

LITURGICAL NOTES

Easter Sequence: Christians, to the Paschal Victim | Offer your thankful praises! | A Lamb the sheep redeems; | Christ, who only is sinless, | Reconciles sinners to the Father. | Death and life have contended in that combat stupendous: | The Prince of life, who died, reigns immortal. | Speak, Mary, declaring What you saw, wayfaring. | "The tomb of Christ, who is living, | The glory of Jesus' resurrection; | bright angels attesting, | The shroud and napkin resting. | Yes, Christ my hope is arisen; | to Galilee he goes before you." | Christ indeed from death is risen, our new life obtaining. | Have mercy, victor King, ever reigning! Amen. Alleluia.

Sequences are chants that traditionally followed the Alleluia verse (and are now before it) and were rich in poetry and theology. They were quite common in the Medieval Church until the Council of Trent in the 1500s, which streamlined the liturgy in the wake of the Protestant Revolution. Now only four sequences are left – this one, the Victimae Paschali Laudes, among them. It is strikingly bard-like in its stone, calling on all to sing ("Offer your thankful praises!"), to listen to the grand adventure ("Death and life have contended in that combat stupendous"), and calls on witnesses ("Tell us, Mary!"). The Offertory Antiphon complements the highly epic ethos of the sequence nicely, recalling from Psalm 75 that "The earth trembled and was still when God arose in judgment", and the Communion Antiphon beautifully summarizes our response to the Paschal Mystery: "Christ our Passover has been sacrificed; therefore let us keep the east with the unleavened bread of purity and truth." Christ is risen! Alleluia, alleluia, alleluia!



FROM THE PASTOR





THE POWER IN HIS RESURRECTION
Part I

Very Rev. Joseph Mary Lukyamuzi, V.F.

"For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we will certainly also be united with him in a resurrection like his."

Romans 6:5

Alleluia! He is risen. We live in the power of Jesus' resurrection. St. Paul, writing to the Philippians, wanted them to know the power of Jesus' resurrection: "that I may know him and the power of his resurrection, and may share his sufferings, becoming like him in his death that by any means possible I may attain the resurrection from the **dead." Philippians 3:10-11.** According to Paul, this power is generally manifested in suffering, and Paul somehow reads his own life into Jesus' life. Or, he is reading Jesus' life into his life. He interprets his current life experience through the lens of what Jesus experienced. Somehow through suffering, Paul wants to become like Christ. You see, we can only know the same resurrection power if we've experienced the same kind of death. To put it in another way, you cannot know resurrection power if you are still alive with your pleasurable, worldly lifestyle.

Has this Lenten time helped you accept self-denial as a way to experience death in and with Jesus, so that you can share in his resurrection? *Resurrection power* is the work of God in the life to come that reaches into our present and brings us into union with Him. When Jesus ascended after being raised, for the first time ever a piece of earth entered heaven. But at

the same time, when Jesus was resurrected, there was a piece of heaven on earth too. Jesus joined heaven and earth.

Resurrection power is working in us now. We experience it as the effects of being born again in new life in Christ, and we also experience it in the sufferings that we face. We understand the resurrection power that raised Jesus from the dead in the past and also trust that it will happen with us! For that to happen, though, we need to be vigilant by the way we live in this present life! What are we to seek intentionally now?

The Christian life is not just about ceasing to do bad things. This would just be living according to the law. The Christian life is both a call for me to cease doing bad things and a call to detach myself from good things because everything about me is dead. Any good things I acquire should be according to Christ. He should be the center of all our desires, and anything in us that is not Christ should be put to death. We need to put our self to death and trust in Jesus every day. When we do that, He credits a righteousness that is not ours to us. St. Paul has this to say: "What is more, I consider everything a loss because of the surpassing worth of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord, for whose sake I have lost all things. I consider them garbage, that I may gain Christ and be found in him, not having a righteousness of my own that comes from the law, but that which is through faith in Christ—the righteousness that comes from God on the basis of faith" Philippians 3:8-9.

This changes our prayer. We will confess our sins, and our piety. We will lay aside our best intentions and ask that He live through us. We will seek Him living through us every single moment. What will it look like to have a heart that is dependent on His grace, that seeks all of Him and none of us? What will it look like if we all walked out saying we want more of Christ, that all we want is more of Calvary and to be raised in newness of life, that we might have His heart? That will look like the risen Christ manifesting the present and future glory of Christ in us.

YES, ALLELUIA. JESUS IS RISEN AND LIVES FOREVER.
