

Entrance: O God, come to my assistance; O Lord, make haste to help me; let them be put to confusion and shame, my enemies who seek my life.

Offertory: Moses prayed to the Lord his God, and said; Moses addressed this prayer to the Lord his God, and declared: "Why, O Lord, is your anger enkindled against your people? Let the wrath your mind has conceived cease. Remember Abraham, Isaac and Jacob, to whom you swore to give a land flowing with milk and honey." And the Lord was dissuaded from accomplishing the evil which he had threatened to inflict upon his people.

Communion: You gave us bread from heaven, O Lord, having in it all that is delicious, and the sweetness of every taste.

The overall trajectory of the readings is vanity of seeking after things of this world and turning our gaze instead heavenward in order to seek after treasures that do not perish. The Communion Antiphon succinctly reminds us that our greatest treasure is the heavenly manna (i.e., the Eucharist), which contains 'the sweetness of every taste". We want for nothing because Jesus Christ Himself is our nourishment, our consolation, our fulfillment of all desire. 

FROM THE PASTOR





HIS BLOOD IS PROOF OF HIS LOVE Part III

Very Rev. Joseph Mary Lukyamuzi, V.F.

"But God proves His love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us" Romans 5:8

The Blood of Christ is the blood of the covenant. The Law is completed by His covenant of love with Israel and His covenant of love with His church, the Bride of Christ. We are united with Christ in the bonds of love forever. Yes, those who fall in love with Jesus stand at the altar of trust and vow to remain faithful until death brings them into eternal oneness with their Lord. Our fidelity to the Faith is evidence of our genuine love and commitment to God. His covenant of love compels us to be loved and to love.

In the New Testament, God wants to give us a new covenant – He wants to give Himself to us (all He is, all He has accomplished, all He has obtained and attained – everything) as a covenant! He wants to give us a new heart and a new Spirit to seek Him and to love Him! When the Lord Jesus died on the cross, His Blood enacted the new covenant – now we can enjoy God as our portion and as our everything! Through the blood of the covenant, we are now entitled to come to Christ, our portion, and claim Him as our life, our supply, our everything! The blood of the covenant brings us into all the divine blessings!

The Blood of Jesus Christ brings us into the Holy of Holies – it brings us into God! "Having therefore, brothers, boldness for entering the Holy of Holies in the blood of Jesus"Hebrews 10:19. The Holy of Holies is the place where only the High Priest could enter in the Old Testament, and he went in there not to "do something" for God, but just to be with God and be infused with God. Today God wants us to come all the way into the Holy of Holies through the Blood of Jesus Christ – to spend time with Him in our mingled spirit and be infused with God! The Blood of Jesus Christ made all this possible – we can now enjoy God, we can behold His beauty, and we can receive His infusion! Here in the Holy of Holies the blood is sprinkled – God looks at the blood and He is satisfied, and He can be with us, and He can infuse us! Enjoying God in this way transforms us into Godmen, persons of God, children with the divine life and nature fully expressing God and radiating Him out! No doubt the Blood of Christ was shed so that we might have a relationship with God. That relationship is only made possible because Jesus was willing to die for us on the cross out of love.

It was not for the price of silver and gold that we were saved, even though those precious metals are costly and worth much to the world. Most of us don't have a lot of silver and gold. What if the price for salvation was one trillion dollars? Could you have paid it? No! Even a trillion dollars, however, cannot buy forgiveness for even one sin you have committed in your lifetime. Even a trillion dollars cannot buy one day with God in heaven. Silver and gold cannot save anyone. If you owned the whole of the earth, this would not save you from the curse of sin. Only one price would do for the forgiveness of sin and that price is perfect – the priceless, sinless Blood of our Lord. Only One ever carried sinless blood in His Body: our Lord Jesus Christ. You see, we were in the prison house of sin, but Jesus came our way and paid our fine in His own perfect Blood, and that set us free. The condemnation was taken away. Thank God for the saving Blood of Jesus Christ!

So, brothers and sisters, we should never be ashamed of Jesus. We should want the world to see the Blood that He shed for us. We should want them to see the price He paid for our sins! I am convinced that those Christians who daily recall the Blood shed for us on the cross *(especially at the sacrifice of the Mass)* will want to live a holy life for Jesus. We will desire that the world might see what the Blood of Jesus has done to us and for us by the way we live our lives. He chose to shed blood to show his love. Praised be the Lord Jesus, now and forever.
