### NEXT WEEK'S READINGS FOURTEENTH SUNDAY **IN ORDNARY TIME**

FIRST READING

Isaiah 66:10-14c I will spread prosperity over Jerusalem like a river. **Responsorial Psalm** Psalm 123:1-4 Our eyes are fixed on the Lord.

### LITURGICAL NOTES

Entrance: All nations, clap your hands; shout unto God with a voice of joy.

**Offertory:** As a holocaust of rams and bullocks, and of thousands of fat-ted lambs, so let our sacrifice be in your sight on this day, that it may be pleasing unto you. For there is no shame for those who put their trust in you, O Lord.

Communion: Lend your ear and make haste to rescue us. St. Paul's declaration that we have been freed and his call to live in that freedom provides a framework for understanding the Propers this weekend. The Entrance Antiphon is often petitionary in its nature, but today it is joyful. We are reminded to praise God for the great good accomplished in the Death and Resurrection of our Lord. Praise and thanksgiving are remedies to the sorrow we might experience from the suffering of this life. Gratitude turns those sufferings into a sacrifice of praise ("so let our sacrifice be... pleasing unto you."). This act of faith reorients us and reminds that God will never forsake us. This kind of confidence spurs the soul to come before the Throne of Mercy with trust, and so we pray: "Lend your ear and make haste to rescue us." Live in the freedom of the Children of God, and let nothing drag your soul into despair; if God is for us, who can be against us?



### FROM THE PASTOR



#### FROM THE RESURRECTION TO LIFE IN THE HOLY SPIRIT

#### Part IV

Very Rev. Joseph Mary Lukyamuzi, V.F.

#### "Give me now wisdom and knowledge, that I may go out and come in before this people, for who can rule this great people of Yours?" 2 Chronicles 1:10

Solomon prayed to the Lord God for Wisdom and Knowledge, and the Lord answered his prayer. We all need such gifts that we may serve the purposes of the Lord. So much of the sorrow we experience seems to be caused by a lack of Wisdom, Knowledge and Understanding. We rely on the Holy Spirit through these gifts to enlighten our minds to recognize the supernatural truth of our final end. In a special way the gifts of Wisdom, Knowledge and Understanding give us the privileged access to the meaning of sacred scriptures – to understand what we have heard and read and be able to apply them in our daily lives. Wisdom and Knowledge are distinguished according to their *objects*. Wisdom pertains to God and the things of God. Knowledge pertains to created things and how they relate to our final end. Understanding too, has a rather specific focus: It penetrates revealed truth to grasp its fullest meaning.

I can say that many Catholics have a hard time distinguishing between **Knowledge, Wisdom and Understanding.** The explanation below is not exhaustive, but it can be something to begin with in understanding these gifts.

The Gift of Knowledge is a supernatural habit infused by God

through which the human intellect, under the illuminating action of the Holy Spirit, judges rightly concerning created things as ordained to the supernatural end. Notice that it is a habit, i.e., it does not come and go. Like all habits, though, it can and does grow in depth and breadth. Grace builds on nature, and as one matures and gains experience, the Gift can and does make use of these human qualities. Because the gift is supernatural, it is not a matter of human or philosophical knowledge deduced by natural reason. In other words, you don't go to school to get this gift. However, it is not unrelated to human development, which school can provide. But this is not its origin. There are plenty of learned and humanly smart people who do not manifest the Gift of Knowledge. This can be due to a lack of faith or resistance caused by a weak faith and sin. Through the Gift of Knowledge, the human intellect apprehends and judges created things by a certain divine instinct. The individual does not proceed by laborious reasoning but judges rightly concerning all created things by a kind of superior gift that gives an intuitive impulse. Notice that the Gift is especially oriented to created things insofar as they pertain to our ultimate end. By it we are able to determine well what conforms to faith and what does not. We are able to make use of creation in a proper way with necessary detachment and proper appreciation for what is truly good.

The Gift of Wisdom is a supernatural habit, inseparable from charity, by which we judge rightly concerning God and divine things under the special instinct of the Holy Spirit who makes us taste these things by a certain intuition and sympathy. In other words, the truths of God begin to resonate with us, and we begin to instinctively love what God loves and will what God wills. What He is and wills make greater sense to us. His teachings clarify things and make sense. We see things increasingly from God's point of view through this supernatural gift. The thinking of the world increasingly seems to become folly as it is, and an appreciation of God's Wisdom magnifies. More and more thorough this gift the human person desires to be in union only with God and to follow His ways. Our love of neighbor is also perfected by it since the Gift of Wisdom helps us to see and thus love others more and more as God sees and loves them.

The Gift of Understanding is a supernatural habit, infused by God with sanctifying Grace, by which the human intellect, under the illuminating action of the Holy Spirit, is made capable for intuition of revealed truths, and even of natural truths so far as they are related to the supernatural end. It enables the believer to penetrate the depths of revealed truth and deduce later by broad thinking the conclusions contained in these truths. It discloses the hidden meaning of Sacred Scripture. It reveals to us the spiritual realities that are under sensible realities so that the smallest religious ceremonies carry tremendous significance.
