LITURGICAL NOTES

Entrance: Spread the news with a voice of joy; let it be heard, alleluia; speak it out to the very ends of the earth; the Lord has liberated his people, alleluia, alleluia.

Offertory: O nations, bless the Lord our God, let the voice of his praises resound; he has restored my soul to life and he has not suffered my feet to stumble; blessed be the Lord who has neither rejected my prayer nor turned his mercy away from me, alleluia.

Communion: The Holy Spirit will teach you, alleluia; all the things that I have said unto you, alleluia, alleluia.

With the Easter season nearly spent, the Church begins turning her gaze toward Pentecost. The focus shifts from pure joy and praise to exhortations to share the Good News of Jesus' triumph over sin and death through His Passion, Death, and Resurrection. In the Offertory we see the use of "nations", which comes from the Latin gentes, which is where we get the English word **gentiles**, or non-Jews. The message of salvation is now for all peoples, as we note in the first reading where circumcision, a practice of the Old Covenant, is not required of converts to Christianity. The outward practices of the Old Law are fading away as the diversity of converts increases. We see this in the Gospel and Communion Antiphon, which have personal undertones ("The Holy Spirit will teach you") that indicate a personal relationship with God. The Offertory Antiphon most beautifully expresses this by declaring "he has restored my soul to life". We who were dead in sin now have life through Baptism and, through the mercy of God, can have it restored to us through Confession should we stumble. Evangelization begins with the experience of God's love for us individually, which translates to wanting to share the peace and happiness we feel with others. May the Holy Spirit find a welcome place in our hearts and communicate to us the Love of God that never grows tired of pursuing us and never stales in the delights it produces in the soul.



FROM THE PASTOR



THE POWER IN HIS RESURRECTION Part VI Very Rev. Joseph Mary Lukyamuzi, V.F.

"Therefore we have been buried with Him through baptism into death, so that as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, so we too might walk in newness of life." Romans. 6:4

In the last week's episode, we noted that to those who believe, there is no more death, even if we still have to experience a temporary passage from this world to the *next.* We believe that Jesus' new life begins for us even now. We walk no longer in darkness but have the light of life. Jesus has laid out a path for us, showing what will truly give us joy and happiness. When Jesus said that he has overcome the world, he meant that he has given us a true freedom in him that delivers us from the anxiety of the world. He doesn't promise us a perfect world, but rather union with him as we journey through it. If we put our hope in security or present pleasures, we will be miserable! The freedom of new life in Christ is knowing that we belong with Jesus, who is now sitting at the right hand of the Father as our king. It is knowing that our lives have meaning and purpose and that this cannot be taken away.

won the victory over sin and death and has given his own life to us. This victory is not something that only happened many years ago, as it is made present to us every Sunday, the day of the Resurrection. Jesus gives us his own living flesh to make the Resurrection real within us. The Eucharist makes us more than mortal: "I am the living bread which came down from heaven; if anyone eats of this bread, he will live forever" John 6:50. The Eucharist changes us from the inside out, giving us Christ's own life and joy, and even guarantees that our own flesh will live forever with him. Through the Eucharist, we can say with Paul that "it is no longer I who live, but Christ who lives in me; and the life I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me" Galatians 2:20.

We know that we are celebrating Easter properly if we experience the joy of Jesus's gift of life to us. After dying to ourselves during Lent, we should be ready to celebrate not by going back to our old ways but by living differently with the new leaven that transforms everything that we do. A life in the Resurrection is centered on Christ, relying on him for everything and giving him glory in all that we do. Even if the world is falling apart around us, we are not living for this world. Even if we are suffering, we should not fear because, through the Resurrection, there is a place for us, forever. Our lives have a purpose that will bear fruit in eternal life. The devil wants to hold us back, trapping us with anxiety and fear, but Jesus says, "have no fear!" Matthew 14:27. The Resurrection is our ultimate hope, knowing that Jesus has won the victory for us and that he is with us every step of the way.

We need to engage in conversation with Jesus and ask him in prayer: *Help me to keep my eyes fixed on you, Jesus, and prevent me from falling into anxiety and a life that seeks comfort. Please transform me from the inside out and make me into your likeness. Help me to live differently right now and to have confidence in the place you have prepared for me in heaven.*
