NEXT WEEK'S READINGS THIRTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDNARY TIME

FIRST READING

Acts of the Apostles 2:42-47 The first community of Christians grows as its members meet to pray and break bread.

Responsorial Psalm Psalm 118:2-4,13-15,22-24 God's love is everlasting.

LITURGICAL NOTES

Entrance: He fed them with the finest of wheat, alleluia; and with honey from the rock he satisfied them, alleluia, alleluia.

Offertory: The Lord opened the doors of heaven and rained down manna upon them to eat; he gave them bread from heaven; man ate the bread of angels, alleluia.

Communion: This is my body which is given up for you; this is the cup of the new covenant in my blood, says the Lord. Each time that you partake thereof, do it in memory of me.

In the Corpus Christi liturgy, we see a plethora of Old Testament imagery preparing Israel and ultimately all of humanity for God's greatest gift to the world: the gift of Himself, permanently present in the consecrated bread and wine (i.e., the Eucharist). The most prominent image found in the Propers is the "bread from heaven". It is very easy to see the correlation between the manna and the Eucharist. Both are of Divine origin, and both nourish the People of God as they journey towards the Promised Land (first Israel, now Heaven). What we often forget is that the manna was only present in the morning and then disappeared; it could not be saved for another day. This provides us with an interesting theological reflection – we need to trust God to provide for our daily needs, sometimes even from one moment to the next! It also teaches us that Christ alone is enough to get us through our day. Hence our Lord taught us to pray, "Give us this day our daily bread". We need to turn to God every day for our sustenance and rely on Him alone; sin enters when we strive to rely on things or people for our deepest longings because we can run into the danger of idolizing them. After all, the soul craves with an infinite longing to love and be loved; things and people satiate it for a time, but only God can satisfy it fully and perpetually. 

FROM THE RESURRECTION TO LIFE IN THE HOLY SPIRIT

Part III

Very Rev. Joseph Mary Lukyamuzi, V.F.

"The LORD is my strength and my shield; my heart trusts in him, and he helps me. My heart leaps for joy, and with my song I praise him. The LORD is the strength of his people, a fortress of salvation for his anointed one." Psalms 28:7-8

In our lives, many situations arise in which it becomes difficult to do the right thing even when we know what it is. In order to stay strong and do what is good, we need God's assistance, and that is when we are given the virtue of fortitude, courage, or bravery. One may wonder, though: **how can the Holy Spirit offer us two graces – Fear and Fortitude – that seem to be opposed to each other?** It must be that these two gifts are not really opposed but complementary. Now fear of the Lord leads us to withdraw from any evil and abstain from any action that would ever offend God, yet our commitment is constantly assailed by the world and the forces of evil. We therefore need an additional force to fortify and reinforce us in the struggle. Such is the Holy Spirit's gift of fortitude.

Fortitude is the gift of the Holy Spirit that strengthens our will to choose what is right and good, especially when it becomes difficult. It provides us with never-ending

perseverance. Fortitude is derived from the Latin fortis, meaning strong, powerful, vigorous, steadfast, courageous, and brave. Biblically, "fortitude is the strength of character that enables a person to endure pain or adversity with courage. It is especially the help of the Holy Spirit to give us the firm intention to achieve the ultimate good (Heaven). When wondering how we will get through a crisis, when we are faced with decisions that challenge our beliefs, when heaven seems far away, the Holy Spirit provides profound support, a light for our dark path, through the gift of fortitude. This gift is known as the most all-encompassing of the seven gifts of the Holy Spirit; this ONE supports us in living out the other six gifts (wisdom, understanding, knowledge, counsel, piety and fear of the Lord) and making our way faithfully through our earthly life to blessed eternity with God. But What does this mean in practical terms?

- The natural virtue of fortitude is a firmness of mind to do good and endure evil (for the sake of a good). The Gift of Fortitude is the Holy Spirit's help to strengthen our mind even beyond human limitations so that we may achieve eternal good. This is what we see in the life of the martyrs.
- The gift of fortitude helps us to grow in the virtues (fruits) of patience and perseverance.
- When the Holy Spirit takes us beyond the limits of our own courage, He also teaches us radical trust in God. That's why the Gift of Fortitude is closely tied to the theological virtue of Hope. St. Thomas Aquinas says that Fortitude supplies "the bread of confidence" that remains even in the future. That is why the gift of Fortitude accompanies us into the life of glory. For in heaven, the act of courage is the enjoyment of utter freedom from toils and evils.

Your challenge is to examine your own life and see how the Gift of Fortitude is active. Have you had times when you had to rely on God's strength to get you through some suffering or to help you stick with a decision to do good when it got really difficult? Each decision we make to do the good builds within us the virtue of fortitude, which is supported by the gift of fortitude. So, we pray to the Holy Spirt for the EXCEEDINGLY GREAT GIFT OF FORTITUDE.
