detachment! The Church only requires that we abstain from meat every Friday in Lent and on Ash Wednesday, and that we fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, eating only one full meal and two snacks that only add up to another meal. That’s not too harsh. But fasting can be much broader than that. Think outside the box. The goal of “offering something up for Lent” is to turn our minds to God.

**The third pillar is Almsgiving.** This traditionally refers to helping the poor financially, but by extension, we can help anyone in need by our actions, as well. How? Create a “giving jar” or use the baby bottles from the pregnancy center. Make a practice of putting in your loose change every day. On days that you fast from your morning coffee or some other item, put in what it might have cost you, so you give to the poor instead. Go through your things and see what you can give away, clean your closet! Pick someone you know who needs to know the love of Jesus. We must witness by our lives as much as by our words.
